#### **Commendations**

- \* The certification documents selected for review were processed without error. Communication with households regarding their income application was well documented.
- \* At the reviewed school, production records were completed without error. All foods, crediting, and quantities served were documented correctly.
- \* The director and supporting staff were ready and willing to make any necessary changes to improve their program and increase participation.

#### **Technical Assistance**

- \* The sponsor is reminded to update the school website when nutrition program guidelines are modified, specifically that milk varieties can include both skim and 1% flavored milk.
- \* Breakfast participation was very low at the reviewed school. The reviewer discussed ways to potentially improve participation including:
  - -Operate breakfast after the bell.
  - -Offering new hot entree options.
  - -Offer student favorites daily (shelf stable foods).
  - -Operate universal free breakfast.
- \* The SA discussed ways to increase lunch participation and take meal service to the next level, including:
  - -Offering a variety of salads and/or wraps instead of the same one daily.
  - -For the open-air cooler, use clear plastic containers to showcase foods and add lighting to draw attention to foods.
  - -Upgrade the dinner roll (served on the day of review) to a fresh baked roll to increase aromatic appeal.
- \* Students with special dietary needs must be provided foods/beverages that align with those needs. Students should not be able to select foods that go against doctor's orders. If the modification is no longer needed, the parent/guardian must complete a discontinuation of accommodations form. The FSD and school nurse must work together to ensure students' needs are met.

#### **Technical Assistance - Verification Letters**

When sending a request for income documents during verification, it is best practice to give households a two-week deadline to submit documents. With extended deadlines, households are more likely to forget, leading to high non-response rates. Additionally, always ensure households are receiving language appropriate correspondence. For households with limited English proficiency, the sponsor should refer to alternate translations.

The full nondiscrimination statement must be used on documents of two or more pages, but on documents of one page or less, the short statement may be used; either statement must be the same font size as the rest of the document. As corrective action, the non-discrimination statement was updated on the following program materials: menu and benefit issuance correspondence letter templates. A copy of each updated resource was submitted to the State Agency. No further corrective action is required.

The sponsor must develop breakfast menus each month for all schools to show they are planning to meet all meal pattern requirements. The SFA has submitted their newly developed menu, showing they planned to meet all requirements. No further action is required.
