C. Approval of January 30, 2012 Minutes as submitted. Motion to approve by Burk Jones, Mike Garvey seconded. Motion passed.

D VARIANCE REQUESTS

1. Kyle Brooks requested variances for the following individuals to be allowed to take the written/practical testing at the age of 17 for Firefighter I/II; Hazardous Material Awareness and Operations.

Staff recommends approval providing they are 17 years of age at the time of written/practical testing.

Jack Kerney made a motion to approve. Greg Wyant seconded the motion. Motion passed.

2. Nick Hintz requested a variance for Fire Officer 2 based on Bachelor of Science in Education; his years as a teacher, and work experience at the fire dept.

Burk Jones made a motion to approve. Tom Hanify seconded. Motion passed.

3. Matthew Bray requested a variance for an oral exam. He explains that he has no problem with the skills but his reading skills prohibit him from passing a written exam. He is asking that someone be allowed to read the exam to him.

Discussion involved possibly extending the time to allow oral reading, documentation needed to show valid medical reason for oral. After much discussion, Candice Ashby made a motion to deny. Jack Kerney seconded. Motion passed. Individual vote was 4 to deny and 3 to approve.

4. James Stewart requested variance for Instructor I and II/III. He holds a current Primary Instructor and is actively involved in EMS courses.

Staff recommends approval pending his passing the Instructor Reciprocity test. He is currently certified in various fire service certifications.

Jack Kerney made a motion to approve, Greg Wyant seconded. Motion passed.

5. Craig Green requested a variance for Confined Space Rescue Operations and Technician. He took the course through Progressive Solutions Inc. in 2007. He has included his continued education for the last 3 years and he has met the prerequisites.

Staff recommends denial based upon the length of time between the course dates and his request for a variance. If he desires to resubmit a copy of the completed practical skills indicating compliance with the applicable NFPA standard in effect at the time training was conducted and he must pass the written exam.

Greg Wyant made a motion to approve staff recommendation. James Greeson seconded. Motion passed.

Motions have been withdrawn. If he can submit a copy of the original skills signed off, then he can resubmit. Burke Jones made a motion to table the request pending his submitting the missing documentation. Greg Wyant seconded. Motion passed.

6. Robert Graves requested a variance for his Instructor I. Due to illness in the family he was unable to submit his hours for recertification on time.

Staff recommends denial. He did not complete the hours as required in the time allotted.

Candace Ashby made a motion to approve staff recommendation. James Greeson seconded. Motion passed.

7. Roger Wright requested a variance for Instructor II/III. Due to illness he was unable to send in his hours as required. He had completed the hours on time; he simply did not send them in.

Staff recommends denial.

Candace Ashby made a motion to approve staff recommendation. Burke Jones seconded. Motion passed. Jack Kerney Sr. voted to approve the request.

8. Michael Graham requested a variance for Fire Investigator. He failed the first test and did not take the retest. He states that "someone" told him not to take the retest just yet because there was an issue with the skills. He would now like to retest and have the skills from the test in March 2011 to count towards the retest.

Staff recommends denial. There is no record of him talking with staff, and there was not an issue with the skills from the original test. Many of the students in the class completed the retest in May 2011 without issues.

Candace Ashby made motion to approve staff recommendation. Greg Wyant seconded. Motion passed.

9. David Kissling requested a variance for Instructor II/III. Staff discovered he had no qualifications for Instructor II/III but in 1998 he passed the written exam and was issued the certification. He did not have First Class Instructor nor did he hold Instructor I. David submitted documentation showing that he held a Second Class Instructor since 1995. We are asking that the Board grant him the Instructor II/III.

Staff recommends allowing him to keep instructor II/III pending his passing the Instructor Reciprocity test for Instructor I. He must then document 30 hours of teaching after receiving a valid Instructor I certification. He must pass the reciprocity test prior to recertifying for Instructor II/III.

Burke Jones made a motion to approve staff recommendation. Candace Ashby seconded. Motion passed.

10. Troy Platz requested a variance for Fire Officer I. He took the test 01/07 but did not meet the prerequisites at that time. He completed the prerequisites in 2008 and 2009. He is now asking for his Fire Officer I.

Staff recommends denial. Troy has had close to 3 years in which to correct this issue and he did not.

Candace Ashby made a motion approve the variance request. This is based on the issue brought up at the January meeting. Jack Kerney seconded the motion.

After discussion, it was realized that the issue in January, the individual had completed all requirements in the same year. Candace Ashby withdrew her motion.

Greg Wyant moves to accept staff's recommendation. James Greeson seconded. Motion approved.

11. Matthew Stelle requested variances for Hazardous Material Technician. He completed 40 hours of training at Cincinnati State Tech and Community College. He is also asking for Confined Space Technician, Water Rescue Operations, Vehicle/Machinery Technician, Structural

Collapse Operations and Rope Rescue Technician. Rescue training was completed at Ohio State Fire School. Matthew has included the skills that he completed and the hours of class that he completed for the Rescue certifications.

Staff recommends denial for hazardous materials technician because he does not indicate he has hazardous materials awareness and operations in Indiana and the certificate he submitted is for completion of an OSHA course. Documentation does not meet the prerequisites and there is no indication the training was conducted to any NFPA standards. Staff recommends denial of each of the technical rescue certifications because he is not hazardous materials awareness and operations certified. If he submits an application after meeting the prerequisites he can resubmit his request.

Greg Wyant made a motion to approve staff recommendation. Mike Garvey seconded. Motion passed. The request has been denied.

- 12. Rick Hines requested a variance for Instructor I and II/III. He allowed the certification to lapse. He is a current Primary instructor and would like to get his Fire Instructor certifications reinstated. He has completed the hours as required.

Staff recommends approval pending his passing the instructor Reciprocity test.

Tom Hanify made a motion to approve staff recommendation. Burke Jones seconded. Motion passed.

requested a variance for Mandatory firefighter certification. They took the written and practical exam in December 2011 but the state never received completed applications or proof of practicals. E-mails were sent to the proctor on starting on January 2012. After no results tests were voided on Feb 07-12. They have now submitted the complete applications and are requesting their written tests to be reinstated.

Staff recommends approval. A letter of reprimand will be sent to the proctor Shaun Chambers for failure to perform the tasks of proctor in accordance with the Board rules.

Greg Wyant made a motion to approve staff recommendation. Mike Garvey seconded. Motion passed.

19. Michael Meredith requested a variance for testing. He will be 17 years of age 4-21-12. He has completed the practical skills and is asking to be allowed to take the written test.

Staff recommends denial. Michael was 16 at the time the skills were completed, therefore skills are ineligible. Staff recommends a letter of reprimand be sent to the Lead Evaluator, Kyle Kruer for allowing an underage student to complete the skills.

Tom Hanify made a motion to accept his skills. Jeff Hayes seconded. Motion passed.

Discussion on when can a student take the skills test. Due to the vocational schools, the students are eligible to take the skills exam at 16 years of age. The skills exam is good for 180 days, so the actual age of starting them would be 16 years and 6 months before they could take the skills. Variance can now be submitted to allow skills to be valid at the age of 16 years and 6 months. The written exam must be no earlier than 17 years of age, and the skills no older than 6 months at the time of the written exam. However, a variance is required prior to skills being done.

20. James Lunsford requested a variance for Instructor I, II/III. He holds a Primary Instructor since January 2012, and has held a FF ½ certification since November 2011.

Staff recommends approval pending his passing the Instructor Reciprocity test.

Mike Garvey made a motion to approve. Jack Kerney seconded. Motion passed.

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21. Charles Redmon requested a variance for Instructor I, II/III. He holds a valid teachers license in the state of Indiana, and is certified as Firefighter I/II.

Staff recommends approval pending his passing the Instructor Reciprocity test.

Mike Garvey made a motion to approve. Jack Kerney seconded. Motion passed.

22. Gary Barr requested a variance for Confined Space Rescue Ops/Tech; Rope Rescue Ops/Tech; and Structural Collapse Rescue Ops/Tech. He has completed classes through the Response International Group, completion certification enclosed.

Staff recommends denial. He has not met the prerequisites required for these certifications nor do we have the signature on the practical skills completed during these courses. Prerequisites that have not been met are Hazmat Awareness, Hazmat Operations, and Trench Rescue Ops/Tech. He has also received technical rescue awareness certification without a hazmat awareness certification.

Mike Garvey made a motion to deny the variance request. Jack Kerney seconded. Motion approved to deny the certification request.

Rick Schnautz requested variance for the following students to be allowed to take the written/practical exams for Firefighter I/II.

Staff recommends approval based on the student being 17 years of age at the time of testing.

Burke Jones made a motion to approve. Mike Garvey seconded. Motion passed.

35. Amanda Eshelman requested a variance for Instructor I, and II/III. Amanda holds a current Primary instructor certification.

Staff recommends approve pending her passing the Instructor Reciprocity test.

Burke Jones approved the request. Jack Kerney seconded. Motion passed.

36. Jerry Stigall requested a variance for Mandatory, Firefighter 1, Firefighter 2, Hazardous Material Awareness, operations and Technician. He was originally certified starting at age 8 and the Board revoked certifications.

He was told to file for a variance when he turned 18 and the Board would consider the options listed in the Sept 2008 minutes.

Staff recommends denial.

Tom Hanify approved the variance request. Jack Kerney seconded.

Marshal Greeson asked to speak to the individual. Mr. Stigall Sr. spoke for his son. Mr. Stigall explained that his son has been an active member of the department. He was not eligible to go on a live fire, but he has been of assistance throughout the last few years and he is an active member of the cadet program.

Candace Ashby asked if all skills were completed prior to the age of 16.

Have you completed any of the skills required for certifications that you are asking for in the last 2 years? Mr Stigall Sr. explained that all skills required have been completed multiple times.

Jeff Hayes suggested that he go back and complete the skills and take the written exams. He should have no problem with that. Mr. Stigall Sr. stated that his son is getting ready to go to EMT class and he thinks that having to do this all over again would be an overload. He needs to concentrate on the EMS classes at this time.

Tom Hanify stated that he thinks that everything that needed to be done has been done. He recommends approval of this. Motion passed.

37. Eric Darlage requested a variance for Hazardous Material Technician. He passed the written/practical testing in 2001. He had not met the prerequisite of FF 2 for 1 year at that time and certification was held pending meeting prerequisite. In 2012 he took a Technical Rescue Awareness test and was denied due to not meeting the prerequisite. He believed he had it, has trained for it, and has performed as though certified. He is asking to have the certification issued.

Staff recommends denial. The testing completed was 2 NFPA standards ago and he does not meet the requirements today.

Tom Hanify made a motion to approve staff recommendation. Greg Wyant seconded. Discussion: Mike Garvey stated that he had been in contact with the Fire Chief at Columbus and he wants the Board to know that the department supports Mr. Darlage. Mr. Darlage is in the audience; he was going to Ivy Tech at the time for a Fire Science degree and was in a

paramedic class also at this time. Issue date on the system was 11/11/1111 and he recently found that this was an invalid date. He was never issued a letter or anything telling him that he was not a Technician.

Tom Hanify made a motion to reverse his motion.

Burke Jones made a motion to approve his request. Jack Kerney seconded. Motion passed to allow certification.

38. Jason Allen requested a variance for Fire Officer I. He holds an Associate's Degree in Applies Science for Public Safety from Ivy Tech.

Staff recommends approval based on transcripts provided.

Burke Jones made a motion to approve. Jack Kerney seconded. Motion passed.

E. REQUEST FOR RECIPROCITY.

No report at this time.

F. REQUEST FOR ADMINISTRATIVE APPEAL

1. Todd Kabisch completed practical skill on March 19, 2011 but did not test until October 20, 2011, 7 months later. He was delayed in testing due to personal issues. He would like the skills to count toward certification. Todd's certification was denied due to the time frame involving the skills.

Todd Kabish requested administrative review. He was denied certification because skills were over 180 days old at time of the written exam.

Tom Hanify made a motion to grant the appeal and forward to Judge Bippus. Burke Jones seconded. Motion passed.

G. STATE FIRE MARSHAL, JAMES GREESON

I want to thank the people in the room for coming to this conference. It helps us when there are people to ask questions and participate in the decisions.

SB224 deals with outdoor stage equipment and has adopted rules that address the regulation of that type of rigging. If you are not sure what the rules are, contact the Fire Marshal office to find out. We have notified all associations around Indiana what the rules are.

Conditions are very dry and we are looking at another 6 weeks, if you are the Chief you have the authority to suspend open burning. It does not have the same enforcement at the county commission, but work together. The July 4th is just a few weeks away, if you have questions about the legality of a stand, contact the fire marshal office.

H HOMELAND SECURITY CHIEF OF STAFF MIKE GARVEY.

Upcoming Exercises for Indiana:

- July 10 and 11, 2012 IDHS will be conducting a communications drill to validate the capabilities of the mobile communications and command vehicles throughout Indiana. The exercise will be conducted at the Wyndham Hotel near the Indianapolis Airport. Interested organizations should contact Lauren Eickman.
- On September 23 through the 28, 2012 a state level exercise will be conducted at Muscatatuck Urban Training Center (MUTC). The purpose of this large, weeklong event is to validate the deployment and response capabilities of four of Indiana's Homeland Security District Response Taskforces. Districts 7, 8, 9, and 10 will participate and deploy resources to MUTC. Law enforcement, fire, search and rescue, EMS and incident management components of the Task Forces will be engaged in this program. As well as Indiana resources, Incident management teams from Kentucky, Illinois and San Diego, California are scheduled to participate.
- On October 31 is the date set for the 2012 Radiological Emergency Preparedness Program Exercise. This exercise involves several counties in Northern Indiana that may be impacted by an event at one of the four nuclear power plants that are located in Michigan and Illinois. This exercise is to evaluate Indiana's ability to monitor and mitigate the potential effects of radiological fallout resulting from a release from one of these out-of-state facilities.
- The Statewide Training, Exercise Planning Workshop (TEPW) is scheduled for November 15, 2012. It is imperative that District TEPWs are conducted with the results submitted to the Training Division of IDHS prior to that date so all areas of the state can be included in the statewide planning for EMA related training programs.

I. STATE FIRE TRAINING and CERTIFICATION REPORT, JOHN BUCKMAN

1. Driver Operator Mobile Water Supply

We are putting together a test bank and practical skills for this certification. To date, the only way you can get this is through a variance. We will have a pilot ready for the September Board meeting.

2. Fire Instructor online portal is open. Certificates are no longer being sent out for recertification. The Instructor can print a copy from the website of their renewal.
 - a. Effective September 1, 2012 all Instructor I and Instructor II/III are eligible to recertify using the online portal.
 - i. Fire Departments who have not submitted their excel spreadsheet so that online portal accounts may be created by IDHS staff.
 1. IDHS will create online portal accounts for agencies until October 1, 2012.
 - ii. The online portal for fire instructor recertification is the SAME one an EMS certified person uses for recertification.
 - iii. Can only recertify in the quarter of expiration date.
 - iv. Audit information must be postmarked with 72 hours. Audit information is the same as the information is required to be in the past.
3. Penalty for falsifying Testing Prerequisite sheet. If you mark that you hold the prerequisites and you do not and take the written exam, your exam is void and you would be banned from testing for 3 months.

Jeff Hayes stated that 3 months was too long. He would agree to a 30 day suspension. Staff will change forms to accommodate variance approvals.

4. Kevin Tibbs EMS suspension

Deferred until Sept. meeting.

4. PSID#'s are required to be obtained by the student before written testing is administered. Proctors who submit incomplete applications will be disciplined.

This creates significant effort for our staff to contact the proctor who then must get the students back together to complete the applications and then resubmit. This delays the issuing of certification in a timely manner. This costs money in mailing and delays the processing of other test.

There is confusion as to when this should be applied for. The PSID# should be applied for at the first of the class. Do not wait until you go to take a test and then apply for the test. Applications are coming in incomplete. This holds up the process and we are going to start sending out disciplinary letters. The instructions explain to the proctor that these need to be complete prior to submission.

5. Eric Brown served as a proctor for a Driver Operator Pumper course #2012-13457. When he arrived in the test room he noticed one of the student seats had a scanned copy of the DOP version 1 test. At least one student studying what appeared to be a copy of the driver operator pumper written examination. He engaged the station officer and Chief Kenny VanSlyke in what he believed he had found. Proctor Jordan told Chief VanSlyke that he would disqualify the student from taking the test at this time. When the students returned to the room Proctor Jordan held up the scanned copy of the test and asked the students who had a copy. Several said they had used it as a study guide. Proctor Jordan called the State on the following day and informed us of what had happened. The State asked for a written report from Proctor Jordan.

State action – all students have now been disqualified and this test has been invalidated. Students have been informed that they must wait 90 days to take the written DOP examination again.

State action – all new tests were printed.

State action – investigation continues to determine who took the cell phone pictures originally and then forwarded.

We are looking at taking the Firefighter I/II and dividing this into 4 modules. This is for the volunteer dept mainly so that they do not have to drag out the course for 1-2 years before they complete the course and are ready for testing. If we divide this into 4 modules, then you can take module 1, test for it, it is recorded into the system and then move on to module 2 and so forth. We are still working on this, many things we need to look at on this before we can go forward, but we will be sending out a survey to see if there is any interest. This is going to be a lot of work to divide this up and we want to make sure there is enough interest to warrant the work.

At this point, we are only trying to see if anyone would be interested in this option.

Jeff Hayes spoke about this, and he thinks this would be a good thing for the volunteer depts. A career dept does not have this issue and this will not be much benefit for them, but for the career schools, this would be a very good thing. This would affect the combination test only. This would be another option only. It would not affect what is in play now, it is just another option.

Jack Kerney stated that the Board should be on the inside of this issue when it comes to the rule rewrite of this option. The Board should not be on the side lines and should be deeply involved.

Board members discussed how participation in the rewrite rules is critical. They are bound by the rules as they are now, and sometimes that is just not enough room to do what they would like to do.

We are looking at splitting Instructor 2 and 3. No one is doing the Instructor 3 skills. They are for a training manager in reality, and an instructor 2 would not need it. We are looking at what an instructor I and 2 can do. Many are Instructor I and want nothing more, but for what is actually being done, an Instructor 2 can do it, it does not require the Instructor 3 level.

Do you think is fair that your Instructor 2/3, you would have to go back and redo the hoops do keep the 3 portion of the certification. Also, there is the issue of SOP's when they require you to have Instructor II/III. If these are separated, what happens to that person?

J ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS, JUDGE BIPPUS

1. Administrative Cause No. 11-02. Jason Kilsby was denied Technical rescue due to not having certification for Hazardous Material Awareness.

Tom Hanify to table the issue until Judge Bippus was here, Jeff Hayes seconded. Motion passed. This issue will be tabled until the September meeting.

L. NEW BUSINESS

1. Webinar broadcasts; Jeff Hayes

Communications have been a huge problem with trying to get the information out. I think broadcasting this is extremely important, and if it means we have to spend a little money in order to do this, then we should. Tom Hanify stated that he thinks at the next board meeting, we need to list what we require in order to hold a board meeting. There have been times that we did not even have enough seating, or we are in a room that does not have enough room for the board members, arrange the board in a horseshoe fashion so we can see each other, and we need microphones so that everyone can hear what is being said. Staff can submit a list and then we can go from there.

Jeff Hayes stated that the Board has gone out of their way to travel around the state so that everyone can attend these meetings. There have been times that the Fire Dept. hosting the meeting does not show up for the meeting. Neither the Fire Chief, nor the firefighters on duty bother to come to these meetings right there in their facility. I would ask that the location has some type of representation at the meetings.

2. Discussion and possible adoption of LSA Doc. #11-730

Adds [655 IAC 1-2.1-2.1](#) for the purpose of providing for late filing of accrued continuing education. Effective 30 days after filing with the Publisher.

[655 IAC 1-2.1-2.1](#) Instructor I and Instructor II/III recertification process after expiration

Authority: [IC 22-14-2-7](#)

Affected: [IC 22-14-2-7](#)

Sec. 2.1. (a) If a properly completed report of continuing education is submitted within one hundred twenty (120) calendar days after the expiration of the Instructor I or Instructor II/III certification, together with the required documentation to show that the applicant has completed all required continuing education within the required years prior to the expiration of the certification, and a fifty dollar (\$50) reapplication fee, the certification will be reinstated on the date that the board staff determines that the required report, documentation, and reapplication fee have been properly submitted.

(b) Until June 1, 2013, the expiration date of the certification will be two (2) years from the expiration of the previous, expired certification.

(c) On and after June 1, 2013, the expiration date of the certification will be three (3) years from the expiration of the previous, expired certification.

Summary of minutes from the Board of Firefighter Personnel Standards and Education meeting on June 14, 2012, concerning the adoption of LSA Doc. # 11-730.

Chairman Jeff Hayes called for discussion of the rule. Staff advised that 2 numbers had been transposed, in subsections (b) and (c), such that the “2” years in

subsection (b) should have been “3” years and the “3” years in subsection (c) should have been “2” years. Those corrected numbers accurately reflect the certification time periods under 655 IAC 1-2.1-19 and 655 IAC 1-2.1-20, with the amendments that take effect in 2013. After a brief discussion by Board members, Chairman Hayes made motion approve LSA Doc. #11-730, a rule that adds 655 IAC 1-2.1-2.1 for the purpose of providing for late filing of accrued continuing education, as published in the Indiana Register on May 9, 2012, as DIN 20120509-IR-655110730PRA as amended by the staff request to change, in subsection (b) “2 years” to “3 years” and, in subsection (c) to change “3 years” to “2 years”. The motion was seconded by Greg Wyant. The motion passed unanimously.

3. Accept Blue Card skills as Fire Officer Strategy and Tactics skills as long as the Blue Card is active.

Dave Probo explained that the skills used in Blue Card far out weight the skills used in Fire Officer Strategy and Tactics. These incorporate 3 days of skills and at the end they get a certificate signed by the Instructor. Blue Card is good for 3 years. Our skills are good for 180 days, so would we want to limit the validity of the skills to meet the same as 180 day requirement for all other skills, or do we want it to be good as long as the card is valid. Greg Wyant stated that he has concerns about the terminology used in the Blue Card training. They have their own terminology that is not used by NIMS or FOST. One main concern is the “on deck” no one knows what this means, and it is a Blue Card issue. In Hamilton County they are looking at how to accommodate the terminology. This also cost a lot of money to get. He would like to see more information on this training before a decision is made. Jeff Hayes spoke about the terminology and seconded the motion of more information at the next board meeting.

The Marshal requests that staff present something to the Board at the Sept. meeting.

Candace Ashby stated that her understanding was that we are not adopting the program. All that was being asked is that if you had Blue Card, and then you take a FOST test, the skills from Blue Card would count as skills for FOST.
