     over the contents of your Board packet. You have,

     of course, the agenda for today's Board meeting.

     You have the Board minutes for January 16, 2019.
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1 You have the CliftonLarsonAllen 2 financial statement dated January 3rd, 2019. You 3 have the claims docket dated February 20, 2019, 4 that's on the agenda for approval consideration. You have two letters of 5 authorization regarding the transfer of funds. 6 7 is affiliated with the Trust and one is affiliated 8 with the non-Trust. And the backup for those two 9 transfers, you will see an e-mail from me to and from Tim Anderson regarding the 2018-year end cash 10 11 balance calculations, which are used to offset those dollars in 2019. So the difference between the 12 13 budget and the 2018 cash balance is what is 14 requested in the transfer of funds. 15 You have the EPA 2019 budget 16 concurrence letter dated February 5, 2019. You have First Merchant bank 17 18 statements for account ending in 608 and 616 for the 19 month of January 2019. You also have a statement 20 summary for the 12-month CD with First Merchants for 21 account ending in 898, and the 24-month CD with 22 First Merchants for account ending in 936. You also 23 have a 1099 from First Merchants for our interest 24 earned from our accounts in 2018.

You have the BMO Harris ECI

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Facility Trust statement and report dated January 31, 2019. Part of that documentation is the account statement for the month of January 2019 for account ending in 712. And you also have a couple 1099s from BMO for our interest earned in 2018 for the accounts held under the BMO Bank. You have a Gateway report basically showing that we submitted, the 100 R report, which is part of the State Board of Accounts requirement. And I will be meeting with Tim Anderson and Ray after the meeting today to file other State Board of Accounts online filing after the meeting today. You have an East Chicago Waterway invoice to BP and that is for the 2018 Section 10 Permit Agreement. You have a report from the Army Corps of Engineers dated February 20, 2019. You have a couple letters from the Army Corps of Engineers. One is dated July 20, 2018, regarding disposal of material into the CDF from the Great Lakes Legacy Act Project. And a second letter dated February 4, 2019, regarding LERR credits. You have Attorney Ellen Gregory's report to the Board, with the revision 5

1 date of February 14, 2019. 2 I have our premium notice for 3 our liability insurance and the affiliated summary behind it, summation of the declaration of the 4 policy. And the renewal amount is \$596.00. 5 You have a report from Parsons 6 7 dated February 7, 2019, regarding monthly bird 8 observation and monthly report number 41 for the 9 month of January 2019. 10 You have a letter from Marathon 11 dated February 14, 2019, regarding inspections of 12 their pipelines. 13 That concludes the contents of 14 your Board packet. Just to kind of go over a couple 15 updates. I have got a project meeting update 16 scheduled with Mayor Copeland next week, 17 February 28th. 18 I mentioned earlier Tim 19 Anderson, Ray Lopez, and myself will be working on 20 online filings required by State Board of Accounts. 21 User Fees, I'm working on 2019 22 User Fee packet. My goal is to transmit and get 23 them out by early March. 24 Attorney Jim Wieser is working 25 on filing a motion for Entry of Default with the 6

1 Lake County Courts against M & M Management for 2 their delinquent User Fee account. 3 Great Lakes Legacy Act Project. I'm working on the 2018 annual cost share report. 4 5 Hopefully that will be completed be next Board meeting. 6 7 And I will be talking with the 8 EPA about exactly how and under what provisions 9 we'll be able to use the CDF for sediment disposal 10 related to the Great Lakes Legacy Act Project. 11 Regarding remediation of the 12 other parts of the waterway, the Grand Cal River and 13 the Indiana Harbor ship canal. I had a couple 14 conferences with Scott Sinowski of the EPA exploring 15 options to capture cost share from the ArclerMittal 16 SEP project, which would require amending the 17 current project agreement. And I did confirm to 18 Scott that we were interested in partnering in that 19 project and capturing the cost share, which will help us remediate other areas of the waterway in 20 21 East Chicago. So I will report back more as that 22 develops. 23 Regarding the dredging project. 24 Dredging is anticipated to start in May. We also 25 anticipate a public meeting will by held right

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     around that timeframe. Attorney Ellen Gregory and I

     month. First page with numbers on it, so this is as
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of January 31st. So, page 2, not a whole lot happening, just the one month of activity. We have a December year-end. So this is really just the activity for the month of January. Interesting change from prior years, the interest in the account is quite significant these days. So good decision on moving that money to the CD. This does not include the Trust money. This is just the Operating account and the User Fee money. Beginning of the month we had 3.3 million, 3,340,000 January 1st. We wrote checks, which normally would be the extent of the activity. We actually had 12,951 interest income to offset those disbursements. So we end the month with 3,333,000 in cash.

Page 3, just shows the activity of each of the three groups of accounts. It's how I like to think of them. You have got the Operating checking account at the top, and it's only got 684,000 in it because we haven't done the Trust transfer yet which Fernando was talking about. So after we do that transfer, that account will roughly equate our unused budget for the year.

The second group is the User Fee money, which now is two different things. We have the Checking account, which has got 611,000 in it.

1 And then we have got 2,037,000 in the CDs, which is 2 that 12,000 of interest income we were talking 3 about. Page 4 is sort of the enter 4 This has got the total budget for the year, 5 which was approved, which is on the total left 6 7 column of 999,000 and we get to add our payables to 8 that. So we have our total appropriations. January 9 we paid off those payables and little bit of 2019 10 activity. And then we've got \$24,886 on claims 11 docket in front of you. So after you pay those 12 bills today, we'll have a unused budget of 971,000. 13 After we do those transfers from the Trust, that 14 will roughly equal what is in the Operating account. 15 Not roughly, it will be exactly what is in the 16 Operating account. 17 As you can see, we are where you 18 would expect in January, that we wouldn't even be 19 close on any of these amounts. Any questions? 20 (None) 21 We filed a whole bunch of 22 reports with the State Board of Accounts since we 23 last met. We are filing the annual -- the 24 District's annual report tonight. I prepared it and Ray is going to submit it. We filed this 100-R 25 10

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     report with the State, which basically certifies we

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               MR. TREVINO: Yes. Mr. Alonzo wasn't able
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to make tonight's meeting, but he did send a summary 1 2 report. 3 Page 1, highlights the historical value of the Trust since 1997, along with 4 5 the distributions each year since 1997. Page 2, the current value of the 6 7 Trust is 4,745,931 and that is as of January 31st, 8 of this year. This is an increase of \$18,660 from 9 the last meeting and the increase is due to the 10 interest on the Money Market and all the CDs paying 11 out interest in January. Next CD payments will be 12 in April and will be reflected in the May meeting 13 statements. 14 Page 3, shows the value of the 15 Money Market essential business checking account and 16 There are no CDs that will mature until June CDs. 17 and July of this year. And that concludes that 18 report. MR. FEKETE: 19 Okay. Thank you. U.S. Army 20 Corps of Engineers report. 21 MR. TREVINO: Yes. You might recall that 22 the Corps had reported that they will start 23 attending the meetings when the dredging commences, 24 so they submitted a report. A couple updates that 25 he has here. One is the Corps -- I mentioned that

1 the Corps and District agreed to extend the informal 2 negotiations to March 11th of this year. 3 The Corps sent a final determination letter on Feddeler parcel February 6, 4 5 2019. I believe that copy is in your Board packet also. 6 7 Regarding Parkway Improvement. A contractor is preparing submittal for the Corps 8 9 the entrance road surfacing contract, preparing that 10 proposal for the Corps to review and approve. The final quantity for calendar 11 12 year dredging 2018 is 162,592 cubic yards of sediment, and that's federal and non-federal 13 14 material. April water treatment is ongoing until 15 Spring. And that concludes the Army Corps report. Okay. Thank you. Next order 16 MR. FEKETE: 17 of business is the Attorney Ellen Gregory report. 18 MS. GREGORY: Ellen Gregory, with Ellen 19 Gregory Law. Three legal matters that I have been 20 working on with Fernando and he's mentioned all of them. I'll go in a little bit more detail. 21 22 First, response letter to the 23 Risk Base approval for placement of TSCA material in Approval was issued in December of 2018 24 the CDF.

and we are putting together a written response of

the Water Management District's position on placement of TSCA material in the CDF.

March 11th deadline, which is a deadline we have extended a couple of times regarding dispute with the Army Corps about placement of dredging material in the CDF. And the Corps position, they want to charge us 109 per cubic yard, even though the Mittal Tipping Fee Agreement states the cost was suppose to be \$71 per cubic yard. So the March 11th deadline basically would mark the end of the informal negotiations period. And if we don't resolve anything by then, we'll move into the formal dispute resolution period under the Tipping Fee Agreement.

Finally, Fernando mentioned the February 6, 2019, letter from Army Corps regarding the Corps position on the Feddeler parcel and in that letter the Corps states that the cost that the Water District has incurred in resolving that dispute are available for credits. So we'll be putting together a response, including Jim Wieser's attorney costs, my attorney costs and appraisal costs, and that response will be going in sometime before the deadline, which is in May of this year. That's all I have.

1 MR. FEKETE: Thank you very much. Any 2 questions for Miss Gregory? (None) 3 New Business? (None) Old Business? 4 Mr. President, I mentioned my 5 MR. BAKOTA: concern about the grating and I'd like to make a 6 7 motion -- I want public record of it -- I'd like a letter sent to the Mayor of my concerns of these 8 9 grates being put on. 10 MR. FEKETE: You're talking about the 11 grating or sewer cover? 12 MR. BAKOTA: The grating on McShane 13 Avenue, which that water comes off the street and 14 goes into the canal. They are labeled empty into 15 waterway. It's cast right into the cast iron. Indianapolis Boulevard, the sewers also I found out 16 empty into the canal. The gratings are not marked. 17 I think it's a liability for the City, if they have 18 19 a spill in that area, and people that are cleaning 20 up are not aware that it goes into the canal or into 21 our sewers. 22 So I am asking a hard letter be 23 The Mayor is part of the sent to the Mayor. 24 Sanitary District. He receives a stipend from the 25 Sanitary District. I want a letter to the Sanitary 16

1 District of our concern because of the environmental 2 effects on the canal and the lake. But I want to 3 put that in the form of a motion. MR. LOPEZ: I'll second. 4 5 MR. BAKOTA: And I'd like a copy of the letters that are sent and whatever return we get 6 7 from the parties. 8 MR. FEKETE: Okay. We have a motion and second. Any discussion? (None) Hearing none, I'll 9 10 entertain voice vote. All in favor signify by 11 saying aye? 12 (All signify aye.) 13 MR. FEKETE: Motion carries. Public 14 comments? (None) 15 I would like to make an observation. Coming over here today I came across 16 17 Columbia Avenue, coming north, and the Grand Calumet River is awfully high. It's about as high as I 18 19 think I have seen it in a long time. organization is 25 years old this year. Waterway 20 Management was started in '94. 21 22 No further comments -- the next 23 Board meeting is March 20, 2019, 5:00 p.m., at this 24 building. 25 I will entertain a motion for 17
