6	The date today is October 20, 2022. The time is 5:08.			
7	The first order of business is the roll call. John			
8	Bakota.			
9	MR. BAKOTA: Here.

18	Next order of business is the Executive			
19	Director's Report. Fernando?			
20	MR. TREVINO: First, I would like to start			
21	with going over the content of the Board packet. You			
22	have a copy of today's agenda. The Public Meeting			
23	posting for today's meeting, the Board minutes for			
24	September 15th Board meeting. You have the financial 3			

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report dated September 30th for the month of September. That was out today and hard copies were distributed to the Board. You have a copy of today's claim docket dated October 20th along with purchase orders and check registers. You have a copy of the FMT Consulting, Inc. contract, a copy of the Olga Cosme Contract. You have the BMO Trust Reports through September 30, 2022. have a copy of the BMO CD rate sheet. And you have a copy of a BMO Letter of Authorization dated October 20, 2022. You have the First Merchants Bank statement for the month of October. No, I'm sorry, for the month of September for accounts ending in 608 and 616 along with a copy of checks that cleared last month and copies of User Fee deposits made in the month of September. You have an e-mail from myself to Attorney, Jim Weaver, dated October 17th to initiate the User Fee collection process for one of the companies that their account is in arrears. You have a copy of the First Merchants Letter of Authorization dated October 20, 2022. have a copy of People's Bank statement for tipping fees and dredging, an escrow account for the third quarter

of 2022. You have a copy of TetraTech's monthly Great
Lakes Legacy Act, and Remedial Design Project report
dated October 17th. You have a copy of AECOM'S monthly
invoice, their budget report and schedule regarding the
Canal Street Bridge Project. You have a copy of the
Army Corps report to the Board dated October 20th.

You have Attorney, Ellen Gregory's
report to the Board dated October 17th. And you have a

report to the Board dated October 17th. And you have a copy of the Tipping Fee Agreement Amendment fully executed dated October 11, 2022. You have a copy of the Parsons Monthly Bird Operation Report for the month of September 2022 and that report is dated October 4, 2022.

And last but not least, you have a letter dated September 13, 2022 from Item Commissioner Brian Rockinas (sic) to the Care Committee thanking the Committee for their good work. And I think it is fair to note that Chair of Items Care Committee is our Board president, John Fekete.

So a couple of updates to report on.

Regarding the action items on today's meeting agenda,
we have the two traditional action items with the Board
minutes and the monthly claim docket. And there are
two additional action items for the Board's

1 consideration. Actually there is four additional action items. One is the FMT Consulting Contract. 2 The Olga Cosme contract and then two Letters of 3 4 Authorizations to transfer of funds, one to BMO and one to First Merchants. 5 Regarding finances, we had a Finance 6 7 Committee meeting yesterday where we reviewed the 2022 8 budget status. The two contracts that I mentioned, and 9 now we also reviewed the District's cash balances and the First Merchants account and the BMO Trust accounts 10 11 and the different CD rates and options to consider. 12 The action items on today's agenda are the results from 13 the Finance Committee meeting recommendation. 14 Regarding User Fees. So to date we have 15 collected and deposited approximately \$406,000 which is 16 approximately 88.5 percent of the 2022 User Fees. One 17 of the unpaid accounts have not made any attempt to communicate with the District. So we have initiated 18 19 the collection process. 20 Regarding the Great Legacy Act Project, 21 the sheet pile wall, 90 percent design was completed 22 and has been transmitted to the project team. 23 continues to work towards finalizing the specs and drawings. BP has presented their design to the City's 24

1 Technical Review Committee and the Planning Committee 2 and both have given their approval to proceed. sheet pile wall is scheduled to be completed in the 3 4 first half of 2024. 5 Regarding the late George Canal East 6 collection, Phase 2 dredging is scheduled to recommence 7 after the sheet pile wall project is completed, which 8 as I mentioned is scheduled to be done the first half 9 of 2024. 10 The Corps will be managing the dredging project on the EPA path. And the Corps is coordinating 11 additional canal sediments that were originally 12 13 scheduled to be done sometime in early fall which has 14 now been rescheduled for the spring of 2023. 15 Regarding the late George Canal CAP 16 Project, the Army Corps of Engineer is managing this 17 remediation project, construction activities are 18 ongoing. The late George Canal Webster remediation 19 work is ongoing. A reminder that this project is 20 between BP and EPA. 21 Regarding the Grand Cal River Junction 22 Reaches Remedial Design, TetraTech was working on the 23 Remedial Design Work. They are continuing that effort.

We are forecasting to complete the design right around

Thanksgiving. The Project Team continues to have periodic meetings to discuss design completion, property access coordination, permit application, junctions marsh for wetland coordination, cost share documentation and community engagement.

Grand Cal River Phase 1 remediation
project. Earlier this year the District submitted a
proposal to the EPA for \$27.3 million in Great Lakes
Legacy Act funding. The Phase 1 remediation and
scoping includes complete remediation of the Great Cal
River West Branch and dredging of the Indiana Harbor
Branch, and restoration of the junction marsh?

phase, which is to negotiate a project agreement. So both the District and the EPA has started working on drafting of the project agreement. However, a reminder, a couple of months ago EPA asked the District and their EPA Project Management Team to explore managing the Project Delay Cooperation Agreement. And so after careful review of whether to manage the Project Agreement or Cooperation Agreement, the Project Team concluded that the best -- to go the traditional route of the Project Agreement. So we have been working with the EPA to finalize the Project Agreement.

Before a Project Agreement can be approved by EPA, their team has to write what is referred to a Source Control Memo. There are some issues along the Grand Cal River Junction Marsh that needs to be worked out. But as soon as those concerns are resolved, we will be back on track with the Project Agreement. And they're looking to do some sampling sometime in November on that issue.

As I have mentioned in the past, the Project Team for some time was working on the -- share calculations that would be generated by the Cleveland-Cliff project which is directly impacted by the PCA and the Tipping Fee Agreement amendments. That project will be used to leverage Great Lakes Legacy Act funding for the \$27.3 million for that Grand Cal River Remediation Project that I mentioned. You might recall the PCA amendment was finalized earlier this year and after months of negotiating the Tipping Fee Agreement amendment, the Board approved and signed the amendment at the September board meeting and since then the other two parties to the agreement, Cleveland-Cliff and Corps, the Army Corps has signed the amendment.

You might recall before we started negotiating these two agreements, there was some debate

whether the District might owe several million dollars because of certain perspectives under these two original agreements. Now that the PCA and Tipping Fee amendment has been completed, the result will be a few million dollars that is now owed to the District.

Again, I want to thank Attorney, Ellen Gregory and top notch attorney Ray Relue (sic) for representing the District on these efforts. The Army Corps of Engineers and their staff for their efforts and their staff being our partner through these negotiations in seeking a neighborly resolution to the matter. Thank you to all those who worked on it.

Regarding the Great Lakes Legacy Act
Work in Kind report. The District submitted their
report for the six months -- first six months of 2022
to EPA for their review regarding the Canal Street
Bridge project. AECOM continued their effort on the
dolphin design and permit applications. A project
schedule and budget report is in your packet. The
drawings and specs have been sent to the City for their
review. The contractor and the material procurement is
forecasted to be done during the winter months to b
done in the May/June timeframe.

Regarding the BP -- street agreement

In front of you, you have a 3 4 copy of the September 30, 2022 financial statements on 5 a cash basis. If you turn to Page 2, we will begin 6 with a Statement of Cash Receipts and Cash 7 Disbursements for the nine months ended September 30, Through September 30th, you have received 8 9 interest income of \$5,945.70. You have collected User 10 Fees of \$467,230.69 and had a trust transfer of \$398,338.19, leaving the total receipts through 11 12 September 30th to \$871,514.58. 13 You have had various disbursements detailed in the line items in the middle of the 14 15 statement totaling, \$471,320.47. This brings your cash to an increase of \$400,194.11. You began the year with 16 17 a cash balance of \$3,992,407.94. Through September 18 30th, you have a cash balance of \$4,392,602.05. 19 If you turn to Page 3, you will see a 20 Schedule of Cash Account Activity for the nine months 21 ended September 30, 2022. You began the year with a 22 cash balance in your Operating Account of 23 \$1,409,578.39. You have earned interest of \$301.47. 24 Had cash disbursements of \$472,370.47. And you had a 13

1 trust transfer of \$398,338.19 and a budget transfer of \$212,225.79. Bringing your cash balance in the 2 Operating Account as of September 30th to 3 4 \$1,549,123.37. 5 The Users Fee account began with a cash 6 balance on January 1st of \$1,076,244.74. You have 7 earned interest income of \$2,947.20. Collected User 8 Fees of \$167,230.69. Had a budget transfer of 9 \$212,225.79. And you also redeemed a Certificate of Deposit totaling \$1,509,281.84, bringing your User Fee 10 11 cash balance as of September 30th to \$2,843,478.68. 12 You began the year with a Certificate of 13 Deposit totaling \$1,506,584.81. You received interest 14 of \$2,697.03 and that CD was redeemed bringing the 15 balance as of September 30th to zero. 16 On Page 4, you will see the Schedule of 17 2022 available budget as of October 19, 2022. 18 2022 Budget Appropriation Balance was \$1,919,735. 19 Adding in the Accounts Payable as of 12/31/2021 of 20 \$50,407.37. You also have a 2022 Budget amendment for 21 \$50,000, bringing your 2022 total appropriation to 22 \$2,020,142.37. 23 Through September 30th, you have had 24 cash disbursements of \$471,320.47. In front of you, 14

TREVINO: Just to summarize again, the 7 Finance Committee met yesterday to review the funds 8 that were in the First Merchant Bank Money Market 9 Account and the BMO Trust Money Market Account. We had 10 held off putting the money in any CDs for the last few 11 months with the strategy that the interest rates were 12 going to go up and it didn't make much sense to lock in 13 our dollars for an interest rate that was below .5 or 14 whatever it was. So .05 probably. So the strategy ended up working out in our favor. So funds that are 15 16 being held in the Money Market are being recommended 17 for the amounts that are in the Letter of Authorization 18 to be transferred to -- one is a 24-month CD and the 19 other is a 25-month CD. So Debbie, which one is the 20 first one up? David, did you want to interject 21 anything? 22 MR. ALONZO: Yeah, I'll sort of jump ahead of 23 the proposal and go through the report, if that is 24 okay. So this is David Alonzo, BMO Harris Bank. So to 17

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go off of what Fernando had said, we had a conversation during our Finance Committee meeting yesterday. And we held off on doing anything. We have kept the money in the Money Market for a number of months hoping interest rates would move up. So based on some recommendations and conversation, we are going to move, look at moving forward with some recommendations of a 25-month CD for \$3.5 million. And we will keep the remaining balance in the Money Market, which is approximately \$637,359. And that number will be a little bit higher too, but as That money has been remaining in the an approximation. Money Market and will be there for next year's budget. That will come out and also help cover the 2024 budget at that time. And that 25-month CD will come due into -- I'm thinking probably November, towards the end of November 2024. So, yeah, that interest rate has moved up quite a bit. So this was definitely in our If you would like, I could go through the Trust favor. Report as it stands right now? So on the first day of the Trust Report it just lists the Money Market account where all the cash is in. The current balance as of the end of September was \$4,137,359.66. And just as I had mentioned, we are going to be moving \$3.5 million of

1	that to a CD. Once we get that opened up, I'll see the		
2	business banking partners on that. We'll have that for		
3	John to sign off on it, and we can take care of that.		
4	The second page of that Trust Report,		
5	this goes through some of the historical balances that		
6	we've had and also the distributions we've had since		
7	BMO had this account and until back from 1997 up until		
8	now. This year we took out \$398,338.19. I'm happy to		
9	see the rates move up and earn some interest on those		
10	deposits. And as Fernando said that it definitely paid		
11	off to wait some extra months. That is all I got. Any		
12	questions?

20	Debbie Milne and John Prayak (sic) and he is no longer			
21	with First Merchants. Everything else is the same,			
22	other than John Prayak's name removed.			
23	Debbie, did you want to add anything?			
24	MS. MILNE: Sure. Good evening, everybody.			

1 The only thing that I just wanted to bring to your attention for some discussion, we just need to 2 understand who the signers will be for the Certificate. 3 4 And in the past, I think that there has been some 5 discussions. It has only been Mr. Lopez, I believe. 6 And maybe there would be consideration to have someone 7 as a back up signer. So I would just need to know 8 Probably add that to the authorization letter 9 however you want that handled. 10 MR. TREVINO: For the authorization letter, 11 we can, you know, leave it as Ray. But within the next 12 few weeks we can work on adding someone, an authorized 13 person to be signatory to the consultant. And John, we 14 talked about that in the past. Have an individual to 15 be able to sign off of the Trust and the operating 16 account. We'll follow-up on that Debbie, but I think 17 for now we'll leave it. 18 MS. MILNE: Perfect. 19 It's a good observation. MR. FEKETE: 20 appreciate that. Probably just came to our recognition 21 and it was highlighted in some discussions earlier on. 22 And if there is a little more work that we have to do, 23 more than just picking a name today, so we'll be 24 working our way through that and probably within the 21

1 Manager from Tetratech is on the call. Jim, do you 2 want to give us a quick summary of the status of our 3 work? 4 MR. WESCOTT: I'll try to be brief. So James 5 Wescott, TetraTech. Primarily focused on responding to 6 comments on the different permits. As we talked last 7 month we were kind of a little bit on hold just waiting 8 to see how whether it was going to be a project 9 agreement or cooperative agreement, because that kind of changes things. Now that it's been decided to move 10 11 forward with the project agreement, we can finalize 12 most of the design documents as Fernando mentioned by 13 Thanksqiving. And I assume there will be a continued 14 response with the permit agents after that. Are there 15 any questions? 16 MR. FEKETE: Any questions for Mr. Wescott? 17 Thank you, Jim. 18 Army Corps Board Report, Mr. Nyugen? 19 This is Mike Nguyen with the MR. NGUYEN: 20 Army Corps of Engineers. I'll keep my report brief. 21 Completed the close out package for the dredging 22 contract and Clean Harbor has started water treatment 23 on October 1st and they should be complete by mid 24 November. 23

For the Phase 2, dike race, construction
is ongoing. They should shut down for the winter
probably in late November or early December. And for
the PCA, and we've completed the PCA amendment. We are
just working on trying to close out that PCA for our
financial end. And that requires us to get the funds
from the tipping fee and then send money back to ECWMD.
And then we mentioned the Tipping Fee
Amendment. We already signed it on October 11th. And
that is all I have.
MR. FEKETE: Any questions for Mr. Nguyen?
MR. BAKOTA: Mr. Nguyen, this is John Bakota.
At our last meeting, I brought up the problem we have
on the sidewalk parallel to your
MR. NGUYEN: I wasn't at the last meeting.
MR. BAKOTA: I was hoping that the
notification got to you. What I'm complaining about is
friends of mine that live in the neighborhood, that
sidewalk, they received a few flat tires. So I
purposely took a walk in that area and it is trash.
There is glass there. There is metal pieces. There
was a sofa cushion there. And there was a lamp shade
there. I own a home in East Chicago and I'm
responsible for keeping my front sidewalk clean, even

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1	though I don't own it. And I clear the snow in the	
2	winter time.	
3	What I'm asking the Army Corps to do is	
4	to do the responsible thing that I have to do, set up a	
5	process of cleaning that periodically and also clearing	
6	snow after a snowstorm.
