16	February 28, 2019. And the BMO Bank statement for
17	the month of February 2019, for account ending in
18	712.
19	You have the Army Corps of Engineers
20	report to the Board dated March 20, 2019.
21	You have some copies of several
22	correspondence. One is an e-mail to and from
23	Attorney Ellen Gregory and Attorney Jerbe from the
24	Corps regarding extending the dispute resolution
25	deadline date to April 11, 2019.

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1	You have a letter from myself to	
2	Colonel Aaron Reisinger, of the Army Corps of	
3	Engineers dated March 12, 2019, regarding the	
4	tipping fee dispute.	
5	You have two maps in your Board	
6	packet from the Army Corps of Engineers. They are	
7	both dated March 2019. One is the dredging scope	
8	and has the volume and the areas where the Army	
9	Corps is planning to dredge in 2019. And then the	
10	second map shows the historic dredging that has	
11	occurred along the waterway, including the areas and	
12	the volumes that have been dredged.	
13	You have Attorney Ellen Gregory's	
14	report to the Board, revision date of March 18,	
15	2019.	
16	You have an e-mail from myself to	
17	Allison Crane of BP, communicating comments about	
18	the sheet pile wall design.	
19	You have a letter from myself to Dr.	
20	Abdul Zehraoui, regarding the storm water sewer	
21	grates not being marked drains to waterways.	
22	You have a report from Parsons dated	
23	March 11, 2019. It's the monthly birth observation	
24	monitoring, report number 42 for the month of	
25	February 2019.	_
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1 You have a copy of our Gateway 2 report that we submitted, the annual financial 3 reporting requirement. And last but not least, you have a 4 5 flier regarding the Lake Shore Chamber luncheon, dated April 4th. Mayor Anthony Copeland is the 6 7 keynote speaker. That concludes the items in your 8 packet. 9 Just to give you an update on a 10 couple items. Board President Fekete and I met with 11 Mayor Copeland on February 28th to give him an 12 update on various ongoing district projects. 13 AR/BP reported a couple dead 14 water fowls found along the canal and the carcasses 15 were provided to the Fish and Wildlife Service for 16 their review. 17 Regarding the 2019 User fees. 18 I'm working on finalizing the communicator and the 19 invoices, and expect to send out within the next 20 couple of days, but no later than next week. I will 21 probably extend the payment due date to May 15, just 22 to give those entities more time to process their 23 payment. 24 Regarding the Great Lakes Legacy 25 Act Project. Continuing to work on the 2018 annual 6

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cost share report. As I mentioned, we provided various comments on the sheet pile wall design proposals and also had a couple meetings with AR/BP regarding the same. Regarding disposal of sediment from the Great Lakes Legacy Act Project and the CDF, the Army Corps has provided us Memorandum of Agreement for the use of the CDF. Attorney Ellen Gregory and I will be reviewing that and we'll update the Board as that issue progresses. One of the comments -- back to the sheet pile wall -- one of the comments that we'll be asking BP, if they can design a sheet pile wall to function as a dock. We are also exploring cost share strategies for remediation of other parts of the waterway. Attorney Ellen Gregory and I met with EPA last week, along with the some of the stakeholders to evaluate opportunities to leverage some of the work that's going on in 2019 into cost sharing. So we'll update the Board as that exploration progresses. The Canal Street bridge project. We plan to meet with Lake County Highway Department to see if they can help provide coordination or other resources to the clean up the remnants of what

Accounting Consultant report, Mr. Anderson.

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MR. ANDERSON: Tim Anderson, with CliftonLarsonAllen. You guys got a copy of February financial statements in your packet. I just want to run through them real quick. Still just two months in, February there's not a ton of activity, but page 2 has got the receipts and disbursements of our Operating accounts. We did the Trust transfers in February. So in our Operating account we have got cash receipts of 253,000 and we have disbursed \$44,979 through February. So our cash increased So the between the Operating account and the 208. User Fee accounts, we started with 3.3 million at the beginning of the year. Now we have got 3.5 million as of February 28th.

And then User Fee account, we have moved some to a CD. So there is a total of 2.5 million between the User Fee Operating account and the CD, as of February 28th.

On page 3, shows the activity of those accounts. There is like two groups. The Operating account, which is our checking, where we take the budget out of, 972,000. That's roughly our unspent budget as of February 28th. And then the two User Fee accounts, the checking, that's got 539

1 in it and the CD, where there is 2 million. 2 have got interest on those CDs of 12,562 through 3 February. 4 The last page is the important 5 That shows the budget that was approved 999,000, and it's printed in horrible word version. 6 7 So our total appropriation is a million 16, includes the payable from last year. So you have got our 8 9 budge at 999, add to it last year's payables, so we 10 are just over a million in total appropriations. 11 spent 44,979 through February and then you have got 12 a Claims docket in front of you with \$29,100 on it 13 to be approved. And the unused budget, the right most column, shows what we have got left in budget 14 15 after we pay today's Claims docket. So that 942 is 16 what we have got in the Operating account. 17 are not even close on anything as you would expect 18 in February 28th. So any questions? (None) That's all I have. Thank you. 19 20 MR. FEKETE: Thank you. Next order of 21 business is approval consideration for accounts 22 payable voucher, dated today's day, March 20, 2019. 23 I will entertain a motion to approve. 24 MR. 18	goes to our historical data. I've updated those	
19	charts and reflected additional use this year on the	
20	bottom.	
21	The second page, value of the	
22	Trust as of February 28th was \$4,505,946, which was	
23	a difference from the last meeting of negative	
24	\$239,985. And of course, that's primarily due to	
25	the withdrawal, which is seen on the next column,	

1 2019 distribution check deposit \$3,240,038. 2 then we see the total distribution since 1997. 3 Last page goes through the 4 balances, as we can see in green the prime money 5 market is down 240,000. It shows the debit coming out of there. Typically we like to keep it around 6 7 that 500,000 marker. I know we carried a little bit higher balance in there this year or the last year, 8 9 but we'll have two CDs coming due, one July 25th of 10 this year, and one in June 30th of this year. 11 couple months, or month or two before we want to sit 12 down and take a look what rates are and look at 13 terms out there. We did earn a tiny bit of 14 interest, only because of the Money Market, which is 15 the different of the \$240,000 to the 239,000. 16 beyond that, is there any questions at all? 17 Great improvement. Actually the 18 rate environment hasn't really changed a whole lot, 19 although we have seen CD rates stay the same, but the terms go further out. They are a little bit 20 21 better. There was no interest paid. The next 22 interest payment on this at the end of April, which 23 will forward into May. 24 MR. FEKETE: Thank you very much. 25 report out is the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers 12

1 report, which we have in our packet. Fernando can 2 hit the highlights on that. 3 MR. TREVINO: Sure. So if you look at the write up, it covers some of the things that I had 4 mentioned. Under number 3-A, PCA revision. 5 mentioned the Corps has received my letter dated 6 7 March 12th regarding the tipping fee dispute. And 8 the second item under 3-A talks about the MOA, 9 Memorandum of Agreement that they sent us regarding 10 using the CDF for the Great Lakes Legacy Act 11 Project. 12 And then number 4, the 13 contractor is preparing submittal for the Corps to 14 review and approve for the parkway improvement and 15 the entrance road resurfacing. And the dredging is 16 anticipated to start in late spring, early summer. 17 Any questions? 18 MR. FEKETE: Hearing none -- thank you. 19 Now we come to Attorney Ellen Gregory's report. 20 MS. GREGORY: Ellen Gregory, with Ellen 21 Gregory Law. As Fernando mentioned we have a couple of ongoing legal matters. Mostly I am providing 22 23 legal support for the Great Lakes Legacy Act 24 Project, primarily in relation to the use of the CDF for sediment dredging during that Great Lakes Legacy 25

1 Project and also looking into the possibility of 2 using Arcelor SEP monies as local match for future 3 Great Lakes Legacy work. Granted the Corps extension to 4 5 April 11th regarding the dispute resolution provision of the Mittal tipping fee agreement. 6 7 Corps was suppose to have met internally, I believe 8 it was on Monday. So we expect to have an answer 9 from them on that shortly. And finally on the Feddeler 10 matter, the Corps had issued a final letter several 11 12 months ago stating that we could use -- we could 13 count the costs that we incurred dealing with the Feddeler claim as local match. So we'll be putting 14 15 together our cost information on that and submitting 16 it to the Corps by the deadline that they have given 17 us, in May of 2019. And that's all I have. 18 Any questions? (None) MR. FEKETE: Thank 19 you very much. 20 Any new business to come before 21 the Board? (None) 22 Any other business? Did you 23 want to mention the Chamber of Commerce. 24 MR. TREVINO: Yes. So I had mentioned 25 earlier there was a flier regarding Mayor Copeland 14
