Certification Regarding Eligibility  
To Apply for Worker Adjustment Assistance

In accordance with Section 223 of the Trade Act of 1974, as amended ("Act"), 19 U.S.C. § 2273, the Department of Labor herein presents the results of an investigation regarding certification of eligibility to apply for worker adjustment assistance.

The group eligibility requirements for workers of a firm under Section 222(a) of the Act, 19 U.S.C. § 2272(a), are satisfied if the following criteria are met:

- (1) a significant number or proportion of the workers in such workers' firm have become totally or partially separated, or are threatened to become totally or partially separated;
- (2) (B) (i) (I) there has been a shift by the workers' firm to a foreign country in the production of articles or supply of services like or directly competitive with those produced/supplied by the workers' firm; OR
  - (II) there has been an acquisition from a foreign country by the workers' firm of articles/services that are like or directly competitive with those produced/supplied by the workers' firm; AND
- (ii) the shift/acquisition must have contributed importantly to the workers' separation or threat of separation.

The investigation was initiated in response to a petition filed on April 22, 2016 by three workers of Yellow Pages Digital & Media Solutions LLC, Print Division, a subsidiary of Yellow Pages Group Holding (USA), Indianapolis, Indiana (Yellow Pages Digital). The workers' firm is engaged in activities related to the production of digital files such as; digital and mobile business directories, and offers inventory management, web solution, optimization of media spending and lead generation services. The worker groups are separately identifiable by articles produced by the firm. The subject worker group does not include on-site leased workers.

During the course of the investigation, information was collected from the workers' firm.

Section 222(a)(1) has been met because a significant number or proportion of the workers in such workers' firm have become totally or partially separated, or are threatened to become totally or partially separated.

Section 222(a)(2)(B) has been met because the workers' firm has shifted to a foreign country the production of a(n) article like or directly competitive with the articles produced by the workers which contributed importantly to worker group separations at Yellow Pages Digital.

## Conclusion

After careful review of the facts obtained in the investigation, I determine that workers of Yellow Pages Digital & Media Solutions LLC, Print Division, a subsidiary of Yellow Pages Group Holding (USA), Indianapolis, Indiana, who are engaged in activities related to the production of digital files meet the worker group certification criteria under Section 222(a) of the Act, 19 U.S.C. § 2272(a). In accordance with Section 223 of the Act, 19 U.S.C. § 2273, I make the following certification:

"All workers of Yellow Pages Digital & Media Solutions, LLC Print Division, a subsidiary of Yellow Pages Group Holding (USA), Indianapolis, Indiana, who became totally or partially separated from employment on or after April 21, 2015, through two years from the date of certification, and all workers in the group threatened with total or partial separation from employment on the date of certification through two years from the date of certification, are eligible to apply for adjustment assistance under Chapter 2 of Title II of the Trade Act of 1974, as amended."
