IT'S BABY SEASON!:

Ah, it's Springtime again in Indiana! Our annual wildflowers are blooming, filling the air with those familiar Spring scents, the days are warming our skin, and the wildlife has sprung from their winter hiding places to fill our hikes with wonder and joy. But look! We've found a baby animal, and there's no mother in sight! What should we do?

Animals are survivalists, and chances are, the mother is watching us from a safe location. Mammals, such as rabbits and deer, will often leave the young for the day in order to not attract predator species, and will return again at night. Fledgling birds will hop out of the nest and may take weeks until they are able to fully fly. They'll hop on the ground while mom and dad bring them food and teach them how to

survive. Most of the time, the best option is to leave these babies alone and let mom and dad take care of business. However, if you do find an obviously injured animal, you can look up a list of DNR approved rehabilitators online and call a rehabber in your county by visiting our in.gov website. Otherwise, enjoy baby season!
