Additional Data after Release of Indiana's Monthly Employment Report

- Indiana's unemployment rate has decreased 7.2 percentage points since July 2009 (the low point of employment), which ranks 10th in the U.S.
- Indiana's labor force has increased by 1,575 over the year and is at 3,387,856.
- Indiana's labor force participation rate has outperformed the national average for 60 months in a row. Indiana's rate is currently 64.6% vs. 63.0% for national.
- Indiana Private Sector jobs have grown 27,300 over the year.
