
Register for the Indiana Fire and EMS Leadership Conference 2025

Fire and Public Safety Expansion

The Academy has expanded its mission to include public safety training. Justin Stump joined the Academy as Emergency Management Training Program Manager and FEMA State Training Officer.

Stump has over 29 years of public safety experience, serving in various roles that include assistant fire chief, emergency medical technician, law enforcement officer, county emergency management director, and county commissioner. He holds certifications as firefighter I and II, nationally registered EMT, fire and emergency services instructor I and ICS 300/400 instructor. He also has the professional emergency manager designation.

In his new role, Stump will oversee FEMA training courses, including AWR, MGT, PER and ICS 300/400, as well as serve as the Academy liaison for federally-funded consortium programs. These include courses offered by the Center for Domestic Preparedness, Louisiana State University, Texas Engineering Extension Service, University of Hawaii and several others.




The Academy welcomes Justin Stump and looks forward to the continued growth of public safety training in Indiana.

New Features on Acadis


The Academy has added a Document Library in the Academy Resource area on <u>Acadis</u>. This new library will house all instructor materials, including skill sheets and course planning templates. The change is designed to improve transparency and make it easier for both instructors and students to access official course documents before registering for certification courses.

Instructors who have downloaded materials from the previous Instructor Material

section should archive those files, as they may not be the latest versions. From this point forward, all updated documents will be stored in the new Document Library.



Acadis also now allows certification verification without requiring a PSID or email address. This feature, available on the Acadis homepage before logging in, helps simplify the process of confirming certification levels. To use this option, select "Submit a request verification" under the "Verify Certifications" tab.



Curriculum Update

On Sept. 22, 2025, the Academy will adopt Essentials 8 for Firefighter I and II, as well as IFSTA's sixth edition for Hazardous Materials Awareness and Operations. The switch is necessary because IFSTA no longer supports the Hazardous Materials fifth edition online. Essentials 8 does not include hazardous materials chapters, requiring the transition to a separate text.

Both texts are available through the IFSTA state library. The Academy recently renewed its contract with IFSTA, ensuring another year of free access to all IFSTA manuals for Indiana firefighters. Each firefighter can request an account for online access on both desktop and mobile devices by visiting https://on.in.gov/ifsta-library-request.

This service is only available to Indiana firefighters and fire departments. Career centers, universities, colleges and for-profit training institutions are not eligible.

National Fire Academy

Indiana has once again been awarded additional National Fire Academy (NFA) courses from funds returned by other states that could not host their allocated classes. This marks the third consecutive year Indiana has received these opportunities after completing all nine of its originally assigned NFA courses.

The quick turnaround for these added courses makes early registration essential to avoid cancellations due to low enrollment.

Note: The Youth Firesetting Intervention Specialist and Fire as a Weapon courses meet NFPA requirements and count toward Fire Investigator CE hours.

Looking ahead, the NFA Indiana Weekend will not take place in Maryland in 2026. Instead, all courses typically offered there will be hosted at Winter Fire School in Plainfield. This change is expected to improve attendance by eliminating the need for extended travel. Early registration is required to meet NFA deadlines.

Hub and Spoke Update

Since the last Bugle edition, the Academy has completed new Hub and Spoke training facilities in Spencer County at Chrisney and in Orange County at Paoli. Academy instructors have delivered training for local agencies, which are now able to conduct live fire training in these buildings.
