## **NEW: 2024-2025 Petition to Seek Performance-Based Accreditation Submission Window**

The submission window for non-public schools to submit a [petition for performance-based state accreditation](#) is open Thursday, January 2, through Wednesday, April 30. Petitions must be completed and submitted to IDOE prior to the school year for which accreditation would begin. ## **REMINDER: 2024 Federal Accountability Now Available**

The technical issues affecting 2024 federal accountability have been resolved and the 2024 federal report cards are available to all public schools in the [accountability portal](#). ### **REMINDER: Attendance Insights Review**

As we approach the mid-point of the school year, please take a look at the [attendance insights dashboard](#) to review attendance data. A couple of reminders:

- Check the Timely Submissions tab of the report to see if your school is up-to-date with submission of attendance data.
- Check on unexcused absence rates (Attendance Event Insights tab). How is your school doing with regard to habitual truancy?
- Review the projected chronic absenteeism numbers for your school (Absenteeism and Truancy Insights tab). How do these compare with last year's numbers?
- Graduates Prepared to Succeed (GPS) updated the K-12 data metrics just prior to Thanksgiving. This included an update to the rate of students with a 94% attendance rate for 2024. Consider comparing your GPS 94% attendance rate numbers for 2024 with where you are tracking for 2025.

### **REMINDER: Data Request Process**

This week, IDOE launched a new data request process in order to provide better service. Detailed forms are now available to data requesters tailored to the type of data being requested. ### **REMINDER: Nationwide Cybersecurity Review (NCSR) Now Open**

Completion of the NCSR is required if your school is receiving services under the State and Local Cybersecurity Grant Program (SLCGP) through the Indiana Office of Technology (IOT). The NCSR is a no-cost, anonymous, annual cybersecurity self-assessment designed to measure gaps and capabilities of school cybersecurity programs and based on the National Institute of Standards and Technology Cybersecurity Framework (NIST CSF). The number of Indiana schools completing this process has grown by 720% since 2021. Consider completing this year's NCSR by [registering here](#). ### **REMINDER: No-Cost Cybersecurity Services Now Available Through IOT/SLCGP**

IOT is providing no-cost services to all public schools in Indiana. These include:

- [CrowdStrike Falcon Complete Licenses for all staff workstations and servers](#): provides a software that is monitored by a 24/7 secure operations center (SOC), automatically detects/blocks cyber threats, and allows cyber professionals to respond and alert your IT team, even at 2 in the morning on a Saturday.
- [KnowBe4 for all staff workstations](#): provides access to conduct phishing exercises with staff and offers video training, posters, and documents.
- [Udemy for all IT and central office employees](#): provides access to a comprehensive training library including cybersecurity, IT certification, leadership development, office suite, and project management courses.
- [Cybersecurity assessments](#): provides a no-cost cybersecurity assessment of your schools cybersecurity posture, including a final report and recommendations for next steps that can be shared with school leadership/school board members.

### **NEW: Indirect Cost Rates for Fiscal Year (FY) 2026**

On Wednesday, January 1, the Office of School Finance will begin accepting applications from local education agencies (LEAs) eligible to receive FY 2026 Indirect Cost Rates.
