## **CoMP Defined**



#### CERTIFICATE OF MULTILINGUAL PROFICIENCY (COMP)

Indiana Certificate of Multilingual Proficiency is an award made by a participating school corporation, charter school, or accredited non-public high school designating on a student's transcript that the student has attained a high level of proficiency, sufficient for meaningful use in college and a career, in one or more languages in addition to English.






# National Seal of Biliteracy: Then and Now




#### **SEAL OF BILITERACY 2013: YEAR ONE**

#### SEAL OF BILITERACY VS. INDIANA CERTIFICATE

- Indiana is utilizing a "certificate" rather than a "seal" in order to allow schools to utilize a broader list of assessments and celebrate students at any point after meeting the eligibility requirements.
- Indiana opted to use the term "multilingual proficiency" rather than "biliteracy" to honor and promote the idea of multiple languages rather than only two.

#### 2021 - 2022 DATA



During the 2021-2022 school year, the Indiana Department of Education awarded approximately 750 Certificates of Multilingual Proficiency in 18 languages!

Including: Spanish, French, Mandarin, German, Arabic, Japanese, Vietnamese, Wolof, Korean, Italian, Turkish, Tagalog, *Russian*, *Portuguese*, *Polish*, *Burmese*, *Lao*, *Punjabi\** 

\*Blue languages are new additions in the '21-'22 school year.


## 2021-2022 Certificate of Multilingual Proficiency Students At A Glance

#### 2021 - 2022 DATA


Approximately 43% of students awarded the certificate in 2021-2022 were **English learners, former** English learners, or heritage speakers who had a familiar connection to a language other than English.






#### 2021 - 2022 DATA

Approximately 90% of students earned CoMP in Spanish. The breakdown of the other 10% can be seen on the right.

#### REQUIREMENTS FOR STUDENTS

- 1. Students must earn six credits in a single World Language (WL) through coursework.
  - a. If a student enrolls already proficient in a WL, a score of Intermediate High on a WL assessment can serve as demonstration of proficiency in lieu of course work. The student would then receive six WL credits. Assessments can be taken at any time during their high school career.
- 2. Students must pass an approved *external assessment* in WL at an Intermediate High level of proficiency.
  - a. The approved assessments and scoring guides are available on the IDOE <u>CoMP website</u>.
- 3. Students must earn at least eight credits in **English Language Arts**.
  - a. Students must pass the English Language Arts Grade 10 graduation qualifying exam, or
  - b. Achieve a 5.0 or higher on WIDA ACCESS (English Learners)

#### STEPS FOR LOCAL EDUCATION AGENCIES (LEA)



- Promote CoMP to students & families
- Identify students interested in pursuing CoMP
- Choose assessments to be used
- Maintain records and data
- Submit required data to IDOE (Jotform sign up/EOY feedback!)
- Celebrate student success!
  - Seals for diplomas or cords
  - Local press release
  - Awards ceremony/celebration

## Heritage Speakers, English Learners, or Former English Learners

If students enroll
proficient in a language
other than English, they
can earn up to six world
language credits by
scoring Intermediate High
on an approved
assessment.

If a student doesn't score
high enough on their
initial assessment, this
data can help place them
in world language courses
to target a specific
domain(s).

#### **World Language Students**

As soon as world language courses are open for enrolment, publicize the Certificate of Multilingual Proficiency to students and parents. Share assessment rubrics and guidelines so students can be familiar with level of language proficiency they need to reach.



#### **ASSESSING PROFICIENCY**

#### **ASSESSING PROFICIENCY**

- Schools may utilize any combination of the approved assessments.
- Schools must abide by the minimum score requirements as prescribed in the assessment list.

Name of Assessment	Minimum Requirements	Score Report Indicators (Minimum)	Rating to be entered into PowerSchool
AAPPL (ACTFL Assessment of Performance toward Proficiency in Languages)	Full Test (Form B) - Reading & Listening - Interpersonal Listening & Speaking - Presentational Writing	I-5 – Intermediate High A – Advanced Low Enter the lower proficiency level of the 4 tests for the transcript.	Intermediate High Advanced Low



#### ASSESSING PROFICIENCY

- For some assessments, a student's proficiency in each language domain is assessed separately. In these situations, a student's lowest score of all language domains must be the score utilized to determine eligibility.
- Students are allowed to retake the assessments and/or portions of an assessment in an attempt to demonstrate the required level of proficiency.







#### **SCORING EXAMPLE**

Student Language Scores:							
Reading 6							
Writing	5						
Listening	6						
Speaking	5						

**Overall Score**: 5

You must **not** average these score, nor round scores.





# Record Keeping and Data Reporting



#### RECORD KEEPING

- According to Indiana Code 20-30-14.5, the student's transcript MUST have the notation that CoMP has been received.
- Credits can be put on the transcript after a student reaches the Intermediate High Level of proficiency on the WL assessment if this is a student who has demonstrated language proficiency outside of the typical WL track in your school.







#### **TRANSCRIPTS**

#### **Indiana's e-transcript instructions:**

- Ensure accuracy of STNs
- Use the "Licensure" data element as "Certificates of Achievement."
   This field (50) already prints on the transcript

- Use "Awarded Certificate of Multilingual Proficiency"
- Use the date the certificate was awarded to students following the prescribed format.

#### Instructions & Guidelines:

Use the following Google Sheet to help you track your students' data throughout the year as they pursue the Certificate of Multilingual Proficiency. This tracker can be used for students of all grade levels, but only seniors are able to be awarded CoMP.

The following information is **required** to be submitted for the Certificate of Multilingual Proficiency End of Year Data:

- Number of high schools awarding CoMP
- Number of seniors who earned CoMP in 2023-2024







- Only seniors are reported
- Report on the following:
  - Number of assessments of each type administered
  - Number of assessments of each type in which student obtained a level of intermediate high
  - Number of students who earn CoMP in each language represented in your school







- Report on English learners participating in CoMP:
  - Number of ELs who took assessment
  - Number of ELs who achieved level of intermediate high
  - Number of <u>former ELs</u> who took assessment
  - Number of <u>former ELs</u> who achieved level of intermediate high









- Report on heritage speakers participating in CoMP
  - Number of heritage speakers who took assessment
  - Number of heritage who achieved level of intermediate high

\*Heritage speaker can be defined as a student who has never been identified as an EL, but has a connection to the language of study through their family.

#### DATA REPORTING (NEW, OPTIONAL)

- Male/Female/Non-Binary
- Race/Ethnicity
  - American Indian/Alaskan Native
  - Asian, Native Hawaiian, or Other Pacific Islander
  - Black or African American
  - Multiracial
  - White
  - Hispanic, Latino, or of Spanish Origin
- High Ability/Disability (504/IEP/SPED)







#### CELEBRATING STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

- IDOE will email the digital certificate in April/May.
- The school will then add the following to the certificate:
  - Student name;
  - Language(s) assessed other than English; and
  - Administrator name (who will be signing the certificate?)



 The school should not put a copy of the actual certificate on their website or social media.
