

Beyond the February 2013 Numbers...

Additional Data after Release of Indiana's Monthly Employment Report

- Indiana was 2nd in the nation in Manufacturing growth in February (3,400).
- Indiana's labor force grew by 22,000 in January and February. This is the largest two-month growth in nearly 20 years.
- Since the low point of employment in July 2009, Indiana has added 188,500 private sector jobs, an 8.1% increase, compared to the U.S. average of 5.1%.
- Top sectors with growth since July 2009, the low point of employment in Indiana:
 - 1) Manufacturing (64,400 or a 15.1% increase)
 - 2) Professional & Business Services (48,000 or a 18.8% increase)
 - 3) Trade, Transportation & Utilities (28,300 or 5.2% increase)
 - 4) Private Educational & Health Services (23,500 or a 5.6% increase)
 - 5) Leisure and Hospitality (16,700 or a 6.0% increase)
 - 6) Construction (6,300 or a 5.4% increase)
- Top sectors with growth over the past year:
 - 1) Manufacturing growth has more than tripled the national rate: 3.3% (15,900 jobs) compared to 0.9% (US).
 - 2) Trade, Transportation & Utilities has significantly outpaced the national rate: 2.7% (15,000 jobs) compared to 1.8% (US).
 - 3) Leisure and Hospitality growth nearly doubled the national rate: 3.2% (9,100 jobs) compared to 2.4% (US).
