A Message from Dr. Katie Jenner

In honor of Black History Month, I had the opportunity to sit down (virtually) with an Indiana leader and friend who continues to inspire countless Hoosiers, myself included, for a special edition of [Teachers Who Shaped Us](#). This video series is designed to shine a spotlight on the positive impact educators make on our students' lives and on our state.

I first met Tanya Bell McKinzie in 2021 in her capacity as president and CEO of Indiana Black Expo. Since then, she and I have had many conversations about the opportunity that we must seize to work together...with intentionality...to truly move the needle for *all Indiana students*. This includes, as you know, being laser-focused on knowledge and skill development, as well as providing pathways and opportunities that help students to achieve their dreams.



Like several others we have spoken to as part of this series, it was difficult for Tanya to name *just one* teacher who impacted her life's journey—however, one in particular who stands out is **Ms. Katherine Utley**, her Latin teacher at [Terre Haute North Vigo High School](#).

The quote by Maya Angelou rings true as she describes Ms. Utley – “I've learned that people will forget what you said, people will forget what you did, but **people will never forget how you made them feel.**” Tanya recalls how Ms. Utley challenged and empowered her to achieve great things.

In addition to a parent or guardian, Tanya explains that a great teacher is one of the most important individuals in a child's life...helping to keep them on the right path and to dream big. Having grown up in poverty, she specifically recalls what it meant to have Ms. Utley – a teacher who looked like her – to help her see her own potential.

In addition to sharing the incredible work of Ms. Utley, she also had a message for all Indiana educators..."We love you, we appreciate you, and we thank you. Keep up the good work!"

Tanya, I couldn't have said it better myself! Thank you for helping us honor Ms. Katherine Utley and elevate her as an inspiring part of Indiana's history. And in honor of Black History Month, in addition to Ms. Utley, thank you to all our black teachers and leaders serving in Indiana schools!

NEW: SAT School Day Reminders - Two Weeks Until Testing Begins

The SAT School Day primary testing window opens on Wednesday, March 1. Schools should ensure that preparation tasks are completed and that students are prepared to participate.

- Schools must ensure that all School Test Coordinators (STCs) and backup STCs complete [training for the Test Information Distribution Engine \(TIDE\)](#) and the [Digital SAT Test Coordinator training](#). Proctors must complete the [Digital Proctor Training](#), and hall and room monitors may review the recommended [training presentation](#).
- Conduct the recommended [preadministration session](#) to save time on test day.
- Finalize the organization of testing rooms using the [seating and security guidelines](#) and the [Digital Testing Room Quick Start Guide](#).

NEW: ILEARN Biology End-of-Course Assessment (ECA) Testing Window Closes Friday, February 24

The ILEARN Biology ECA Winter 2023 testing window closes on Friday, February 24. Accommodated paper testing closes today, Friday, February 17, and necessary materials must be returned to Data Recognition Corporation (DRC) by the end of the testing window. Preliminary results will populate in the [Centralized Reporting System \(CRS\)](#) on Thursday, February 23, prompting the opening of the Rescore Request Window through Wednesday, March 8. Schools may utilize IDOE's [ILEARN Rescore Request Guidance](#) and [ILEARN Rescore Request Parent Letter Template](#) to assist with communicating this information to students and families. NEW: IREAD-3 Reminders - Preparing for Testing

- IREAD-3 Spring and Summer Retest 2022 Good Cause Exemptions (GCEs) [must be reported](#) by Monday, March 6.

NEW: WIDA ACCESS Test Window Closes Friday, February 24

The annual WIDA ACCESS test window closes next Friday, February 24. Schools are federally required to assess 100% of identified English learners within the seven-week test window. All secure test materials must be postmarked for return by Wednesday, March 1, to be processed for scoring. The Alternate ACCESS Field Test window remains open through Monday, April 17. REMINDER: Naturalization Examination Requirements

Public high schools are required to administer the naturalization examination to Indiana students upon completion of the U.S. government course. Results should be [submitted](#) after each trimester or semester, and all 2022-2023 results are due by Friday, June 30. REMINDER: E-Rate Match for Fiber Construction Now Available

IDOE is participating in the E-Rate Match Program for special construction projects. Available to any Indiana public school for fiscal year (FY) 2023 (July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024), the program increases the discount rate for special construction charges for high-speed broadband that meets the FCC's long-term connectivity targets up to an additional 10% to match the state funding on a one-to-one dollar basis. NEW: American Rescue Plan Fund for Homeless Children and Youth (ARP-HCY) - Remaining Balance

Funds appropriated under the ARP-HCY I will be available for obligation until Saturday, September 30, 2023, and funds appropriated under the ARP-HCY II program will be available for obligation until September 30, 2024. The deadline for drawdown of the obligated funds is 120 days, or January 30, 2025 (see 2 C.F.R. § 200.344(b)). As of Wednesday, January 25, 2023, Indiana shows an available ARP-HCY balance of \$11,230,750.17, which is 86% of the total Indiana's ARP Homeless I and II allocations combined. Indiana school districts must report expenditures on a monthly basis in order for IDOE to maintain accurate reporting of dollars spent and dollars available. NEW: Legislative Considerations - Standards Prioritization and Curriculum Adoption

Pursuant to Indiana Code (IC) 20-31-3-1, IDOE is currently streamlining the Indiana Academic Standards for kindergarten through grade 12. Proposed legislation during the current legislative session would require IDOE to approve curriculum in science, technology, engineering, mathematics (STEM), and English/language arts if enacted later this spring. This proposed legislation would also require schools to adopt reading programs aligned to the science of reading. IDOE strongly recommends that corporations and schools pause any ongoing efforts related to curriculum adoption. Review [this memo](#) for more details. NEW: Standards Prioritization Committees In Progress - Public Comment Begins Early March

Pursuant to IC 20-31-3-1, IDOE is convening a variety of stakeholder committees (e.g., educators, parents, community members) throughout February to review recommended prioritizations of the Indiana Academic Standards for kindergarten through grade 12 with the goal of defining no more than 75% of these standards. Committees are also defining recommendations for no more than 33% of the standards as "essential" for mastery by the end of each grade level or course.

As committees conclude initial meetings, recommended standards will be released for public comment. All recommended standards for mathematics, English/language arts, and two social studies courses will be available for public comment beginning in early March. NEW FROM THE INDIANA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH (IDOH): The Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) Data Summary

On Monday, February 13, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention released the [YRBS Summary & Trends Report: 2011-2021](#). Indiana received weighted data in 2021 for the first time since 2015, and IDOH is working with Indiana schools to ensure weighted data is received again in 2023. The report includes data on adolescent health related to mental health, sexual behavior, substance use, school connectedness and more. It is important to note that many negative behaviors and experiences that were increasing before the pandemic continue to worsen and are trending in the wrong direction. While this summary report is now available, the full YRBS data set will be released later this spring. The Indiana 2021 YRBS data is available on the [IDOH's website](#). While reviewing this data, it is key to remember the importance of participating in this biannual survey if your school is selected. Greater participation means consistent weighted data and trend tracking for Indiana to inform evidence-based programs and support youth across our state. Contact [IDOH](#) with any questions.
