## **Kidde Recalls TruSense Smoke and Combination Smoke/Carbon Monoxide Alarms Due to Risk of Failure to Alert Consumers to a Fire**

**Hazard:** The smoke alarm and the combination smoke/carbon monoxide (CO) alarm can fail to alert consumers to a fire.

**Remedy:** Replace

**Recall date:** May 6, 2021

**Units:** About 226,000
