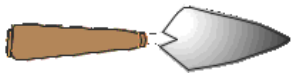
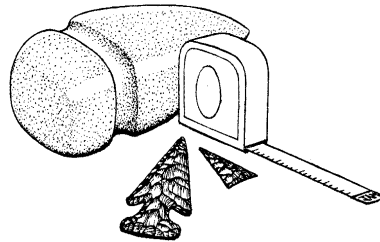
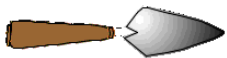




Archaeology Resources for Educators



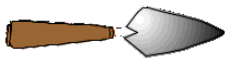
