Additional Data after Release of Indiana's Monthly Employment Report

- Indiana's unemployment rate has decreased 5.6 percentage points since July 2009 (the low point of employment), which ranks 5th in the U.S.
- Indiana's labor force has decreased by 48,144 over the year and is at 3,341,300.
- Indiana's labor force participation rate has outperformed the national average for seven months in a row. Indiana's rate is currently 63.1% vs. 61.7% for national.
- Indiana Private Sector jobs have decreased by 83,900 over the year.
