The Indiana Department of Veterans Affairs awards grants aimed at supporting veteran services with \$1,250,000 awarded statewide through the Grants for Veterans' Services program

The grants have been awarded to 32 nonprofit organizations throughout the state, making a substantial investment in programs designed to support and serve our Indiana Veteran Community. These funds, administered through IDVA's GVS program, will support critical areas such as homelessness prevention, suicide prevention, therapeutic services, job training, job search assistance, and improved access to essential resources.

"The GVS program provides vital financial support to empower nonprofit organizations to deliver meaningful assistance to our veteran community," Adams affirmed.
