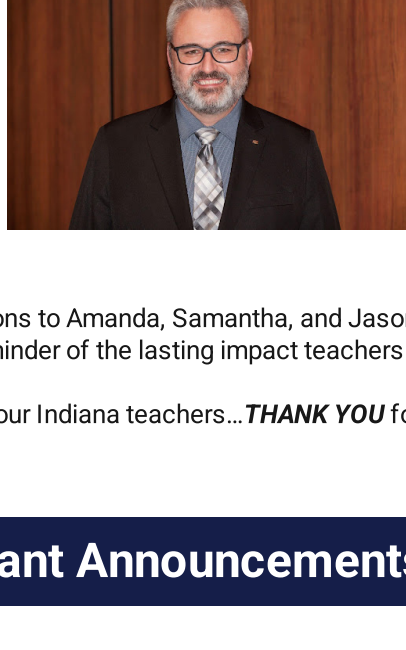

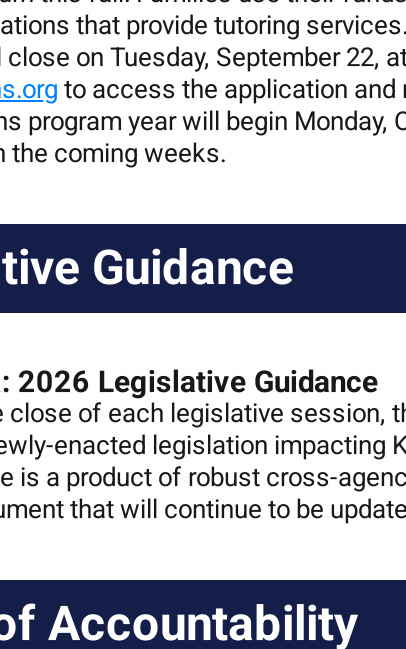
A Message from Dr. Katie Jenner

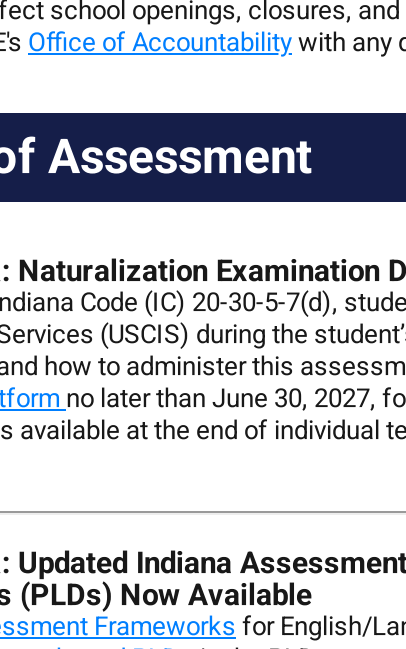

NEW: Indiana Learns - Application Now Open for Prospective Learning Partners

[Indiana Learns](#), a statewide tutoring grant program, which provides eligible families with up to \$1,000 for tutoring in reading and math, will return this fall. Families use their funds to access tutoring from approved Learning Partners, including schools and other organizations that provide tutoring services. The Learning Partner application window for the 2026-2027 program year is open and will close on Tuesday, September 22, at 5 p.m. ET. Following the close of each legislative session, the Indiana Department of Education (IDOE) immediately begins working to implement newly-enacted legislation impacting K-12 education, which includes compiling guidance for schools and educators. This guidance is a product of robust cross-agency collaboration and partnership with countless stakeholders. This is an iterative document that will continue to be updated and improved in collaboration with educators.

REMINDER: School and Corporation Amendment Profile Amendment Closing Soon

The school and corporation profile amendment submission window for the 2026-2027 school year will close on Monday, August 31. In order to ensure IDOE maintains accurate information, all schools and corporations must provide notice when changes are made that affect school openings, closures, and reconfigurations. REMINDER: Naturalization Examination Data Reporting Requirements

Pursuant to Indiana Code (IC) 20-30-5-7(d), students must take the naturalization examination from U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) during the student's high school U.S. Government course. For more information on this requirement and how to administer this assessment, please see this [memo](#). Corporations must report this testing data to IDOE using this [JoTform](#) no later than June 30, 2027, for the previous school year. REMINDER: Updated Indiana Assessment Frameworks with Evidence-Based Performance Level Descriptors (PLDs) Now Available

Most guidance documents have been updated and released, with additional updates forthcoming on a rolling basis. Documents dated August 2026 or later incorporate evidence-based PLDs and new example items. REMINDER: Choice Scholarship Fall Payments

To be eligible to receive a student payment in the first fall payout, every student is required to have enrollment, membership information, and a signed Parent and School Signature page uploaded by Tuesday, September 8. Any student missed in the first fall payment will be paid in the second fall payment as long as the required data is reported for the student in Data Exchange by Thursday, October 1 (census date) and the Parent and School Signature page is uploaded to the Choice Scholarship Student Application tile by the Monday, October 19 deadline.

Upon approval of the Choice Scholarship application, the Parent and School Signature page can be found on the second page of a student's estimated award letter in the Choice Scholarship Student Application tile. The Parent and School Signature page is available as soon as the student's application is submitted and approved. The link to upload the forms is available in the student applications and will remain open through Monday, October 19.

FY 2025 IDEA Part B grant monitoring:

- Immediate:** IDEA Part B monitoring reports are past due and must be submitted ASAP.
- Friday, August 28:** FY 2025 Part B 611 and 619 grant proportionate share release request forms due.
- Friday, September 15:** Final day to submit FY 2025 IDEA Part B budget modification requests.
- Wednesday, September 30:** Final day to encumber all FY 2025 Part B funds and official grant closing date.

Reimbursement Requirements for FY 2025 Part B 611 and 619

Per the State Board of Accounts (SBOA), IDOE must obtain supporting documentation for reimbursements processed between October 1 and December 15 for grants that closed on Wednesday, September 30. The supporting documentation confirms that all expenses occurred within the grant's active period. Acceptable documentation may include:

- Paid dates
- Receipts or invoices showing as payment
- Purchase order or encumbrance dates (Documentation from LEA financial system is preferred, as handwritten documents will not be accepted)
- Ledger or computer document showing dates and expenses (Documentation from LEA financial system is preferred, as Excel format will not be accepted)
- Amounts total the reimbursement request reviewed

REMINDER: IDEA Equitable Services Consultation Due Tuesday, September 15

Evidence of initial consultation for IDEA Part B 611 and 619 grant proportionate share release request forms due by Tuesday, September 15. As a reminder, the submission should include evidence of the consultation with non-public schools that is required to prepare for the 2026-2027 school year. IDOE provided an Initial Affirmation of Consultation template for IDEA services, which is available in Moodle. If a non-public school(s) is unresponsive, documentation of good faith efforts (e.g., certified mailing receipt) to provide consultation must be submitted for review. Due to the time needed for review and the volume of requests at the beginning of a school year, HLS Amendment Request must be submitted by Friday, September 18, to be reviewed prior to the October 1 Learner Report request date. Due to FERPA, [HLS Amendment Request forms](#) along with the student's original HLS must be submitted via [JoTform](#). 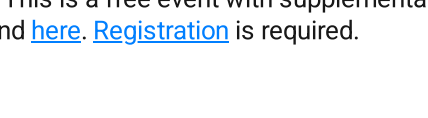
