3	Pleasure to be here. And we're going to open the East		
4	Chicago Waterways Management District, Board Meeting.		
5	And let's call the order. Let's have a roll call.		
6	John Fekete?		
7	MR. FEKETE: Here.		
8	MR. DOYLE: Kevin Doyle. He's here. Randy		
9	Lopez?

17	MR. DOYLE: Our first order of business, the		
18	Executive Director's Report, Fernando.		
19	MR. TREVINO: Fernando Trevino for FMT		
20	Consulting. First, I would like to start off by going		
21	over the contents of your board packet. You have a		
22	copy of today's meeting agenda. You have the public		
23	meeting posting for today's meeting. You have the		
24	Board Minutes for last months Board Meeting which was

2	You have First Merchant Bank statements			
3	for the month of February of 2022 for accounts ending			
4	in 608, 616, along with a copy of the checks that			
5	cleared last month.			
6	You also have First Merchant's Bank CD			
7	statement for the 21-month CD that we have with a run			
8	date of March 14, 2022.			
9	You have the BMO Trust reports through			
10	February 28, 2022. And there is a typo on one of the			
11	reports that says, "Month ending 1/31/2022 and it			
12	should be 2/28/2022."			
13	You have the Army Corps' report to the			
14	board dated March 17th.			
15	You have Attorney Ellen Gregory's report			
16	to the board dated March 16th.			
17	You have Tetra Tech monthly Great Lakes			
18	Legacy Act Grand Cal River remedial design project			
19	report dated March 14, 2022.			
20	You have Attorney Gregory,'s March 9,			
21	2022 memo confirming the Grand Cal River Remediation			
22	Phase I Proposal regarding the Great Lakes Legacy Act			
23	was not substantively different from the February 17th			
24	draft that was approved by the Board.			

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You have a memo from Rothschild Insurance Agency and the attachment related to it regarding the District's Commercial Insurance Policy renewal. You have Clifton, Larson, Allen's financial statement dated February 28, 2022, which was e-mailed to you earlier today and I also gave you a hard copy of it along with the hard copies of the claim docket POs and checks. And those are the items in your Board packet. I would like to go over a brief report. Regarding the items, action items on today's agenda, you have the two traditional action items of the Board minutes and the monthly claim docket. Also, there was a Fedler LLC property claims in the newspaper which was forwarded to Attorney Wieser for review. And once we hear back from him on if that had anything to do with our federal LLC situation. I'll report back to the Board. Regarding finances, the Financial Report for today's Board meeting was e-mailed to you earlier today as I mentioned in a hard copy provided today. Tim Anderson will be presenting and reviewing the Financial Report later in the meeting. At our February board meeting, the Board

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approved two transfer requests affiliated with our 2022 Operating Budget. One was from the trust account and the other from the non-trust account. Those transfers have been made and recorded in Tim's accounting report. And also the BMO update on the investment options are also -- or David Alonzo was supposed to be here.

MS. GREGORY: He hasn't joined yet.

MR. TREVINO: He hasn't joined yet. He was going to give us an update on investment options.

Regarding user fees, I will be starting to work on the 2022 user fee packet and invoices which will include our annual communicator.

Regarding the Great Lakes Legacy Act project, the Lake George Canal East project, the South Tank form sheet pile wall project, the design is ongoing. BP submitted their 90 percent design to the project team for review. And there have been several meetings, project team meetings to review the project team's questions and comments. An updated 90 percent design will be submitted to the team for final review by April 8th with final comments due April 22nd. And the 90 percent design is scheduled to go out for a 30-day comment period at the end of April with the comment period concluding on May 30th.

And then after that, a presentation will be held in front of the Board at a public meeting and we are forecasting that to be at a June Board meeting. The 90 percent design is scheduled to be completed by the end of June. And the sheet pile wall construction is scheduled to be installed by the end of 2023.

Regarding the Lake George Canal East
Section with a reminder Phase I dredging was completed
in 2020. Phase II dredging isn't scheduled to
recommence until after the sheet pile wall is
completed, which as I mentioned is scheduled to be done
by 2023. And the Corps will be managing the dredging
project on behalf of EPA.

Regarding the Lake George Canal middle project, the Army Corps continues to work with Brendon, the lead mediation contractor on the capping project.

Brendon preconstruction submittals is ongoing and mobilization is expected to start this month.

Regis Remedial Design, Tetra Tech design work is ongoing. The project team continues to have periodic meetings advancing the design work. And we continue to work on various projects, tasks, including the wetlands coordination, property access coordination and several

1 other tasks. A draft of the design was sent to the 2 project team for review. Comments were submitted to EPA which were compiled and summarized for Tetra Tech's 3 4 consideration. Regarding the remediation of the Grand 5 6 Cal River, a project proposal for the Phase I sediment 7 remediation was submitted to EPA last week on 8 March 9th. 9 At our February Board meeting, the Board asked Attorney Gregory to submit a memo confirming that 10 11 there weren't any substantive changes from the 12 February 17th draft that the Board approved. Attorney 13 Gregory drafted and sent the confirmation memo requested by the Board. It was dated March 9th, but it 14 15 was sent on March 10th. A copy of the memo and the reference attachment is in your Board packet. We have 16 17 a Technical Review Committee meeting with EPA to review 18 the proposal on April 1st. 19 Jim Wescott, Project Manager for Tetra 20 Tech was supposed to be in attendance. Has he joined 21 yet? 22 MS. GREGORY: He is not on. 23 MR. TREVINO: So the project team continues 24 to work on calculations affiliated with the PCA and the 8

tipping fee agreement amendments which will be used to leverage the Great Lakes Legacy Act funding or the Phase I remediation.

The PCA amendment has been completed in our efforts to amend the tipping fee agreement continues to move forward. The District is taking the lead on developing a first draft of the amendment. So we are working on that. Part of the Great Lakes Legacy Act project is to demonstrate or produce work in kind, work that gets credited towards the project. And I have been working on the 2021 year-end work in kind report. I'm hoping to have a draft by the end of this week and officially send it to the EPA by the end of this month.

Regarding the Lake George Canal remediation that work is ongoing and there is a reminder that the project is between BP and EPA.

Regarding the Canal Street Bridge project, the design of the two dolphins is ongoing.

AECOM, the engineering firm we've hired to do the work continues to work through the permitting process. I'm planning to have a proposal and engagement letter from AECOM at our April Board meeting that will include their services to complete the design and take us all

1 the way through the bidding process. 2 Regarding the BP term sheet agreement for parcels BP is interested in acquiring from the 3 4 District, we were on hold for a couple of months allowing BP to confirm with their management what 5 6 direction they were going to take regarding the formal ECI Refinery Parcels. BP has recently informed us that 8 they are still interest in acquiring all the former ECI 9 parcels, the non-CDF ECI parcels. So we have resumed our efforts on the 10 11 drafting of a settlement agreement regarding the 12 properties. Attorney Gregory will be given a update on 13 the groundwater characterization of the former ECI 14 parcels and various others. And the Corps report, as I 15 mentioned is in your Board packet, Corps Project 16 Management, Mike Nguyen is in attendance and will be 17 giving an update to the Board later in the agenda. 18 That concludes my report. 19 MR. DOYLE: Any questions for Fernando? 20 Okay. Next, Approval consideration of the Board 21 meeting notes for February 17, 2022. 22 MR. FEKETE: Motion to approve. 23 MR. DOYLE: We have a second. 24 MR. LOPEZ: Second.

14	Now, the Accounting Consulting Report,
15	financials through February.
16	MR. ANDERSON: Hi guys. You guys have a copy
17	of this in front of you? Page 2 of that report. It
18	says at the top "Statement of Cash Receipts and Cash
19	Disbursements." That is the cash receipts and
20	disbursements of the operating account and the user fee
21	account and we have got a couple of CDs. This is Tim
22	Anderson.
23	MR. ANDERSON: This is a summary of the cash
24	in those accounts which was \$3,992,000 at the beginning

of the year, January 1st. And at the end of the February, we had in those accounts \$4,000,341. And you can see the breakdown below on that Page 2 of how it falls. We've got a \$1.8 million in the Operating Account. That would be for the 2022 budget. And then the other accounts, that's the User Fee account. That is a checking account with \$986,000 in it. And then we have got \$1.5 million in CDs.

The receipts basically interest income, user fees and that trust transfer that Fernando talked about, the \$398,000 is what we transferred out of that BMO trust account. And then the expenses, the disbursements are what we've, you know, what we've written in checks for January and February of 2022. So the cash is increased \$349,000 in those first two months.

Down on Page 3 of that report, it just shows those three accounts and what's happening in those accounts. So the first section up there is the Operating Account that we used for our budgeted expenses. And you can see basically that there has been two transfers that Fernando alluded to, the \$398,000 from the trust. And then the \$162,000, the balance comes from the User Fees checking account. You

could see that right below, right below that top section in the middle. That's the money coming out of the User Fee account and going into our Operating Account.

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And then the CDs we've accrued \$1300 in interest for January and February on the CDs. And then the last page of the report, Page 4, shows you guys that the basic object of Page 4 is to give you guys all comfort that you have an adequate budget to approve your claims docket. So the claims docket there has \$37,000 on it. Every line on the budget is very important that every line on the unused budget is a positive number after the claims docket. So we watch that figure very closely to make sure that you are spending the money in line with the budget appropriations and we are. The \$1.8 million that is sitting there in an unused budget that equates to the balance in the operating account, cash account. So the theory is that that Operating account would always have our unused budget. And it's not just a theory of If you take the unused budget plus the claims words. docket for today, that agrees with the balance in the Operating Account.

So there is plenty of budget and the

1	expenses are coming in just like they were budgeted and			
2	and everything balances. Any questions on this report			
3	guys?			
4	MR. LOPEZ: Thank you.			
5	MR. DOYLE: Thank you.			
6	MR. ANDERSON: The Special District Annual			
7	Report has been filed with the State Board accounts.			
8	They have another questionnaire about payroll which has			
9	been filed. And then we have a Form 1041 that we have			
10	to file for the trust. It is not due yet, but we will			
11	file that and then we will have taken care of all			
12	compliance requirements for 2021 which I think is			
13	important that you guys know. So that's my report,			
14	your Honor.			
15	MR. DOYLE: Thank you very much. Thanks			
16	again guys.			
17	Okay, the next thing is the Claim Docket			
18	8/17/2020.			
19	MR. TREVINO: I wanted to verify something on			
20	the Claim Docket. The Claim Docket has an itemized			
21	list of the vendors that are being paid and check			
22	numbers. And when I went to print out the checks,			
23	there was a glitch in one. And it basically printed a			
24	vendor twice. So in order to correct it, I had to go			

1	to the next number on the sequence from the checks.			
2	So I did check with Tim and so we're going to fix that			
3	after the fact, right?			
4	MR. ANDERSON: Yes.			
5	MR. TREVINO: So I voided one of the checks			
6	that were printed twice and that is why when I pass			
7	around the packet, you'll see one of the checks is			
8	voided.			
9	MR. ANDERSON: It should give you guys			
10	comfort to know that Fernando agonized over this all			
11	day. And it's okay. We can have errors and we can			
12	void checks. It is not a problem. It was nothing more			
13	than a jam in the paper feeder or something like that.			
14	So we will make sure that we adequately memorialize the			
15	void and it will be fine.			
16	MR. DOYLE: Okay. With that, the Claim			
17	Docket dated 3/17/2022, can I have a motion to approve			
18	that, please?			
19	MR. LOPEZ: Motion.			
20	MR. HENRY RODRIGUEZ: Second.			
21	MR. DOYLE: Okay, I'm going to do a roll			
22	call. John?			
23	MR. FEKETE: Yes.			
24	MR. DOYLE: John Dakota?			
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1	MR. DAKOTA: I vote yes.			
2	MR. DOYLE: Jalon?			
3	MR. ROBINSON: Yes.			
4	MR. DOYLE: Henry?			
5	MR. HENRY RODRIGUEZ: Yes.			
6	MR. DOYLE: And I think I did me. Yes. Did			
7	I ask you, Ray?			
8	MR. LOPEZ: Yes.			
9	MR. DOYLE: Approval for accounts payable			
10	voucher.			
11	MR. TREVINO: We just did that.			
12	MR. DOYLE: We just did that? That's part of			
13	it. I thought we used to see a thing with the checks.			
14	MR. TREVINO: That is what he is signing.			
15	MR. DOYLE: My bad. How about the GLA GCR			
16	Junction Reach Remedial Design project update.			
17	MR. TREVINO: Is Jim on? Hang on tight,			
18	David. Your agenda item is next.			
19	I guess Jim Wescott wasn't able to			
20	attend, but I gave, you know, I don't know what he			
21	would have added to my update. The remedial design is			
22	ongoing. We submitted the Great Lakes Legacy Act			
23	proposal for Phase I remediation which includes the			
24	complete restoration of Grand Cal River west section			

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and some dredging in the Harbor Canal section and then also some work in the junction marsh area. And our presentation to EPA's technical review committee is scheduled for April 1st. So that's an update on the Grand Cal River projects.

MR. DOYLE: BMO Trust Report.

MR. ALONZO: So I was going to run through the report here and then I am going to talk about the follow up I had with Fernando with some interest rates. Meaning I consolidated it down to two sheets. So the first one can go through the balances of the accounts and list them all.

First account is the Money Market account and the second one was the CD. So we actually had the CD came due I think the last day of February. So that deposit was placed into the current Money Market account. So the total value of the trust is \$4,128,304.79. The balance of the trust on February, 28th was \$4,128,304.79 and that was a difference of a negative \$397,911.29. So when we look at the second page, it is really going to show why it is negative because we didn't do the disbursement of the trust. The deposit over to First Merchant, the withdrawal was for, \$398,338.19. So we did earn some interest of

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course on the CD when it came due and also on the Money Market account. So that's why those two monies don't mesh. The interest from the CD and all the interest from the Money Market and then of course the withdrawal from the trust account.

Obviously, as we saw yesterday, you might have seen the Feds raised interest rates. It has yet to impact bank CDs. It is probably a little too early for that. We might see something into next week.

Last week -- I believe it was last week or the week prior, I reached out to Fernando to just inquire about the investment policy of the trust. Ι had noticed that clients that I work with on the investment side, we use brokerage CDs. And if we go back years ago, we used to have those as part of the trust. And it was called CRs. They were FDIC insured from various banks across the US. It didn't cost anything to do. I noted those interest rates like on a one year CD were around one percent. Where retail bank and probably every other bank around the area is probably in the same range of .3. So like right now we are at 13-months at .3 with BMO and 25 months at 24 with BMO. And those rates have not changed since we have made the deposits.

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So we took a look at the investment policy along with some of the banks that were -- the term -- it is banks that we can only use within the State of Indiana according to investment policies. So unfortunately we wouldn't be able to do those brokerage fees, because a lot of those banks like Goldman Sachs, Ally Bank, Citibank are not on that list. And there is some other banks too that are out there that are not on that list.

So I just wanted to throw it out there to Fernando, just to let you know where our rates were on those and if it was an option, that I wanted to make sure I was able to bring it to the attention for this account. But as it stands, we are unable to go down So we are still just going to maintain the that path. balance like we talked about previously in the Money Market account and continued to keep an eye on interest rates on BMO's end to see as those move and we might see some movement potentially next week. If so, I'll be in contact with Fernando and we will go down that path too. Was there any questions at all on the trust? MR. LOPEZ: No.

MR. ALONZO: Pretty much all the CDs have matured. We have all the money sitting in that cash

1 account for the time being. So I'll keep Fernando 2 posted and that is all I have. Thank you very much. Army Corps 3 MR. DOYLE: report. 4 5 MR. NGUYEN: This is Mike Nguyen with the 6 Army Corps of Engineering. Just for the update on the 7 construction. We're preparing the close out -- for the dredging contract. For Oueen Harbor, we'll start water 8 9 treatment in early summer. We have a preconstruction meeting tomorrow. And for the Phase II bike race 10 11 construction is ongoing. For the CDF documentation, 12 for the oil boom coordination, it is nothing 13 significant to report. 14 For the PCA and non-federal funding, the 15 PCA amendments, the PCA amendment was signed by the Colonel on January 5th. I think I could take that out. 16 17 I think we are still removing the -- negotiating the 18 new tipping fee agreement with EPA and that is not 19 really related to the Corps, I mean competing with 20 Cleveland Cliff. 21 For the feather parcel, we're still 22 working to finalize the LERR credit. And for the 23 Parkway improvement, we've actually closed out this 24 contract. We sent the final closeout package to the

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1	contractor this week. We're going to be moving that
2	from the agenda and nothing else to report.
3	MR. DOYLE: Guys, you have any questions?
4	None. Okay, Attorney Ellen Gregory reporting, please.
5	MS. GREGORY: Ellen Gregory with Ellen
6	Gregory Law. Fernando has mentioned in his report the
7	groundwater investigation. This was EPA and Item
8	Rick Divisions are interested in gathering
9	information on the status of the groundwater, a non CDF
10	ECI parcels. Fernando and I have put together an
11	outline input from Rick Nagel at EPA. And the next
12	step in that process is to send out to various
13	engineering firms for the work, the initial work that
14	will be done on that project.
15	The property transfer term sheet
16	Fernando had mentioned, we have an outline of an
17	agreement which is being distributed to the parties,
18	the tipping fee agreement amendment that both Fernando
19	and Mike Nguyen mentioned is moving forward now that
20	the PCA has been amended.
21	And finally, the Governor has lifted the
22	COVID State of Emergency in Indiana. And therefore,
23	the electronic meetings policy will move forward from
24	now on under the Non-emergency Declaration, which has
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1	implications for how many people need to be attending
2	each meeting in person and how many remote meetings any
3	one Board member is allowed to attend remotely in a
4	year. And that is all I have.
5	MR. DOYLE: Any questions, anybody? Any
6	other or new business to bring out. Nothing. Any
7	public comments? Well, that seems to conclude the
8	meeting for today. I hope I did it justice. The next
9	Board meeting is April 21, 2022 at 5:00 p.m. And
10	that's a wrap. I do make a motion to adjourn.
11	MR. DAKOTA: Second.
