FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The EMSC is an agency within the meaning of IC 4-21.5.
- 2. The EMSC is the state agency responsible for the regulation of First Responders.
- 3. IC 4-21.5, IC 16-31, and IC 35-42 apply to this proceeding.
- 4. At all times relevant to this proceeding, Sipe, a Fort Wayne Firefighter, held the Certificate.
- 5. On or about January 18, 2002, Sipe was charged in Allen County Superior Court with several counts of child molesting.
- 6. The alleged victim was Sipe's teenage daughter who was thirteen at the time of the first incident. Because of this fact, one count of the information was a Class A Felony punishable by a fixed term of imprisonment between 20 and 50 years.
- 7. On December 3, 2002, Sipe was found guilty by a jury of Counts 1,2,3,5,6,and 7. Sipe was acquitted on Count 4.
- 8. On January 16, 2003, Sipe was sentenced to a total of 74 years in prison including a sentence of 50 years for child molesting, a Class A Felony. since the child in question was under 14 at the time of the act.
- 9. The remaining counts were all Class C or D Felonies as the daughter was between the ages of 14 and 18 when those wrongful acts occurred.
- 10. Sipe received 8 years in prison for each of these convictions, some of which were concurrent and some of which were consecutive, and totaled an additional 24 years.
- 11. IC 16-31-3-14.5 allows the EMSC to permanently revoke Certificates of persons convicted of "Crimes of Violence" as defined by IC 35-50-1-2(a).
- 12. IC 35-50-1-2(a) lists child-molesting convictions pursuant to IC 35-42-4-3 as crimes of violence.
- 13. The 50-year sentence was imposed pursuant to a conviction of IC 35-42-4-3 for having sexual intercourse or deviate sexual conduct with a child under the age of 14.
- 14. Therefore, Sipe in eligible for a permanent revocation of his Certificate.
- 15. Given Sipe's former employment as a public servant and his continued sexual interest in his daughter over a four-year period, the administrative law judge concludes that Sipe's Certificate should be permanently revoked.

NONFINAL ORDER

First Responder Certificate #FR31417 issued by the Emergency Medical Services Commission is hereby permanently revoked.
