7. Site monitored in first 4 weeks of operation, date, deficiencies/CA?

Finding: The SFA has not monitored this site's Afterschool Snack Program. *Repeat Finding

The first review should be made at some point within the first four weeks of the start of the program. The second review can take place at any other point during the program year.

Corrective Action:

Confirm that in the future the After School Snack Program's monitoring requirements will always be met.

11. Month of Review Snack Count

Finding: After School Snack Program Count Underclaim

An underclaim error (originally claimed 38 and 301 served) occurred in the number of snacks claimed in March 2022. The snack count was corrected on before the claim was paid.

Corrective Action:

Confirm that in the future all counts will be double checked for accuracy prior to the submission of any monthly claims.

Technical Assistance:

A technical assistance was conducted on this specific finding.

11. Month of Review Snack Production Records

Finding: After School Snack Program Production Records

Serving sizes are not stated on the March 2022 snack menu. The number of each component available for snack is not always listed. Each day all ASSP sites must always document the number of food items planned along with the serving sizes.

Corrective Action:

Confirm that in the future After School Snack Program Production Records will always have the number of each component available for snack along with all serving sizes.

Technical Assistance:

While onsite, a technical assistance was conducted on this specific finding. Plus, it was suggested that the sponsor use the state agency monthly ASSP document (which includes planned food item and their serving sizes). Using this document in the future will ensure compliance.

Meal Counting & Claiming - St. Michael School (B265)

325. Review Period- meal counts by category were correctly used in the claim for reimbursement

Finding: Error in the Lunches Claimed

An overclaim error occurred in the number of lunches claimed in March 2022. Due to this claim not being paid yet, the SFA was able to correct this error during the onsite visit.

Corrective Action:

Confirm that in the future meal counts will be double checked by a second person prior to submitting the monthly claim for reimbursement.

A technical assistance was conducted on this specific finding.

Leftovers from the Food Distribution Program Technical Assistance
