20	with FMT Consulting. I would like to start
21	off by going over the contents of your board
22	packet.
23	You have the board agenda for today's
24	meeting.
25	You have the public meeting posting 4

1	for today's meeting.
2	You have the board minutes for
3	December 15th, 2021.
4	You have a copy of the 2022 trust
5	budget approval letter from IDEM dated
6	January 4th of this year. And a 2022 trust
7	budget concurrence letter from EPA dated
8	December 21st of 2021.
9	You have First Merchants Bank
10	statement for the month of December of 2021,
11	for accounts ending is 608 and 616. Along
12	with the copy of the checks that cleared in
13	December. We also have First Merchant
14	Bank's CD for the twenty-one month CD with
15	a report run date of January 17th, 2022.
16	You have the BMO trust reports dated
17	December 31st, 2021.
18	You have a copy of the Army Corps
19	report to the board with the date of
20	January 19th, 2022.
21	Attorney Ellen Gregory's report to
22	the board with also a date of January 19th.
23	You have an email from myself to the
24	Army Corps of Engineer's Project Manager,
25	Mike Nguyen, dated January 6th thanking
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him and his team for their work on the PCA 1 2 Amendment. 3 You have a copy of the fully executed 4 PCA Amendment. 5 You have a copy of an email from EPA dated January 13th that summarizes the 6 7 forecast schedule for the Grand Cal River 8 Junction Reaches proposal and it goes 9 through the schedule of a signed project 10 agreement. 11 You have Tetra Tech's monthly Great 12 Lakes Legacy Act remedial design for the 13 Grand Cal River Project report dated 14 January 14th. 15 You have a copy of three Tetra Tech 16 letters all dated January 17th to the city 17 departments related to access needs for the 18 Grand Cal River Project. 19 You have the EPA letter dated 20 January 11th which accepts BP's pipeline 21 removal report for the west tank farm. 22 You have a Public Notice. A copy 23 of a Public Notice dated December 21st for a Section 408 permit for the Canal 24 25 Street Bridge dolphin installation. 6

1	COURT STENOGRAPHER: I'm sorry, for
2	the
3	MR. TREVINO: For the Canal Street
4	Bridge dolphin installation.
5	COURT STENOGRAPHER: Thank you.
6	MR. TREVINO: You have a copy of the
7	BP's slide presentation for today's board
8	meeting along with their Public Notice for
9	that project also dated December 21st, 2021.
10	You have an email dated January 18th
11	from INDOT to me responding to comments
12	related to the change in bridge operation.
13	And I also included a copy of our
14	October 5th, 2021, letter to the corps
15	regarding the same topic.
16	You have a copy of the renewed
17	INDOT permit affiliated with BP's boom
18	management.
19	And you have the 2022, board
20	orientation summary that I used when
21	I met with our new board member,
22	Jaylan Robinson.
23	So that includes the top the
24	items in your board packet.
25	My report is Well, before I

1 start my report I would like to welcome 2 our new board member Jaylan Robinson. 3 Mr. Robinson is from East Chicago. Graduated from East Chicago Central. And 4 5 I met with him last week and we spent some time reviewing the contents of the 6 7 board orientation that I put together. 8 So welcome, Jaylan, I am looking 9 forward to working with you. 10 We have several approval items on today's agenda. We have two of the 11 12 traditional approval items, the board 13 minutes and the claim docket. 14 We also have election of officers for this month -- on this agenda for 15 16 calendar year 2022. 17 We also have a presentation on 18 today's agenda related to the BP 19 pipeline project that's being installed 20 under the Indiana Harbor ship canal. The board might recall that we 21 22 have asked companies doing work along 23 the waterway to make a presentation at 24 our public board meeting to give the 25 board and stakeholders an opportunity

1 to be made aware of the project schedule 2 and activities that are along the waterway. 3 So I want to thank BP and their 4 consultant, Parsons, for agreeing to 5 provide a presentation of their project today. And I had mentioned this at the 6 7 December board meeting, as well. 8 Regarding finances, we received 9 2022 trust budget approval letters from both EPA and IDEM. I mentioned those 10 11 were in your board packet. So at the 12 February board meeting I plan to put 13 together the budget transfers request for -- to finance the 2022 budget and it 14 15 will basically deduct the 2021 cash 16 balances from the budget. And, as always, 17 I will make sure that our accounting 18 consultant, Mr. Tim Anderson, reviews 19 and concurs with my calculations when 20 we request the transfers. 21 We also have a BMO CD expiring 22 at the end of this month. Mr. Alonzo 23 will be giving a summary of the expiring 24 CD and the recommendation with the expiring 25 funds. 9

Regarding user fees, the board 1 2 approved a new user fee at the December 3 board meeting. So I am going to start working on the 2022 user fee invoicing 4 5 process. Ellen and I will be reviewing the 6 7 current board resolutions related to the 8 user fees. And after our review we may 9 propose modifications to those resolutions 10 and probably -- we are hoping to have that 11 ready at the February board meeting. 12 Regarding the PCA Amendment. 13 After several years of negotiating with 14 the corps on the amendment we finally 15 reached an agreement on the final PCA. 16 The board approved the PCA Amendment at 17 the December board meeting. We forwarded 18 a signed agreement to the corps and on 19 January 5th we received a copy of the 20 corps' counter signature. So we now have 21 a fully executed approved PCA Amendment and 22 a copy of that is -- of the approved PCA 23 Amendment is in your board packet. 24 PCA Amendment cleared up various 25 uncertainties resulting in several millions 10

1 of dollars of potential liability on the district's behalf. This amended PCA brings 2 3 clarity to our financial obligations and 4 clarifying our PCA financial obligations 5 also --6 COURT STENOGRAPHER: I'm sorry, and 7 clarifying our PCA financial obligations 8 also --MR. TREVINO: -- PCA financial 9 10 obligations also allows us to effectively 11 bank as cost share, millions of dollars related to the Cleveland Cliffs SEP 12 13 dredging. S-E-P, SEP. 14 COURT STENOGRAPHER: And Clift, 15 C-1-i-f-t? 16 MR. TREVINO: C-l-i-f-f-s. 17 COURT STENOGRAPHER: All right. 18 I am going to need your notes. 19 MR. TREVINO: I will give them to 20 you. 21 And we will be able to bank the 22 cost share towards Great Lakes Legacy Act 23 Project to help finance future remediation 24 work planned in the Grand Cal River. 25 I want to thank Todd Relue and his 11

1	law firm, Attorney Ellen Gregory, the
2	District Board of Directors and, of course,
3	the Army Corps of Engineers for all their
4	efforts and support in getting this PCA
5	finalized and approved. I think it's a
6	significant accomplishment.
7	And we continue to explore the
8	scheduling of a signing ceremony for the
9	PCA Amendment.
10	The next step on all of this is
11	to work with Cleveland Cliffs on the
12	tipping fee agreement amendment. And
13	we have a meeting coming up with Cleveland
14	Cliffs on that and I will let Ellen
15	Attorney Ellen Gregory elaborate on that.
16	Regarding the Great Lake Legacy Act
17	Project, the ninety percent design is
18	ongoing. BP presented their ninety
19	percent design on the sheet pile wall
20	to the project team. Or the ninety
21	percent design has been transmitted
22	to the project team for review on
23	December 17th. And the team has a
24	follow-up meeting to discuss any
25	questions and comments we might have

1	at a meeting scheduled for tomorrow.
2	The sheet pile wall construction is
3	scheduled to be installed by the end of
4	2023.
5	Regarding the Lake George Canal
6	East section, as a reminder that
7	Phase I dredging was completed in 2020.
8	Phase II isn't scheduled to recommence
9	until the sheet pile wall project is
10	completed after 2023.
11	The Lake George Canal middle cap
12	project. The project construction of the
13	cap has been awarded to Brennan. The
14	project team started reviewing the
15	contractor's preconstruction submittals
16	and mobilization is expected to start in
17	the first quarter of this year.
18	BP's pipeline removal project has
19	been completed. And EPA has provided an
20	acceptance letter of BP's report.
21	And as I mentioned a copy of that
22	report is in your packet.
23	Regarding the Grand Cal River Junction
24	Reaches Remedial Design. Tetra Tech's
25	design work continues. We are expecting

1	to have the remedial design completed for	
2	the Phase I remediation work by tomorrow,	
3	as well as cost data.	
4	Some of the work that continues is	
5	just assessing the impact of the wetlands.	
6	We also continue to work on access	
7	needs and agreements.	
8	And Jim Westcott project manager	
9	for Tetra Tech is in attendance today	
10	and will provide a brief update on the	
11	project.	
12	Our current plan is to submit a	
13	project proposal to EPA through the Great	
14	Lakes Legacy Act for Phase I remediation.	
15	So we are hoping to have that	
16	project proposal completed and have that	
17	provided to the board at the February	
18	board meeting.	
19	And the project team continues	
20	to review the cost share calculations	
21	affiliated with the PCA and the continuing	
22	fee amendments. And we anticipate	
23	continuing to work on that as the	
24	project progresses. And the calculations	
25	The good thing is we have completed the PCA	1 4
		14

Amendment so we know the finances affiliated 1 2 with that. And the next step is to work on 3 the tipping fee agreement amendment with 4 Cleveland Cliffs. So depending on how that's concluded will -- you know, will 5 6 basically impact our cost share 7 calculations. 8 Canal Street Bridge Project. The 9 design of two dolphins is ongoing. design firm, AECOM, is -- continues to work 10 11 on the design and permitting. As I 12 mentioned, you have a copy of the 30-day 13 public comment period associated with the 14 408 permit application. 15 Regarding the BP turn sheet agreement 16 for parcels. BP is interested in acquiring 17 so the board might recall that an update to 18 the letter agreement with BP was approved 19 by the board at the December board meeting. 20 We recently received the BP's counter-21 signature on the letter so we have a fully-22 executed updated letter agreement. 23 letter basically includes reimbursement 24 district costs into 2022. The first letter 25 of agreement concluded at 2021.

1	The Army Corps' board report is in
2	your packet. Corps project manager, Mike
3	Nguyen, is in attendance and will be giving
4	an update on behalf of the corps.
5	The INDOT permit related to attaching
6	the booms to the Indy Boulevard Bridge has
7	been updated. A copy of the updated permit
8	is in your packet.
9	And Attorney Ellen Gregory will be
10	providing an update on various legal
11	matters.
12	And that concludes my report.
13	MR. FEKETE: Any questions for
14	Mr. Trevino?
15	MR. RODRIGUEZ: No, sir.
16	MR. FEKETE: Before we move on I
17	would like to make mention of the fact
18	that we just received word today that
19	former or board member Ted Zagar has
20	passed away. And, you know, we always
21	appreciated his candor when he was
22	available. And it's sad to hear about
23	his passing.
24	The next order of business is the
25	election of the officers. The current

officers are, president, John Fekete, 1 2 vice-president, Kevin Doyle, secretary, 3 Henry Rodriguez, treasurer and the fiscal officer is Ray Lopez, and the investing 4 officer is John Fekete. 5 MR. DOYLE: I would like to make a 6 7 motion to keep the board as it currently 8 is. 9 MR. FEKETE: Okay. Do we have a motion? 10 11 MR. RODRIGUEZ: I second. 12 MR. FEKETE: We have a second. 13 All in favor signify by saying aye. 14 ALL: Aye. 15 Okay. Current board MR. FEKETE: 16 members are remaining in position. 17 At this point in time then I can 18 appoint the finance committee members and 19 chairperson. The current membership is 20 John Fekete, Kevin Doyle, and Ray Lopez. 21 MR. TREVINO: With you as the chair. 22 MR. FEKETE: And John Fekete as the 23 chair. 24 MR. TREVINO: Yeah. 25 MR. 6	financial statements as of December 31st.
7	It was the last month-end close. And it
8	is the end of the year for the organization.
9	So if you go down to page two this is
10	our statement of cash receipts and cash
11	disbursements. The receipts for 2021 we
12	have got
13	MR. TREVINO: You know what, Tim

16	because there was some issues with the
17	report, so it didn't go into the packet.

1 I was hoping I could hand off that baton. 2 Maybe I can jump in while we are waiting on 3 that report. 4 MR. FEKETE: Yeah. Okav. David. 5 MR. ALONZO: Okay. This is David Alonzo with BMO Harris Bank. I will go 6 7 through the trust report that should be 8 in the packet. We will talk about the CD 9 that is coming due and the recommendation. So in general, you know, the four 10 11 packet the first page of the report just 12 goes to our historical record distribution 13 since account inception. The --14 On page two the value of the trust 15 as of December 31st was \$4,526,074.96. 16 There was a positive gain of \$898.91 from 17 our last meeting. And then for the entire 18 year total distributions from the trust 19 were two million -- I'm sorry, \$250,013. 20 Again, that's \$250,013.00 for a total 21 distribution from the trust. 22 On the third page this goes through 23 the balances of each account. As of 24 December 31st the value that's sitting in 25 cash in the money market is \$3,323,002.08.

1 We had one CD that will be coming due at 2 the end of this month. The value as of 3 December 31st of the CD was \$1,202,172.88. With that CD coming due a few things. 4 The interest rate environment has not moved 5 a whole lot. A 13-month CD right now is 6 7 The bank had come out with a couple 8 intermediate duration CDs at twenty-five 9 months --10 I'm sorry, with a COURT STENOGRAPHER: 11 couple --12 MR. ALONZO: -- percent --13 COURT STENOGRAPHER: I'm sorry, with 14 a couple --15 I'm sorry. The bank had MR. ALONZO: 16 come out with a couple of CD new rates that 17 have come out for certificate of deposit. 18 The interest rate for twenty-five months 19 is .25. And then the interest rate for 20 thirty-five months is .5. With all the news 21 that we have heard about inflation and the 22 Fed looking to try to get a grasp on it we 23 have historical high rate -- readings on 24 inflation. We do anticipate the Fed 25 looking to make some changes here

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     throughout the year which would likely be
 2
     rate hikes more than likely within the
 3
     first half of the year potentially into
     this quarter. So with this CD that's
 4
     coming due I feel that if we -- when the
 5
     CD matures we -- my recommendation would
 6

     be that we add it to the money market,
 8

two. This money that's reported here is not the same money that Dave Alonzo just talked about.

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These two accounts, or this money, I should say, this is the user fee money in our operating accounts. We are trying to get a statement that would also have David's information on it so that we can show, you know, the total money that's, you know, on deposit with the waterway, but this is where we are at right now. David reports on the \$4,526,000.00 that's sitting at BMO. this report that you have in your hands reports on the roughly \$4,000,000.00 that's sitting in the operating and the user fee group. So we are going to try for 2022 to get those things consolidated together. this report that you have is just on our operating and the user fee. So the receipts of just those two accounts for the year you can see the transfer and the \$250,000.00 at the top. That money came from the money at BMO. The user fees did Those user fees came from users. And the interest income is the interest

1	that we earn on the user fee account and	
2	the operating account. So the total of	
3	those three items is \$617,000. You can	
4	see our list of disbursements there that's	
5	in the middle of the page we spent	
6	\$536,000.00 during the year 2021 on all	
7	those items that you see delineated there.	
8	The increase in cash so we show the balance	
9	of the cash in those three accounts, or,	
10	you know, the user fee and the operating,	
11	the balance was \$3,911,000.00 at the	
12	beginning of 2021. And it's it increased	
13	\$81,000.00 for the year. Our cash receipts	
14	were greater than our cash disbursements by	
15	\$81,000.	
16	And at the bottom of the page two you	
17	can see how it's how that cash fell at	
18	December 31st. The operating account had a	
19	million four in it and the user fee account	
20	had one million seventy-six. Those are both	
21	checking accounts.	
22	And the certificate of deposit that's	
23	part of the user fee money was 1.5.	
24	The following page, number three,	
25	shows how that all happened within those	0.7
		27

1 It starts with the three accounts. 2 beginning cash balance, shows the money 3 coming in, the money going out, and the ending balance at December 31st. And it's 4 5 those same three accounts that you saw on It just shows the actual goings 6 page two. 7 on of each of those accounts on that 8 schedule. 9 Page four shows the 2021 budget, 10 what's available, and it gets a little 11 tricky in December because we were writing 12 checks for both years budgets. That's why 13 you have a page four and a page five is some 14 of the money on your claims docket today is for a bill for 2022, but most of the bills 15 16 that you have on your claims docket today 17 are actually for 2021. So -- But it's 18 important that you guys know that you have 19 unused budget to cover everything on your claims docket. So that first page, page 20 21 four, shows the 50,000 that's on your claims 22 docket that goes against the 2021 budget, 23 and if you look at the right-most column 24 you can see -- You can see, you can't have 25 a negative number over there because that

1 means that you spent more than your budget. 2 As you can see in that right-most column you 3 have plenty of budget left for every item on that claims docket. 4 5 And then the last page shows we paid one payment of \$1,050.00 that's in 6 7 your claims docket for today, but that's 8 not against the '21 budget, that's against 9 the '22 budget. So here is your '22 budget 10 and the unused amount over in the right-hand 11 column that's for '22. So we wanted you 12 to see that you have budget unused for '21 13 and '22 for all the claims on the docket 14 today. And you do. 15 Any questions? 16 That's my report. 17 Mr. Chairman. 18 MR. 5	through the slides.
6	Slide one was about the project
7	description. And the BP River Roug line
8	is a 12-inch pipeline which transports
9	gasoline and diesel fuel from the BP Whiting
10	refinery to the River Roug terminal, which
11	is on the outskirts of Detroit in Michigan
12	and approximately a mile from the origin
13	station in Whiting and the line crosses the
14	Indiana Harbor Canal. We see the Whiting
15	refinery being on the northwest side of the
16	canal and the American Terminal on the
17	southeast side of the canal.
18	We use cathodic protection
19	COURT STENOGRAPHER: I'm sorry, we
20	use.
21	MR. TREVINO: Cathodic
22	COURT STENOGRAPHER: Thank you.
23	MR. RUTHERFORD: Cathodic protection,
24	sometimes just called CP. We use that on
25	all of our pipelines to protect the steel

1 pipe from corroding. 2 In the case of the line under the canal we have identified issues with the 3 cathodic protection whereby the impressed 4 5 current which is supposed to be on the pipe has been shorted out, we think by 6 7 the metal bulkhead of the canal wall, 8 resulting in our pipe -- in our pipes not 9 having adequate protection and leaving us exposed to potential corrosion effects in 10 11 the future. 12 (Mr. Ray Lopez has just entered the 13 meeting.) 14 MR. RUTHERFORD: We have also run 15 inspection tools through the pipeline to 16 meet DOT requirements and our integrity 17 management requirements. And our most 18 recent to run -- our most recent to run 19 identified an anomaly under the bank of 20 the canal. So our approach to resolving 21 the CP issue and this anomaly will be to 22 perform a horizontal directional drill, 23 or I will just abbreviate that as HDD, 24 to replace all the pipe under the canal. Just a little bit of details about 25

1	the HDD. There is approximately 2,000
2	feet of pipe to be replaced. 1,700 feet
3	will be installed by the HDD methods and
4	the remaining 300 feet will be more by
5	conventional pipe lay techniques to allow
6	the pipe to be tied into existing line on
7	either side of the canal. All the new pipe
8	will be installed within our permanent pipe
9	line easement on the American Terminal side.
10	The HDD entry point will be on the American
11	Terminal side and the exit point on the
12	Whiting refinery side. There is going to
13	be no excavation work actually, no
14	excavation work in the canal and the line
15	will end up approximately 40 feet beneath
16	the canal bed. And also to protect I
17	mean, to protect our new line the pipe will
18	be coated and
19	has a fusion bonded epoxy coat
20	COURT STENOGRAPHER: I'm sorry, it
21	will be coated and has
22	MR. RUTHERFORD: Yes, it has a fusion
23	bonded epoxy coat.
24	COURT STENOGRAPHER: Thank you.
25	MR. RUTHERFORD: And in addition
	42

to that it has an abrasive or abrasion resistant overlay which is an epoxy-based concrete to protect it when it gets pulled through the bulk hole.

And in addition to the pipe on the -on the -- we will have a new gate valve on
the refinery side and a new check valve on
the American Terminal side which is standard
practice when crossing bodies of water as
a means to isolate the pipeline if ever an
issue were to occur.

Just where we are with the project we are currently in the process of finalizing the design and the scope of work document for the job to bid it out to a number of HDD contractors with the goal that we will start work around April of 2022. And the work is expected to take about four months.

And on the next slide it just shows the routing of the new line. So it shows the routing of the new line with the BP refinery property on the left-hand side and the American Terminal on the right-hand side. And the new line essentially follows

1	the route of the old. Fairly closely on
2	the American Terminal side to stay within
3	our permanent easement of 50-foot permanent
4	easement. And then it diverges away
5	slightly from the existing line to the
6	refinery side in order to give us space
7	for construction on that side of the
8	property. And really all the equipment
9	for the HDD will be located on American
10	Terminal's property and all the stringing
11	of new pipe, welding operations, hydro
12	testing of the new pipe will take place
13	from the refinery side. And the HDD
14	operation will start with a drill a
15	pilot hole a four-inch pilot hole
16	and then there will be several reaming
17	operations to enlarge the hole to allow
18	the new pipe to be pulled through. And
19	then for tie-ins to the existing line.
20	The existing line under the canal will
21	be purged to insure that there is no
22	product remaining in the line. We will
23	cut the line on either side and we will
24	swab the line and then we will fill the
25	line with grout and cap cap it off.
