Additional Data after Release of Indiana's Monthly Employment Report

- Indiana's unemployment rate has decreased 7.0 percentage points since July 2009 (the low point of employment), which ranks 10th in the U.S.
- Indiana's labor force has increased by 37,495 over the year and is at 3,415,523, which is a new labor force peak.
- Indiana's labor force participation rate has outperformed the national average for 58 months in a row. Indiana's rate is currently 65.3% vs. 62.8% for national.
- Indiana Private Sector jobs have grown 36,700 over the year.
