



## **DNR 30-DAY PUBLIC NOTICE**

The Department of Natural Resources serves the DNR 30-Day Public Notice in order to satisfy the requirements of the "Procedures Concerning Certain Licenses Act", IC 14-11-4, and its associated administrative rule, 312 IAC 2-3.

The DNR 30-Day Public Notice is published weekly to serve notice of the latest permit applications received at the DNR, Division of Water. This Notice can be viewed on the web at http://www.in.gov/dnr/water/ and can be provided by email upon written request. ## Petition for Public Hearing

A pre-action public hearing on an application may be requested by filing a written petition. For a petition to be considered valid it must:

- 1. contain the typed or legibly printed name and complete mailing address of each petitioner;
- 2. be signed by a minimum of 25 individuals who are at least 18 years old and either reside in the county where the project will take place or own real property within 1 mile of the project site;
- 3. affirm that each signatory to the petition satisfies the requirements of item 2; and
- 4. identify the application for which the public hearing is being requested either by the application # or the applicant's name and the project description.

A petition which does not meet these requirements will be considered invalid and the hearing request will not be granted. To request a pre-action public hearing, send the petition by email to water\_inquiry@dnr.in.gov or by mail to:

Project Description: Two existing ponds will be dredged and the fill will be placed in three locations on site. The West Pond will be dredged and the pond bank will be cut. In addition, there will be two floating docks added to this pond. The East Pond will be dredged and the pond bank will be cut. In addition, there will be one floating dock added to this pond. There will be two areas within the floodway where the excavated material will be placed, and the third location will not be within the floodway. There will also be a temporary construction access that will be approximately 20' wide, 150' long, and 8" thick.

Project Description: The City of South Bend Building Department will be working to complete the Marion Street Pedestrian Bridge Project that will require 0.009 acres of impacts within the Saint Joseph River floodway for bridge placement. The project work includes the construction of a new 291.5' long x 13.75' wide x 19.67' tall double span steel truss pedestrian bridge. Total cumulative permanent impacts within the Saint Joseph River floodway include approximately 0.009 acres for the placement of 105.5 cubic yards of fill for bridge installation. Temporary impacts within the Saint Joseph River floodway are required for cofferdam installation to provide a dry work environment during construction. Total cumulative temporary impacts within the Saint Joseph River floodway include approximately 0.003 acres for the placement of 109.3 cubic yards of cofferdam. Temporary impacts are anticipated to be in place for 120 days. Disturbed slopes within the floodway will be restored to preconstruction contours then stabilized with the attached native floodplain seed mix and mulch.

Project Description: The existing 55' x 4' x 4' corrugated metal pipe (CMP) culvert carrying East 125 South over Lautzenhizer Ditch will be replaced with a new culvert structure to improve the drainage structural integrity at the crossing. The new crossing will consist of a 65' x 4.5' x 4.5' long CMP culvert. Class I riprap will be placed at the outlet for scour protection. Riprap dimensions will be approximately 10' x 10' x2'. Total permanent impacts will total approximately 0.0084 acres due to the culvert replacement and riprap placement. Temporary impacts will total approximately 0.0036 acres due to cofferdam use. No tree removal will be required.

Project Description: The bridge carrying 750 North over Brandywine Creek will be replaced (Structure No. 73-00022/NBI No. 7300022). The existing structure is a 92' long three-span concrete channel beam bridge. The new replacement structure is a 121.5' long three span, continuous haunched reinforced concrete slab bridge. The new bridge cross section will provide a clear roadway width of 24.5'. The approach roadway typical section will consist of two 10' paved travel lanes with a 2.25' shoulder on each side of the road. Total permanent impacts to Brandywine Creek will total approximately 0.121 acres due to the placement of 30" and 48" Class 2 Revetment Riprap for scour protection, and Wildlife Passages choked with 10" compacted aggregate. Permanent impact of non-wetland tree removal and early successional habitat will total approximately 0.33 acres. Total temporary impacts to Brandywine Creek will total 0.06 acres due to cofferdam and dewatering use.
