

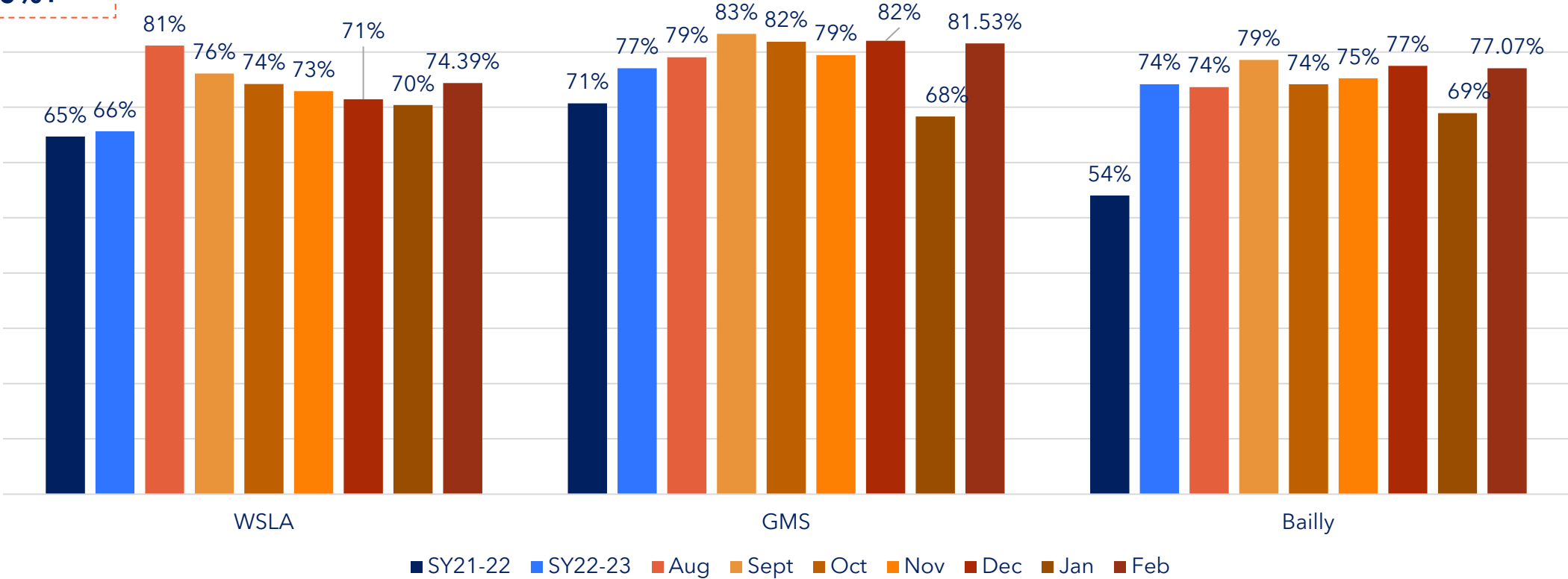

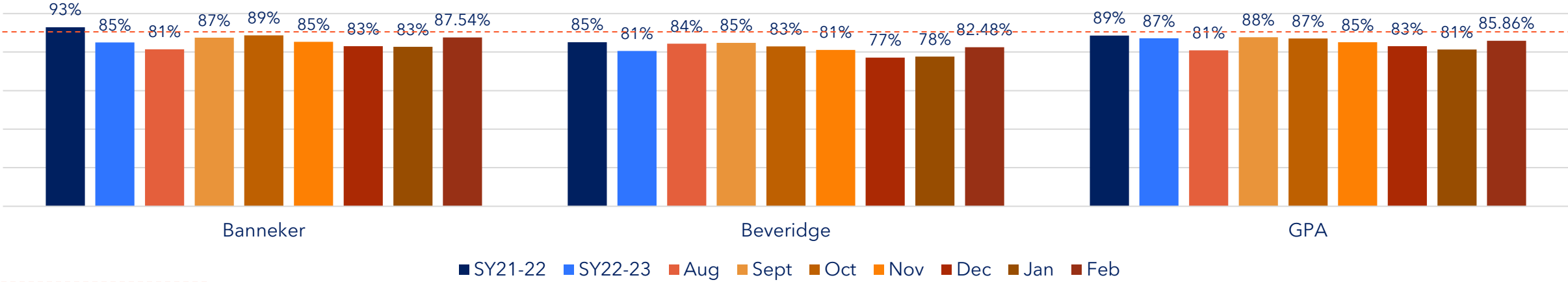
Average Daily Attendance

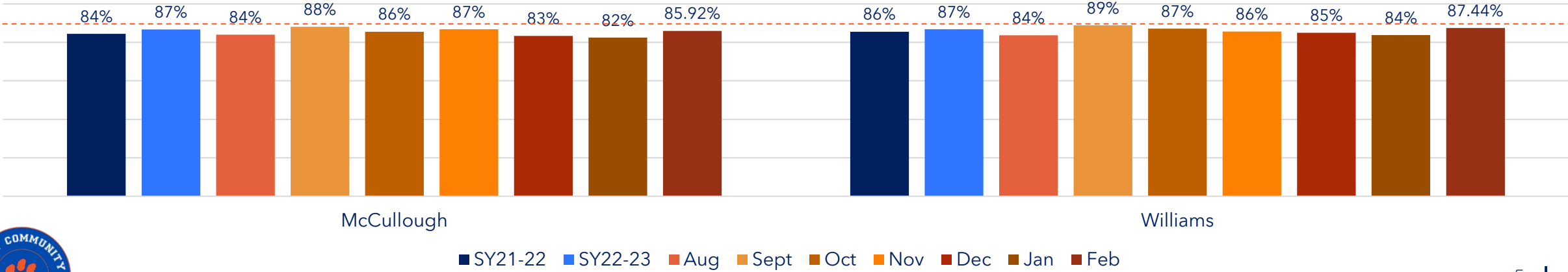
Student Attendance: Elementary

Average Daily Attendance



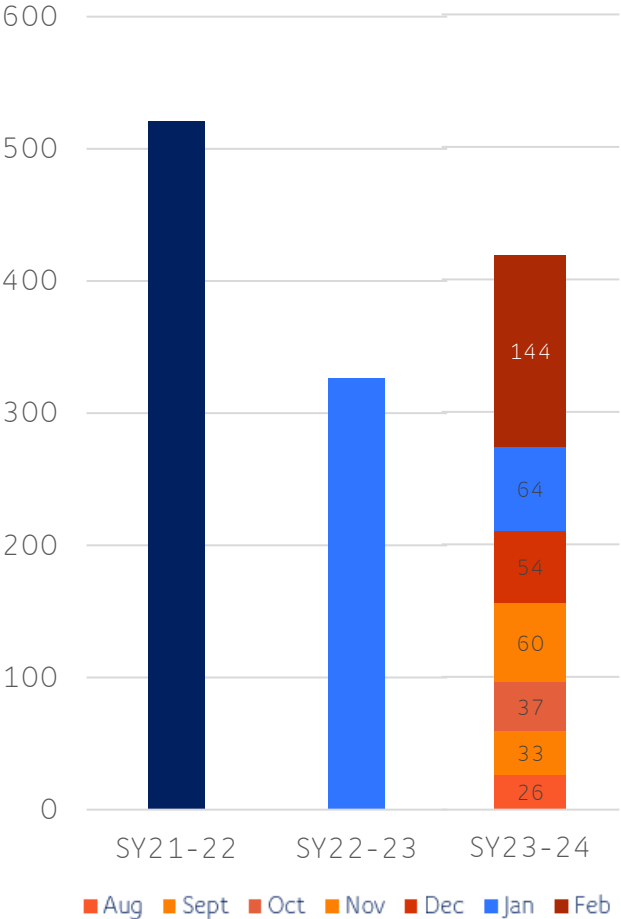

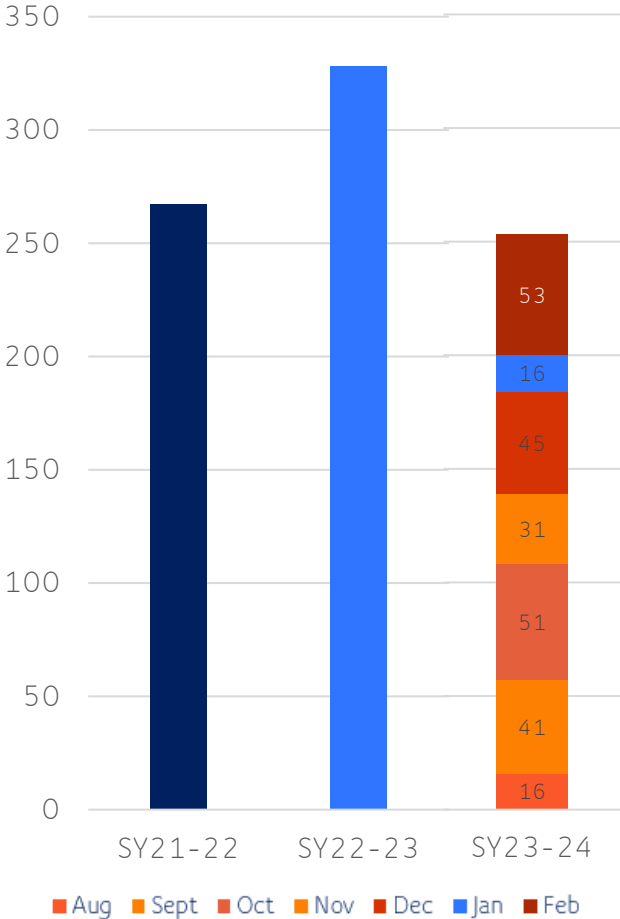

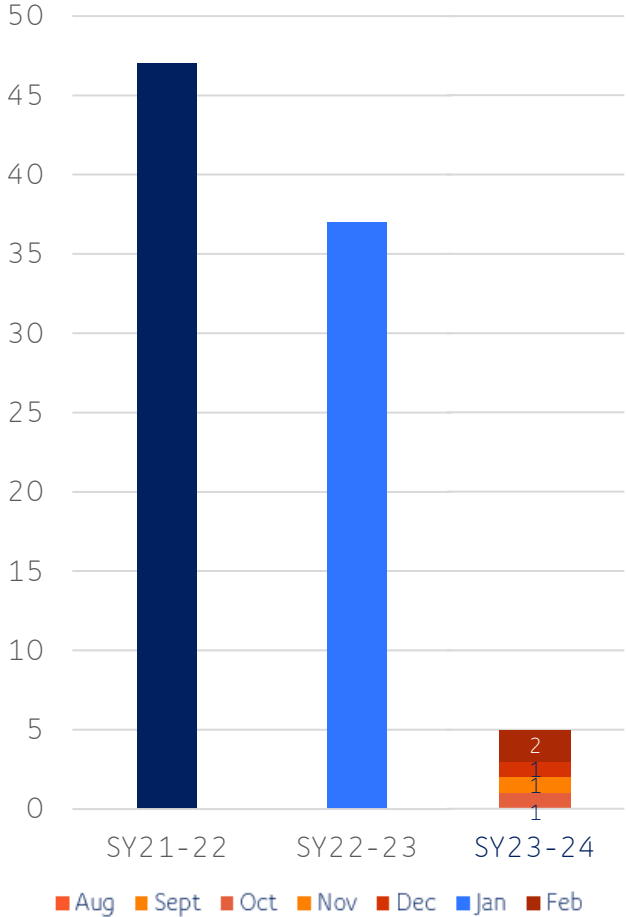

“SEL is the process through which all young people and adults acquire and apply the knowledge, skills, and attitudes to develop healthy identities, manage emotions and achieve personal and collective goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain supportive relationships, and make responsible and caring decisions.”

- In August 2023, we were awarded the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act (BSCA) grant in the amount of \$400,000 for 3 years

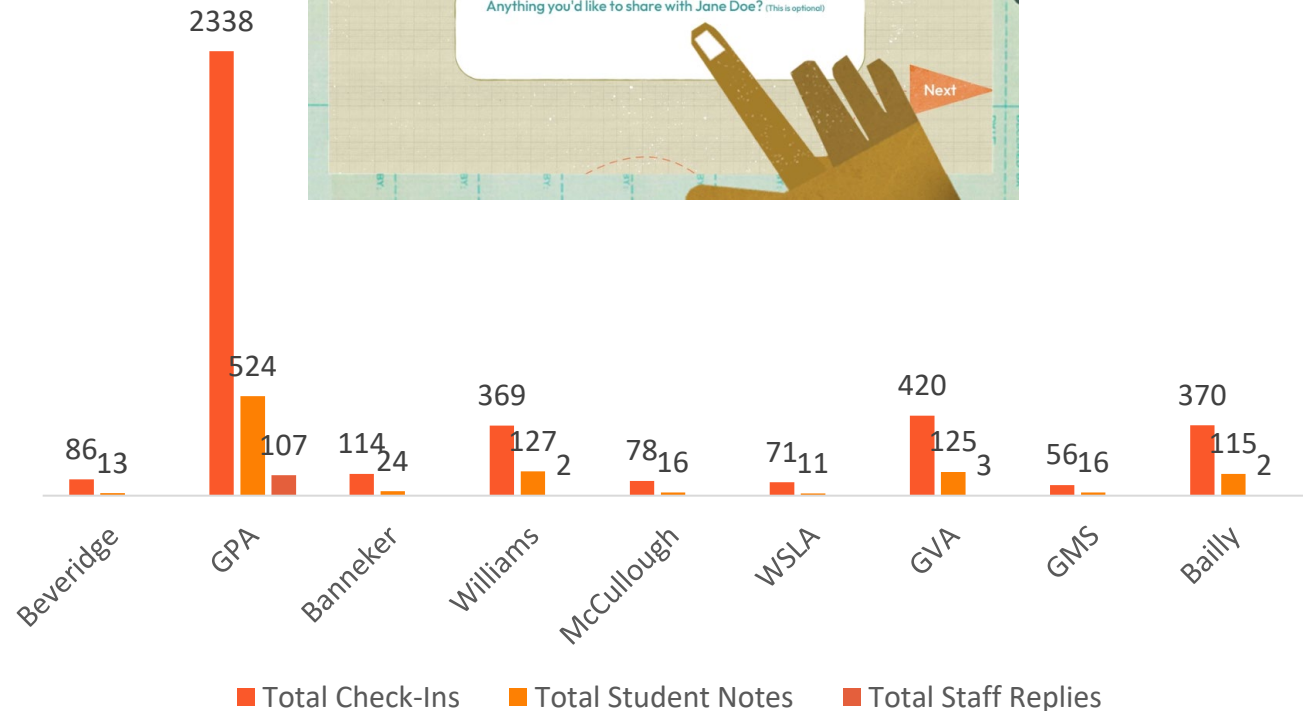
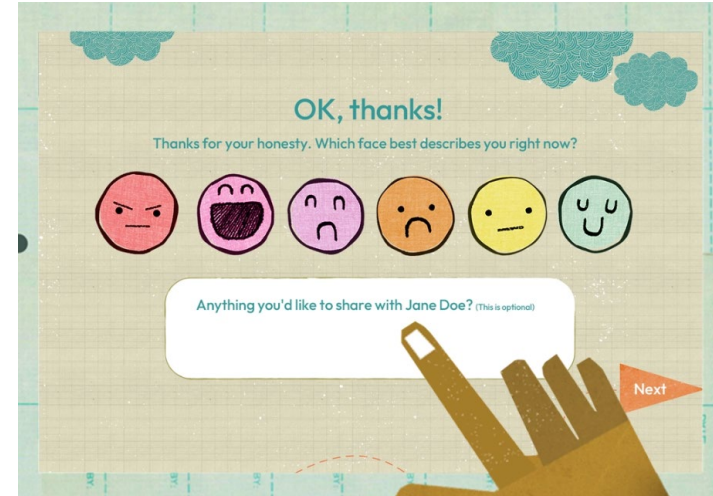
