

Governor's Award for Preservation of Historic Places
presented on Statehood Day

Criteria

1. The award is given for a project completed in Indiana within two years prior to the application deadline.
2. Generally, it is understood that the award will recognize outstanding "grassroots" efforts in historic preservation and archaeology.
3. Applicants can be individuals, local governments, or small, not-for-profit organizations within Indiana.
4. If the award is being given for a preservation project, the project must meet professional preservation standards.
5. The award will be given to the primary sponsoring individual or group if more than one entity was involved in the project.
6. The final decision will be made the Division of Historic Preservation and Archaeology (DHPA).

Application Process

1. Deadline for applications must be postmarked by September 1 of the year in which the award is given.
2. The application form will include name and contact information (address, phone number(s), e-mail address) of the nominator (if different from the nominee).
3. The application form will include name and contact information (address, phone number(s), e-mail address) of the individual or group being nominated.
4. The application form will include the name and contact information (address, phone number(s), e-mail address) of the property owner (if different from the nominated party).
5. The nominator should describe the individual or group being nominated in no more than 250 words
6. The nominator should tell about the historic place preserved by the project in no more than 250 words.
7. The nominator should describe how the project or effort preserved the historic place in no more than 500 words.
8. The nominator should describe the impact the project or effort has had on the local community in no more than 250 words.
9. The nominator should include enough photos to adequately show the historic place before and after the project.
10. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
