DISABLED HUNTER PERMIT APPLICATION PROCESS

Applying for a “Persons with Disabilities Hunting Permit” requires completion of an application form that includes a section for your physician or nurse practitioner to fill out. The form is available [online](#) and can be emailed to wildlifepermits@dnr.IN.gov, faxed to 317-232-8150, or mailed to the address listed on the first page of the application. It is very important that you completely describe, in your own words, your disability in the spaces provided. This will provide us with information on what accommodations you need to hunt. Please be sure to answer the questions about what equipment you will be using and whether you need to hunt from a vehicle.

Your physician or nurse practitioner must fill out the applicable sections on pages 2 and 3 of the application form. They must describe your disability, including information about whether it is temporary or permanent and if crutches or other walking devices are needed.

When completing the form, please keep the following information in mind:

1. The first page of the application must be filled out and signed by the applicant.
2. The disability information on pages 2 and 3 of the application must be completed and signed by your physician or a licensed nurse practitioner.
3. In addition to completing the forms, you can include any supporting documentation that might describe your disability more completely.
4. Disabled hunter permits can be issued to those individuals who would have difficulty or be unable to hunt without special privileges due to the result of an injury or disease.

If the condition is permanent, a permit will be issued and mailed with a placard to place in your vehicle when hunting. Please call the Division of Fish and Wildlife at (317) 232-8440 if you have any questions.
