### A Message from Dr. Katie Jenner

95% by 2027...this is our shared goal...as a state, as corporations, and as individual schools...to ensure that **95% of Indiana students pass IREAD-3 by 2027**. We know that the ability to read is the *single-most important skill needed for all other learning*...yet, currently, one in five third grade students in Indiana is not proficient in key literacy skills. This data implores all of us to *work together*, with *urgency*, to achieve this goal for our students.

It has been nearly one year since we announced the [state's largest ever financial investment in literacy](#), now totaling **\$170 million**. This investment has allowed us to link arms with schools across Indiana, providing additional resources and tools to support you in deploying the science of reading and ensuring your school is hitting our shared goal.

One of the tactical solutions supported by this investment is the Indiana Literacy Cadre which includes a partnership between IDOE, the [University of Indianapolis's Center of Excellence in Leadership of Learning \(CELL\)](#) and [Marian University's Center for Vibrant Schools](#). Last summer, about 50 schools (cohort one) hired instructional coaches, trained in the science of reading, to support educators and ultimately, help more students learn to read using evidence-based strategies. This past week, we kicked off cohort two of the Indiana Literacy Cadre, bringing our total to **212 participating elementary schools!** If you have not already joined, I strongly encourage you to [connect with our team](#) at the Indiana Literacy Center and consider how you might join in the future!



## As part of the Indiana Literacy Cadre...

- Schools have access to **experienced instructional coaches** designed to help them implement the science of reading in their schools
- *Kindergarten through second-grade educators* receive **guidance, support, and professional development** on the science of reading
- *Students* learn to read, using a **research-based strategy** focused around phonics, phonemic awareness, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension



The urgency of this work has never been more clear. As the [analysis of ILEARN data shared last week](#) shows, while learning is stabilizing for many students, other students are still struggling. We must continue to aggressively and intentionally deploy innovative solutions for our students to support their learning, and this training is one of the tools educators can use to target our students who are most in-need.

Having 95% of our students achieve a passing score on IREAD-3 by 2027 is our collective challenge, but it is also a *huge opportunity*. Our most recent IREAD-3 scores will be released next month giving us an indicator of where our students stand as we kick off the 2023-2024 school year.

Thank you to the educators and administrators who are participating in the Indiana Literacy Cadre—and if you haven't signed up yet, please consider joining. Enjoy the final days of summer break, and as always, thank you for all that you do for students!

## Office of Information Technology

### NEW: Ed-Fi Upgrade Complete

This week, IDOE launched an upgraded version of the Ed-Fi technology and data standard for the 2023-2024 school year. School personnel and their vendors have been participating in training and will continue to be trained in the weeks ahead. While the changes in this upgrade will be transparent to schools, Indiana will benefit from the many improvements to the data standard which have occurred since Ed-Fi was first implemented in the 2019-2020 school year. These changes include improvements in the data model and increased efficiencies in the Ed-Fi technology platform. Contact the [Data Exchange Team](#) with any questions.

### REMINDER: LINK Portal Setup and Review of Security Coordinators

The [LINK Portal](#) is able to recognize all public, charter, and accredited non-public schools' local Google G-Suite or Microsoft 365 accounts. IDOE configures the organization's leader as the first account, and the organization leader must log in to designate up to two security coordinators responsible for overseeing the setup of roles for others in the organization. All superintendents and leaders of non-public schools should log in to the LINK Portal and review/update their security coordinator information.

## **REMINDER: Designation of Key Contacts**

Security coordinators for all traditional public, charter, and accredited non-public schools are responsible for ensuring their organization's key contacts for the 2023-2024 school year are set. Key contacts including the roles of Superintendent, Financial Contact, Special Education Director, Principal, Data Exchange Contact, etc. are needed for the 2023-2024 school year even if those contacts were provided last school year.

For school corporations that have an Ed-fi student information system (SIS), key contacts and other staff role assignments should be entered and managed in the local SIS and then provided to Data Exchange/LINK for the new school year. However, all three options below are available:

1. Provide staff classifications in the local SIS per vendor's instructions,
2. Add a staff type manually for the 2023-2024 school year via the Security Portal, or
3. Upload [templates](#) 008\_StaffAssociation\_StaffEdOrgAssignmentAssociation and 0009\_StaffOrganizationContactAssociation into Data Exchange.

Schools utilizing options two and three may cause overriding or loss of data. Schools should connect with their SIS vendor to better understand how to avoid data loss when providing data via multiple methods.

IDOE will recognize active staff assignments/roles during the summer months from the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 school years and will begin recognizing only the 2023-2024 school year assignments beginning **Friday, September 1**. ## **REMINDER: SIS Vendor Changes**

IDOE-issued Data Exchange credentials (key and secret) are tied to the supporting SIS vendor. If your corporation will be changing or adding an SIS vendor for the 2023-2024 school year, please email [link@doe.in.gov](mailto:link@doe.in.gov) with these changes. Your organization will receive a new set of credentials for the new vendor. Please note that participation in the 2023-2024 school year Kick-off Sessions is required in order to receive and activate the credentials. ## **REMINDER: Kick-off Session Participation Required to Receive Data Exchange Credentials**

Schools are expected to join the 2023-2024 school year Kick-off Session that is specific to their SIS. The session schedule can be found in the [Moodle Data Exchange Training and Community](#), and should be attended by at least two individuals from each school corporation – the individual in the lead data role and the superintendent, assistant superintendent, chief financial officer, chief information officer, or director/head of school. Schools will gain access to Ed-Id API after the completion of the Kick-off Session. Please allow up to three business days for IDOE to confirm attendance and update access for organizations, after which schools will be able to submit data to IDOE. Schools will continue to have access to the Ed-ID Portal Interface to assign STNs and SPNs. The 2022-2023 school year data collection closed on Wednesday, July 12, after which time no further data changes will not be allowed. Contact the [Data Exchange Team](#) with any questions.
