Reports

Dr. Kaufmann gave a brief update on the state of Mobile Integrated Health (MIH) in the state of Indiana and the Nation. He said he was excited to see the growth of MIH here in Indiana.

Director Kinney gave an update on legislation.

<u>Program Overview</u>

Witham Boone County EMS – Kasey Copeland gave an overview of their program.

Copeland does most of the MIH program. They have had the program since 2014. Their overall goal is to reduce readmissions. They perform blood draws, urine analysis, covid test, covid vacations, flu shots, wellness visits, vitals check, CHF assessment, weight (fluid retention) tracking, well baby checks, breathing treatments, family support, hospice support, and medication reconciliation. Over the last two years they have reduces readmission rates by 75 - 80%.

Old Business

Grant Status – Brittany Fortinberry reported that the agency has moved forward with the contracts and expect to start distribution of the money soon.

Fortinberry emailed everyone that she had on her email list a grant opportunity.

New Business

Brittany Fortinberry reviewed the application and the information that is being collected. Director Kinney reviewed the reason for the application process. Fortinberry gave an overview of the pending applications: Zionsville Fire Department, Adams County, Richmond Fire Department, and IN Health. Kevin Wellman talked briefly about the Adams County program.
