

# Beyond the June 2015 Numbers...

## *Additional Data after Release of Indiana's Monthly Employment Report*

---

- Indiana's unemployment rate decrease of -5.9% from July, 2009, the low point of employment, and -3.5% since January 2013 both rank 2<sup>nd</sup> in the U.S.
- The Hoosier labor force has grown by 65,973 individuals since January 2013, which leads the Midwest.
- Indiana's labor force participation rate has outperformed the national average for 21 months in a row.
- Since July 2009, Indiana has added 284,100 Private Sector jobs, which ranks 12th in the nation.
- The Hoosier State has added the 2<sup>nd</sup> most Manufacturing jobs (+93,400) in the U.S. since July 2009, at a rate that ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> in the nation (+21.8%).
- Indiana has grown the 3<sup>rd</sup> most Manufacturing jobs in the U.S. over the past year (+14,500), and is 7<sup>th</sup> in the nation in rate of growth (+2.9%).
- Indiana continues to have the highest concentration of private sector Manufacturing jobs in the U.S.
- Over the past year Indiana ranks 5<sup>th</sup> in the nation in Trade, Transportation, & Utilities growth (+21,100).
