


HISTORY

ACTIVITIES AND FACILITIES

BEACH—An unguarded swimming beach is available in the summer. Restrooms, dressing facilities and showers are available. Picnic areas, playgrounds, basketball goals, softball fields, horseshoe pits and a sand volleyball court are located on or near the beach. **BOAT LAUNCH**—Three ramps are available at Starve Hollow. Only electric trolling motors are allowed on Starve Hollow Lake.

BOAT RENTAL—Boat rental is available from mid-April through October. Canoes, kayaks and flat bottom boats are available for rent. Prices for boat rental vary and are subject to state sales tax. Life jackets are available. **CAMPING**—A total of 168 Class A and Class B campsites are available. There are 55 Class A sites equipped with electricity, picnic table, grill and access to modern comfort stations. The remaining 113 Class B campsites include everything mentioned above.

FISHING—Starve Hollow Lake contains large-mouth bass, bluegill, redear sunfish, black crappie and channel catfish.

HIKING—The property offers nearly 11 miles of hiking in six trails ranging in distance and difficulty. Additional trails, including the Knobstone Trail, are available at nearby Jackson-Washington State Forest.

DESCRIPTIONS OF TRAILS

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- **Whitewater SP:** No one shall injure or damage any structure, rock, tree, flower, bird or wild animal. Do NOT gather limbs, brush or trees (either dead or alive) for firewood because they rebuild the natural humus.
- **Firearms-Whitewater SP:** Except lawfully possessed handguns, any firearm, BB gun, air gun, bow and arrow, paint gun or spear gun must be unloaded and stored in a case or locked within a vehicle, except when an owner is participating in an activity authorized by written permit. **Brookville Lake:** Handguns are prohibited. Any firearm, BB gun, air gun, CO₂ gun, bow and arrow, paint gun or spear gun must be unloaded or un-nocked and stored in a case or locked within a vehicle, except in accordance with the terms of a valid one-day hunting permit for a specified date. A hunting map is at stateparks.IN.gov.
- No person shall conduct or participate in a fishing tournament on a reservoir property administered by the Division of State Parks except under a license.
- No person shall launch, dock, or moor a watercraft or other floating device, except during approved periods and at sites designated by the department for those purposes. No person shall leave watercraft unattended in a courtesy dock.
- A person who possesses a pet must attend it at all times and keep the animal caged or on a leash no more than 6 feet long, except when used for the lawful pursuit of wild animals.
- Vending or advertising without DNR permission is prohibited. Camping is permitted only in the campground. Youth groups must be under adult supervision. No lakeshore camping.
- Fires shall be built only in designated places.
- Please comply with the Carry In/Carry Out trash policy in all day-use areas. Overnight guests must put waste in receptacles provided for that purpose.
- Motorists shall observe posted speed limits and park only in designated areas.
- Swimming is limited to places and times designated by the DNR. No person shall possess or consume alcoholic beverages at a swimming beach.
- Drinking water should be taken only from pumps, hydrants or fountains provided for that purpose. This water is tested regularly for purity.
- Report lost or found articles to the park office.
- All motorized vehicles shall remain on paved roadway. Snowmobiles are prohibited.
- Metal detectors are allowed on main beach between Labor Day and Memorial Day with written permission from the property manager.
- Park closes from 11 p.m. until 7 a.m. No one is allowed in the park between these hours, except for anglers, campers and cabin guests with a receipt or key, using their sites.

Receipts from admission and service charges are used to help defray the operation and maintenance costs of the property. List of fees available in the lake office.


