Required IET Components Goal of 20% of Program Enrollments

Three required program components for a WIOA Title II-funded IET

- 1. Adult education and literacy activities
- 2. Workforce preparation activities
- 3. Workforce training





IET Components = Integrated Goal of 20% of Program Enrollments

- Each of the components are each of sufficient intensity and quality and <u>occurs simultaneously</u>.
- Program includes a single set of objectives that identifies specific adult education content, workforce preparation activities, and workforce training competencies and is organized to function cooperatively.
- Use occupationally relevant instructional materials.



IET = Career Pathway



Goal of 20% of Program Enrollments

Career Pathways (Sec. 3(7)) is a combination of rigorous and high-quality education, training, and other services that:

A. Aligns with skill needs of the state's or regional industries,

- B. Prepares an individual to be successful in a range of secondary or postsecondary education,
- C. Includes counseling to support an individual's education and career goals,
- D. Includes education offered concurrently and contextually with workforce preparation and training in a specific occupation or cluster,
- E. Organizes education, training and other services to meet and accelerate an individual's educational and career advancement,
- F. Enables an individual to attain a secondary school diploma or its recognized equivalent, and
- G. Helps an individual enter or advance within specific occupation or occupational cluster.



IET | Design Questions



Goal of 20% of Program Enrollments

- How does my program's IET proposal meet state and federal requirements?
- Which specific existing or emerging in-demand industry sectors or occupation is the IET aligned?
- What entry-level skills are required for eligible individuals to enter or succeed in the IET?
- How can eligible individuals who cannot meet entry-level skills requirements be prepared to transition, as appropriate to IET?
- How does the IET enable individuals to progress along a career pathway?

 Min. 40 hours, max. 14 weeks
- Certification industry-recognized
 - In-demand occupations (3 to 5 flames)







Goal of 20% of Program Enrollments

Implications – Funding Considerations

IET – Adult Education/IELCE Funds

- IET can be WorkINdiana but <u>not</u> required
- Training can be offered simultaneously with another provider
- Provider does <u>not</u> need to be INTraining
 - approved
