A Message from Dr. Katie Jenner

For some of you reading this today...welcome back! For others, I hope you're enjoying your final day(s) of winter break. But for all, I hope the break provided a well-deserved opportunity to do some things you enjoy...as well as some time to relax and do nothing at all.

The days following the start of a new year are often filled with anticipation and optimism. Anticipation about what is to come and optimism that this year will be better than the last. In that spirit, many of us will set goals, aiming to be better versions of ourselves, both personally and professionally. While sometimes, our goals are individualized, they can also be a way to bring people together...all rowing in the same direction, towards a common target.

A great example of this is Indiana's recently established literacy goal...that **95% of third grade students demonstrate reading proficiency skills and pass IREAD-3 by 2027**. Every day, in every school across our state, our teachers are helping students gain important knowledge and skills needed for future success, but none of this is possible without the ability to read. So far, several local school boards have passed resolutions illustrating their commitment to the statewide literacy goal, including [Fort Wayne Community Schools](#) and [Huntington County Community School Corporation](#). Thank you, Fort Wayne and Huntington County, for leading the way on



this! We hope to see other local school boards make this public commitment to reading as well—and keep us posted when you do, as we'd like to recognize you.

And speaking of goals, I'd like to share a few more today as we gear up for the start of the 2023 legislative session next week. Yesterday, I joined Governor Holcomb at Liberty Park Elementary School in Warren Township to announce his 2023 legislative agenda. It was very exciting to have the Governor announce his agenda at an Indiana school, specifically a school that is so committed to providing science of reading training and support for teachers and students. Thanks to **Superintendent Dr. Tim Hanson** and **Principal Jason Brooks** for hosting! While the Governor will focus on a number of important topics this session, including public health and safety, **education will be a primary focus.**



The full [press release](#) from Governor Holcomb's agenda announcement can be found here, but below are just a few of the education highlights (we will detail more in the coming weeks).

- **Increase tuition support** - 6% in FY2024 and an additional 2% in FY2025, totaling \$1.157 billion. Gov. Holcomb will push for additional dollars to go to the classroom to continue the effort to increase average teacher salaries to at least \$60,000 a year. The average teacher salary is currently \$56,600.
- **Create a local incentive for improving student literacy** - a \$20 million program that rewards schools and teachers that improve students' passing rate on IREAD-3...again, layering in more support to help our state achieve the 95% IREAD-3 passage rate goal.
- **Expand the [state's largest-ever financial investment in literacy](#)** - secure \$10 million in state funding to obtain another \$10 million match from the Lilly Endowment, focused on the science of reading.
- **Provide free textbooks for students and families** - fully fund the cost of textbooks and other curricular materials.
- **Support STEM education** - work to ensure high-quality STEM curriculum is in every Indiana classroom.

- **Implement the Dolly Parton Imagination Library statewide** - this would provide every participating child from birth to five-years-old with more access to books—one free book each month.
- **Prioritize school safety** - increase the matching funds available to local schools through the Secured School Safety Grant from \$19 million to \$25 million per year
- **Expand access to high-quality early learning opportunities** - this includes expanding eligibility for Child Care and Development Fund vouchers and working with legislators to expand On My Way Pre-K by raising the income eligibility limits for the programs from 127% to 138% of the federal poverty limit. This change will expand program access to about 5,000 more lower income working families.
- **Encourage employer-sponsored early learning and childcare** - use federal funds to establish a \$25 million innovation grant that provides funding and licensing support for employer-sponsored childcare options
- **Modernize and update early learning Paths to Quality** - better measure kindergarten readiness and reduce regulatory burdens that limit access to early learning opportunities
- **Auto-enroll students in the state's 21st Century Scholars program** - increase college affordability and going rates for our state's most at-risk students

In addition to listening and working with you, our team is also eager to work with Governor Holcomb and members of the General Assembly to advance these important investments, which will ensure students have as many doors of opportunity open to them as possible when they leave our K-12 schools. In addition to the above, we will also be laser-focused on additional collaborative solutions this session that address persistent challenges facing our students and educators. This includes rethinking high school to maximize the four years we have students (including increased diploma flexibility, allowing access to credentials of value and quality work-based learning opportunities), securing additional funding to support the growing costs associated with serving special education and English learner student populations, and prioritizing the health and overall well-being of our students. We will share more details in the weeks ahead!

This legislative session, let's maximize our opportunity to leverage state policy to increase support for Indiana's educators and positively impact the trajectory of the lives of our Indiana students. As always, thank you for your ongoing partnership and for all you do for our students.

The WIDA ACCESS test window is open from Monday, January 9, to Friday, February 24. The window is seven weeks long to ensure corporations and schools have ample time to assess 100% of identified English learners (ELs), as federally required. The Indiana Department of Education's (IDOE's) Office of Student Assessment will conduct monitoring visits during the WIDA ACCESS test window beginning on Monday, January 9. UPDATE: State Ed-ID Portal Now Available for New Student Test Numbers (STN) and School Personnel Numbers (SPN)

The transition to the new Ed-ID portal is now complete. Ed-IDs for students (also known as STNs) as well as Ed-IDs for staff (also known as SPNs) can now be requested through the portal. This process replaces the old approach to generating IDs for educators and students and allows for more versatility in the generation and use of IDs. REMINDER: E-Rate Match for Fiber Construction Now Available

IDOE is participating in the E-Rate Match Program for special construction projects. Available to any Indiana public school for fiscal year (FY) 2023 (July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024), the program increases the discount rate for special construction charges for high-speed broadband that meets the FCC's long-term connectivity targets up to an additional 10% to match the state funding on a one-to-one dollar basis.
