Additional Data after Release of Indiana's Monthly Employment Report

- Indiana's unemployment rate has decreased 7.0 percentage points since July 2009 (the low point of employment), which ranks 10th in the U.S.
- Indiana's labor force has increased by 22,432 over the year and is at 3,404,857.
- Indiana's labor force participation rate has outperformed the national average for 59 months in a row. Indiana's rate is currently 65.0% vs. 62.8% for national.
- Indiana Private Sector jobs have grown 32,900 over the year.

Private Education and Health Services Growth

- **Indiana ranks 10th in the nation in Private Education and Health Services jobs added over the year.**
