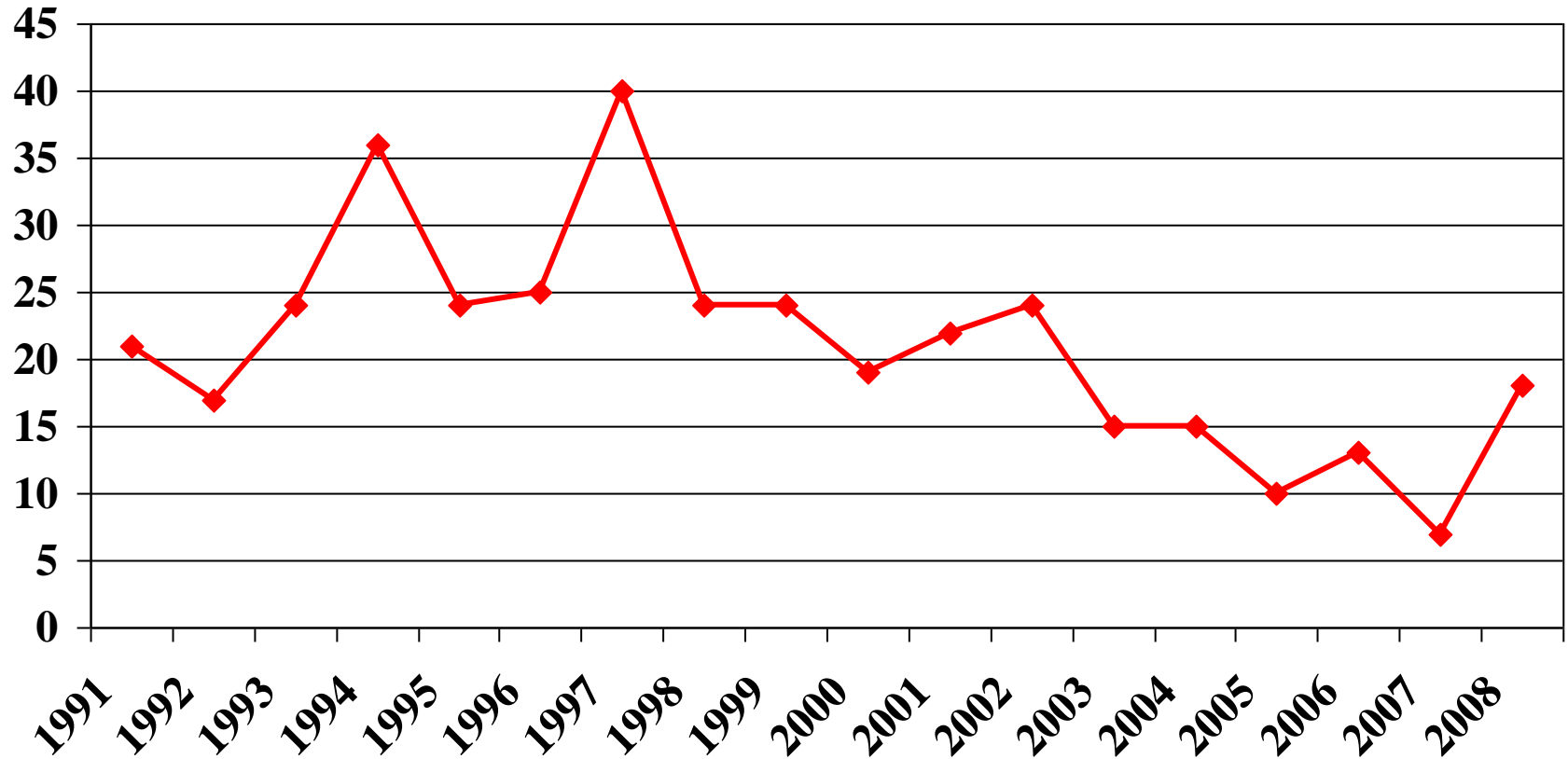
Indiana Manufacturing Occupational Fatalities

Executive Summary

- There were 18 fatalities in the manufacturing industry in 2008, the highest number since 2002 which had 24.
- 13% of Indiana's Occupational Fatalities were in the Manufacturing Industry in 2008.
- The most common event causing a fatality in a manufacturing environment was contact with objects and equipment.
- Six fatalities occurred in Primary Metals Manufacturing.
- Data used in this report is from IOSHA inspection reports and the Bureau of Labor Statistics' Census of Fatal Occupational Injuries.

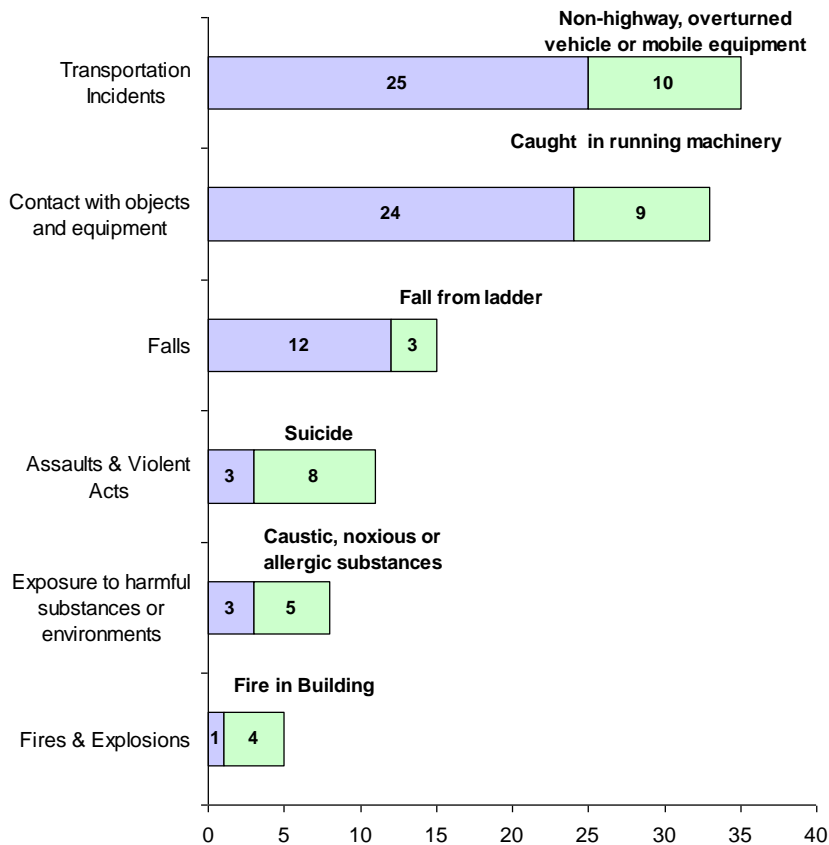

18 Year Trend

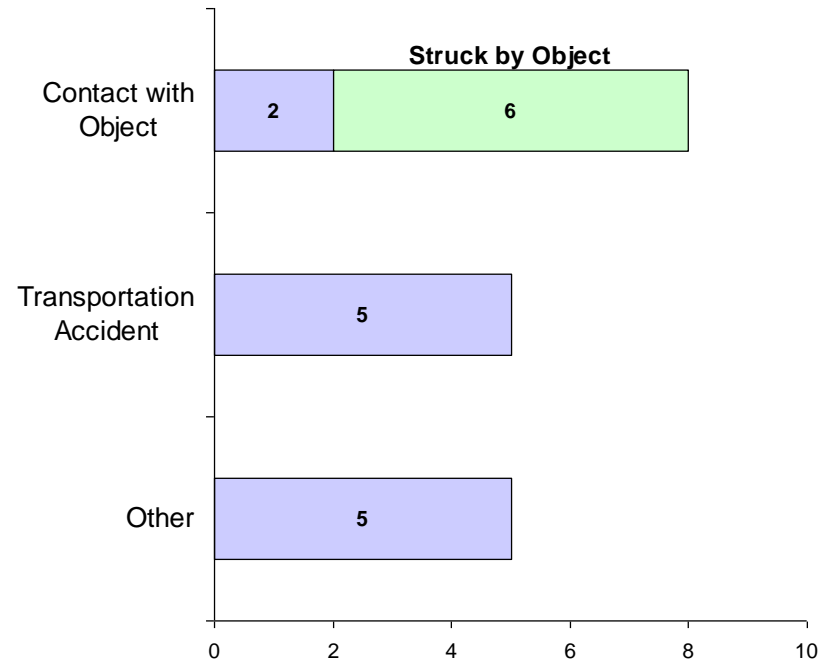


Indiana Manufacturing Occupational Fatalities Events

2003-2008

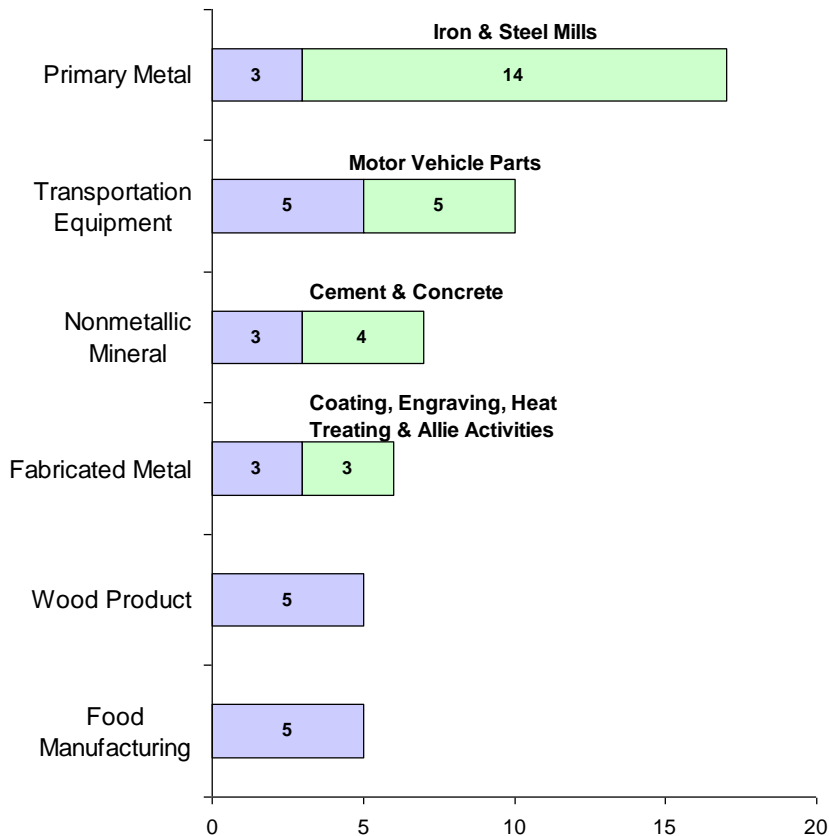

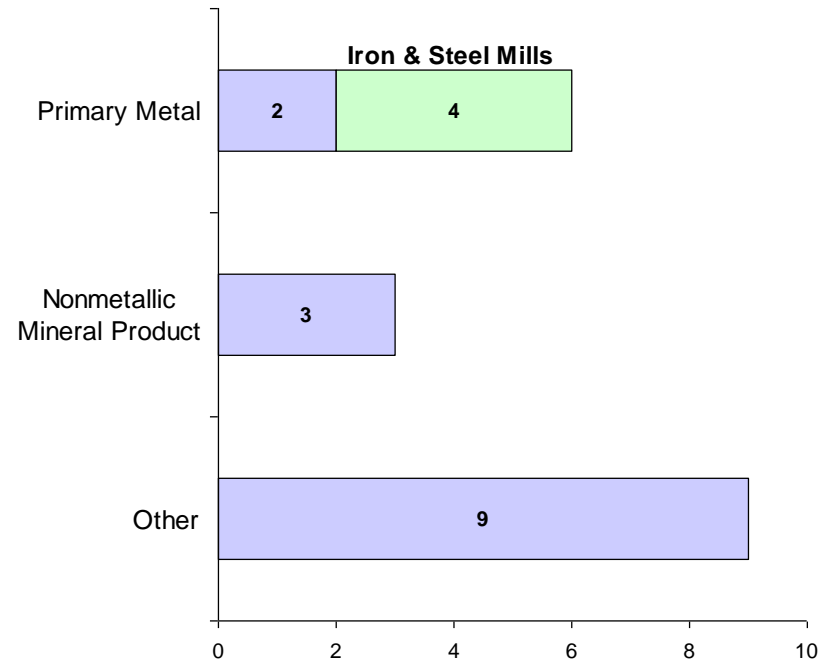


Indiana Manufacturing Occupational Fatalities Industries (with more than 3 fatalities)

2003-2008

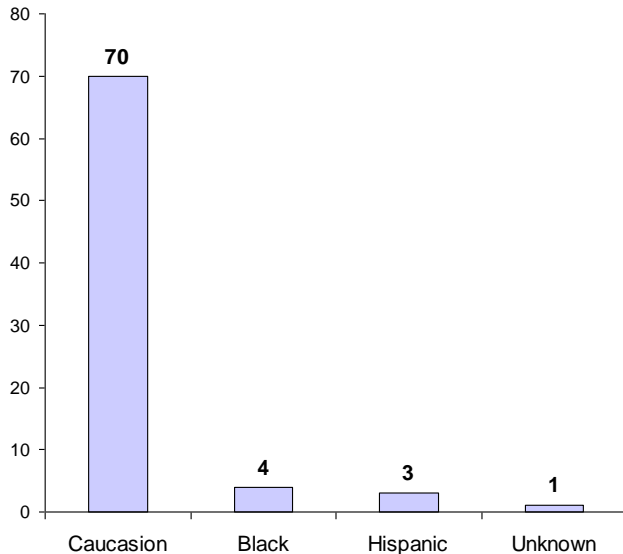

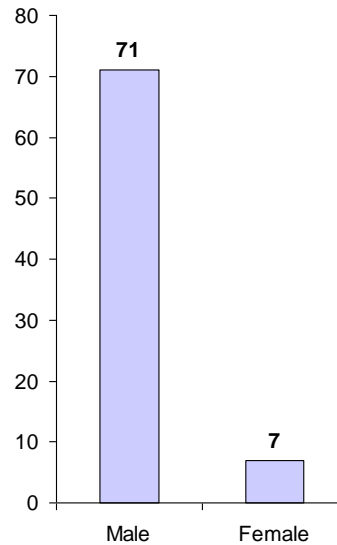


Indiana Manufacturing Occupational Fatalities Worker Characteristics (2003-2008)

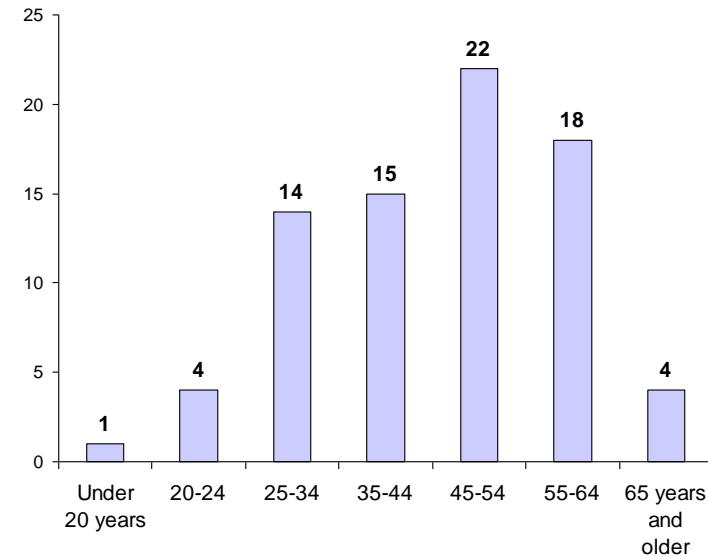
Race

Most Common Fatal Demographics

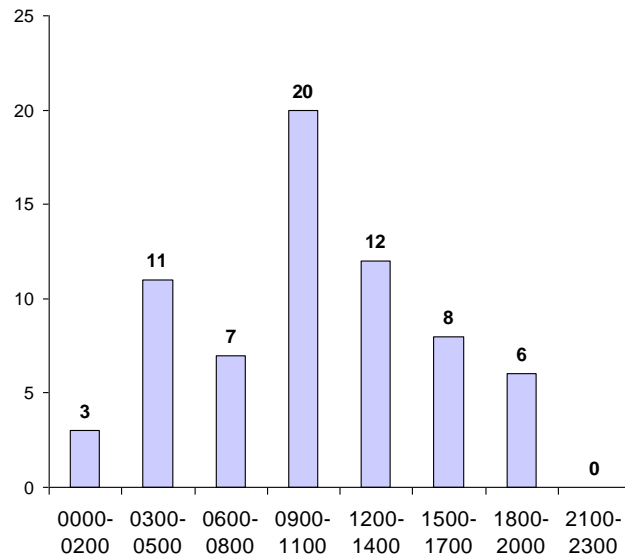

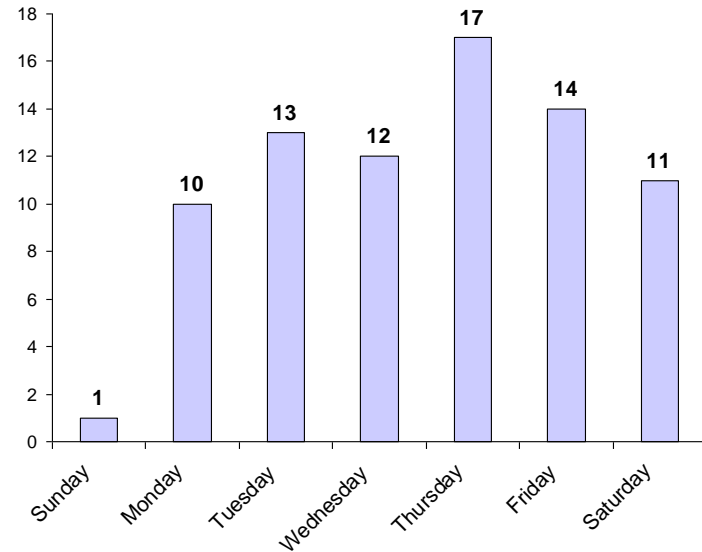

Indiana Manufacturing Occupational Fatalities

2008 OSHA Investigated

- January 12, Lake County, a 23 year old rail car operator at a steel manufacturer was crushed between an industrial train and another piece of equipment.
- January 16, Porter County, a 25 year old worker at a metal coating plant was struck by a 35,000-pound steel coil being moved by a crane.
- March 13, Wabash County, a 58 year old maintenance technician at a wool manufacturer was overcome by carbon monoxide while working in a baghouse.
- March 24, Lake County, a 55 year old furnace mechanic at a steel mill was crushed by a tundish dryer cover.
- April 25, Decatur County, 54 year old truck driver for a fabricated metal manufacturer was killed when his semi jack-knifed on a highway.
- April 30, Porter County, 60 year old millwright at a steel mill was struck by a 10,500 pound steel beam which fell after having been placed by a crane.

Indiana Manufacturing Occupational Fatalities

2008 IOSHA Investigated

- June 10, Allen County, 39 year old concrete product manufacturer worker was struck by a 750 pound lifting arm of a septic tank.
- June 12, Dubois County, a 59 year old employee from an electric sign manufacturer was electrocuted while repairing a sign at a car dealership.
- July 7, Marion County, a 45 year old truck driver for a ready-mix concrete manufacturer was crushed by a concrete hopper while cleaning the drum.
- September 8, Lagrange County, a 44 year old forklift driver for a recreational vehicle manufacturer fell 20' while unloading ladders which he had lifted to a higher level .
- October 15, St. Joseph County, a 49 year old foundry worker was struck by a piece of scrap metal.
- November 22, Wabash County, a 24 year old maintenance worker at a foundry was struck by a melt furnace when the jack slopped during repair.

Fatalities in the manufacturing industry not investigated by IOSHA includes homicides, suicides and highways vehicle accidents.
