## Finding 9009: SFSP Outreach

Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) outreach to households was not conducted by the SFA. Although the SFA does not operate the SFSP, all program sponsors operating School Nutrition Programs must inform households of the availability of SFSP meals through other sponsors. The State Agency provides language through the Weekly Newsletter in early May for sponsors to use to meet this requirement.

# **Corrective Action:**

The SFA agrees to conduct outreach at the end of each school year. This was completed by the SFA no further action is necessary.

# Meal Components & Quantities - Neighbors' New Vistas High School (6864)

404. Day of Review- signage explaining the reimbursable meal was posted near/at the beginning of the service line and did not promote water or any other beverage as an alternative to milk

### Finding 9055: No signage explaining what constitutes a reimbursable meal at beginning of service line.

As observed on the Day of Review, signage explaining what constitutes a reimbursable meal is not identified near or at the beginning of the meal service line(s).

### **Corrective Action:**

Signage was put up on the day of review. This is sufficient and no further action is necessary.

# **Technical Assistance:**

The school was provided technical assistance during the on-site visit.

500. Day of Review- Offer vs. Serve was properly implemented

### Finding 9078: School is not properly implementing Offer vs. Serve.

As observed on the Day of Review, one or more cashiers did not demonstrate a clear understanding of OVS and its requirements. Where a student selected a reimbursable meal, the student was made to select an additional item(s).

#### **Corrective Action:**

As corrective action, cashiers must be retrained in OVS requirements, including the daily enforcement of OVS requirements. State Agency provided training to the SFA. This is sufficient and no further action is necessary.

The school was provided technical assistance during the on-site visit.
