The school and corporation profile amendment submission window for the 2023-2024 school year opened on Friday, March 31. In order to ensure the Indiana Department of Education (IDOE) maintains accurate information, all schools and corporations must provide notice when changes are made that affect school openings, closures, and reconfigurations. REMINDER: ILEARN Spring 2023 Testing Windows Open Monday, April 17

Schools should be preparing for the upcoming ILEARN testing windows:

- ILEARN 3-8 Spring 2023: Monday, April 17, through Friday, May 12
- ILEARN Biology & U.S. Government End-of-Course Assessments Spring 2023: Monday, April 17, through Friday, May 19

Practice tests must be administered to students at least once prior to operational testing, and instructions and scripts can be found on the [Indiana Assessment Portal](#). Refer to the [ILEARN 3-8 Test Window Checklist](#) and [ILEARN Biology ECA Test Window Checklist](#) for additional tasks prior to testing. REMINDER: 2023 School Tech Plan Survey Now Open

The 2023 School Tech Plan Survey is now open through Friday, May 5, to be completed by all Indiana school corporations, charter schools, and optionally for non-public schools. Completion of this survey is a requirement for all public schools to qualify for the connectivity formula grant, the common school fund, and grants from IDOE's Office of Academics. IDOE presents additional student-level reports available behind the [LINK Portal](#) via the IDOE's new EdData platform. These reports are available to superintendents, assistant superintendents, principals, assistant principals, counselors, and data administrators. In addition, security coordinators may assign the following roles to provide access: "School Administrator," "LEA Administrator," or "Data Viewer."

- **IREAD-3 and ILEARN Report** - This report displays IREAD-3 and ILEARN data for currently enrolled students.
- **WIDA Report** - This report displays WIDA data for currently enrolled students.
- **PSAT Report** - This report displays PSAT data for currently enrolled students.

The EdData platform is available for all authenticated users and also contains some publicly available reports as those that require secure authorization. REMINDER: Student Academic Record Collection Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) Resource

Changes implemented for reporting course enrollments (student academic record replacing course completion collection) and outcomes will impact all schools that report course-level data to IDOE. These updates are occurring to improve the completeness of academic records for each student, to support metrics on the Indiana Graduates Prepared to Succeed dashboard, and to monitor Graduation Pathways progress. NEW: Student Safety Reporting

Indiana's Student Safety Reporting Law (IC 20-34-6-1) requires school corporations to report student bullying, arrest, and gang data for each school to IDOE. These submissions are now included on the DOE-ES Report (discipline report) via the STN Application Center data transfer function. This data collection is now open, and submissions must be complete by Friday, June 30. All states applying for funding under IDEA Part B are required to allow public review and comment on the application and proposed budget. The application packet, developed by the U.S. Department of Education's Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP), includes a summary of assurances, certifications, and fund usage descriptions that the state will use to fulfill IDEA Part B requirements. Upon OSEP's approval of Indiana's Part B application, the state will receive a federal grant award to implement necessary services for students with disabilities from July 1, 2023, through September 30, 2025. NEW: 2023-2024 Reading Plan and Dyslexia Reporting Submissions Due Friday, June 30

511 Indiana Administrative Code (IAC) 6.2-3.1 requires all public and accredited non-public schools with students enrolled in kindergarten through grade three to complete and submit an elementary reading plan to IDOE by close of business on Friday, June 30. IDOE's Literacy Center released [Reading Plan Guidance](#) to assist with this requirement.

- Public schools will use this [form](#).
- Accredited non-public schools will use this [form](#).

In addition to the reading plan, Indiana Code (IC) 20-35.5 requires all public schools to report dyslexia screening data from the 2022-2023 school year. Accredited non-public schools are not required to submit data, but have the option to report. Charter schools will use this [form](#) for dyslexia reporting dyslexia screening data.
