

2023-2024 INDIANA SAT ACCOMMODATIONS CROSSWALK

The Indiana SAT Accommodations Crosswalk has been designed to help educators understand the relationship between the College Board options in Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) Online, the SAT accommodation options listed in Indiana IEP (IIEP), and related daily accommodations. Starting in 2023-24, SSD Online accommodations will automatically transfer to Test Day Toolkit (TDTK) and Bluebook, College Board's proctoring and student-testing applications, respectively. The paper-based SAT is only allowed for students that require a paper assessment accommodation. For additional information or descriptions of each accommodation and how these may be administered for other College Board assessments, refer to College Board's Accommodations and Supports Handbook.

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



