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1	MR. FEKETE: I'd like to call to order
2	the East Chicago Waterway Management District Board of
3	Directors' Regular Public Board Meeting. Today's date
4	is July 20, 2023, and the time is 5:08.
5	The first order of business is a roll call.
6	
7	Jaylan Robinson?
8	MR. ROBINSON: Here.
9	MR. FEKETE: John Bakota?
10	MR. BAKOTA: Here.
11	MR. FEKETE: Henry Rodriguez?
12	MR. RODRIGUEZ: Here.
13	MR. FEKETE: Kevin Doyle.
14	(No response.)
15	Ray Lopez?
16	MR. LOPEZ: Here.
17	MR. FEKETE: John Fekete? Here. We
18	have a quorum.
19	Next up is the Executive Director's Report.
20	Mr. Trevino?
21	MR. TREVINO: Yes. Fernando Trevino
22	with FMT Consulting. I'd like to start off by going
23	over the contents of your Board packet.
24	You have today's agenda; you have the public
25	meeting posting for today's meeting; the Board minutes

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for last month's June 15 regular Board meeting; the CliftonLarsonAllen Financial Report dated June 30 for the month of June that was emailed to you earlier today and hard copies provided at the Board meeting; you have today's claim docket dated July 20, 2023, along with copies of purchase orders and the check register; you have the First Merchant bank statements for the month of June for accounts ending in -608 and -616, along with a copy of checks that cleared last month, and also a copy of the First Merchant's CD Report, with a run date of July 17, 2023; you have First Merchant's letter of authorization dated July 20, 2023, for the transfer of \$250,000 to the 2023 budget for the Canal Street Bridge Project line item; you have the Settlement Agreement Deadline Extension Agreement between the District, the City, and Atlantic Richfield; you have Board Member Kevin Doyle's resignation letter dated June 5, 2023; you have the BMO trust reports through June 30 of 2023; you have People's Bank tipping fee and dredging escrow statements for the second quarter 2023; you have the 2023 User Fee packet transmittal cover letter and all of the 2023 user fee invoices; you have Tetra Tech's monthly progress report dated July 17, 2023 for the month of June; you have AECOM's latest project update and schedule regarding the Canal Street Bridge Project;

you have the Army Corps report to the Board dated July 20; and Attorney Ellen Gregory's report to the Board with a revision date of July 18; and you have Jacob's monthly progress report for the month of June dated July 5, 2023. And that covers the contents of your packet.

Go over a couple items to update you on.

Regarding action items on today's agenda, we have five action items; two are the traditional ones, the June 15 Board minutes and the standard monthly claim docket.

You have the First Merchant's transfer request memo; this is affiliated with the budget amendment that was approved at last month's Board meeting. You might recall that the Board approved a \$250,000-budget amendment to the Canal Street Bridge budget line item, and that was related to the award of the Thatcher contract. You have approval consideration of the Settlement Agreement deadline extension, and Board member Kevin Doyle's resignation.

Regarding user fees, the 2023 user fee packet went out late last week. A copy of the transmittal letter and invoices are in your Board packet. The final 2023 communicator was included in the packet which came out really nice I thought, and I provided copies of the communicator to the Board, as

well. I want to thank Olga Cosme for all of her efforts in getting the invoice packets out last week. It takes a lot of work and she did a really good job.

Regarding the PCA Amendment, we have been in communication with the Corps to try and complete the final accounting and transfer of funds. We're trying to set up a meeting with the Corps next week to discuss the most efficient route for the transferring of funds.

Regarding Great Lakes Legacy Act projects, the Lake George canal east and middle project, the south tank farm sheet pile wall project is ongoing. A copy of Jacob's monthly progress report for the month of June is in your Board packet as I mentioned.

There is a buckeye pipeline and a NIPSCO pipeline in the south tank farm that require rerouting for the construction of the sheet pile wall. Both of these reroutes will eventually require an amendment to the easements, which we plan to have ready by next Board meeting. It's possible these amendments may be required to be completed prior to our next Board meeting, and if that's the case, I'll reach out to the Board and try to schedule a special Board meeting. The sheet pile wall is forecast to be completed by 2024.

Regarding the Lake George canal east, phase dredging is scheduled to recommence after the sheet pile

wall project is completed. The Corps is managing the dredging project on EPA's behalf, and the Corps is also coordinating additional canal sediment samples that's scheduled to begin this month.

Regarding the Lake George canal middle cap project, the Army Corps of Engineers is also managing this project. Remediation construction is near completion. The contractor, Brennan, is in the process of demobilizing their equipment, and there will be some echo construction work still necessary in 2024.

A ribbon-cutting ceremony was held on July 10, with major stakeholders that included the District, Army Corps of Engineers, EPA, IDOM, and Congressman Mrvan, and various other stakeholders. I thought the ceremony went very well. I also forwarded a copy of a Northwest Indiana Times article to the Board for your information.

The Lake George Canal west remediation project, that project is between BP and EPA and that work is ongoing.

Regarding the Grand Cal River junction reaches remedial design, Tetra Tech continues to work on completing the remedial design, and we continue to have periodic project team meetings to discuss design completion, property access, coordination permits,

coordination of the junction marsh, and coordination of the former City dump site.

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Regarding the Grand Cal River phase 1 remediation project, the finalizing of the project agreement is currently on pause, pending the resolution of all source-control concerns. Once the project team resolves the source-control concerns, then EPA will submit a source-control memo that basically states that there are no further source-control concerns. And once the source-control memo is finalized, we will resume our work on drafting of the project agreement. forecasting finishing the project agreement this year and construction in 2024. And just as a reminder, the scope for the phase 1 remediation includes complete remediation of the Grand Cal River west branch, which includes dredging and capping work, dredging of the Indiana Harbor Canal Branch, and restoration of the junction marsh.

Is Jim Wescott in attendance?

MS. GREGORY: Yes.

MR. TREVINO: Okay, so Jim Wescott is in attendance to provide additional information and answer any questions the Board might have.

Regarding the Great Lakes Legacy Act work-in-kind reporting, work on drafting the report for

1	the first half of 2023 is ongoing.
2	Regarding the Canal Street Bridge project,
3	you might recall that the Board approved the contract
4	award to Thatcher at the last Board meeting. Since then
5	we've had a project kick-off meeting between AECOM, the
6	District, and Thatcher, and Thatcher has submitted
7	various material specs for AECOM for you for approval,
8	which has been ongoing.
9	Is Jim in attendance after all? Jim Adams?
10	MS. GREGORY: No.
11	MR. TREVINO: I thought Jim Adams was
12	scheduled to attend, but that's okay.
13	The Corps report is in your Board packet.
14	Did Mike join us after all?
15	MR. NGUYEN: I'm on.
16	MR. TREVINO: Okay, so Project Manager
17	Mike Nguyen will be providing an update on the Corps
18	report for the Board, Attorney Ellen Gregory will give
19	an update on various legal matters, and that concludes
20	my report.
21	MR. FEKETE: Any questions for
22	Mr. Trevino? Okay, hearing none, I thank you very much.
23	The next item up is the Board meeting notes
24	for last month's meeting, which was June 15, 2023.
25	I'll entertain a motion to approve?

19	The next order of business is the Accountant
20	Consultant Report; Vanessa?
21	MS. VARGAS: Good evening, everyone. In
22	front of you, you have a copy of the June 30, 2023
23	financial statements on a cash basis.
24	If you turn to page 2, we'll begin with a
25	statement of cash receipts and cash disbursements for

the six months ended June 30, 2023. You've received interest income of \$35,504.29; you've collected user fees totaling \$130,295.64; and had a trust transfer in the amount of \$149,191.38. This brings your total receipts through June 30 to \$314,991.31. You've had total disbursements in the amount of \$244,031.55. This brings you to an increase in cash balance of \$70,959.76. On January first, you began the year with a cash balance in the amount of \$4,300,335.44. On June 30, you had a cash balance in the amount of \$4,371,295.20.

If you turn to page three, we will continue with a schedule of cash account activity for the six months ended June 30, 2023. Your operating account began the year with a cash balance in the amount of \$1,439,851.14; you've earned interest income of \$178.49; you've had cash disbursements totaling \$244,031.55; you've received two transfers: a trust transfer in the amount of \$149,191.38, as well as a budget transfer in the amount of \$153,329.23. This brings your operating cash balance as of June 30 to \$1,498,518.69. Your user fee account began the year with a cash balance in the amount of \$560,484.30; you've earned interest income of \$4,025.75; you've collected user fees in the amount of \$130,295.64, as well as had a budget transfer in the amount of \$153,329.23. This brings your user fee

1 account balance as of June 30 to \$411,180.82. You began 2 the year with a CD in the amount of \$2,300,000; you've 3 earned interest of \$31,300.05, bringing your CD balance as of June 30 to \$2,331,300.05. 4 5 If you turn to page four, we'll continue with the schedule of 2023 available budget as of July 6 7 20, 2023. Your 2023 budget appropriation totaled 8 \$1,709,850; adding back in accounts payable as of 9 12-31-2022, the amount of \$32,521.75, brings your 2023 total appropriation to \$1,742,371.75. You've had cash 10 11 disbursements through June 2023, in the amount of 12 \$244,031.55. In front of you, you have a claims docket 13 dated July 20, 2023, in the amount of \$44,655.95. 14 brings your total unused budget for 2023 to 15 \$1,453,684.25. 16 Are there any questions? 17 MR. LOPEZ: Thank you. 18 I have one question. MR. FEKETE: 19 Vanessa, we keep getting our reports just prior to the 20 Board meeting. It doesn't give us a good chance to 21 individually look them over before we come to the Board 22 meeting; is there any way we can improve that? 23 MS. VARGAS: Absolutely. I will work 24 with Fernando to set a new timeline on when we can 25 receive those dockets and a new turnaround deadline for 13

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1	us, as well, so that you have enough time in advance to
2	review the statements.
3	MR. FEKETE: Okay. Because I was just,
4	you know, right around lunchtime, I got another I got
5	this in the mail so, among other things, didn't have a
6	chance to really go over it when I was at home, so thank
7	you, I appreciate that.
8	MS. VARGAS: No problem.
9	MR. FEKETE: Any other questions for
10	Vanessa? Hearing none, we'll move on.
11	Approval consideration for the Accounts
12	Payable voucher dated July 20, 2023, entertain a motion
13	to approve?
14	MR. RODRIGUEZ: Motion to approve.
15	MR. FEKETE: Do I have a second?
16	MR. BAKOTA: Second.
17	MR. FEKETE: We have a second. Okay,
18	roll call vote.

6	The next item is the approval consideration
7	of the \$250,000 transfer request into the 2023 budget
8	amendment approval.
9	Fernando, do you want to explain that?
10	MR. TREVINO: Yeah, so, at the last
11	Board meeting, the Board approved a \$250,000 budget
12	amendment for the Canal Street Bridge project when we
13	awarded the Thatcher contract. And I usually, when I do
14	a budget amendment, I include the transfer memo with it
15	and the transfer memo wasn't on it. So just to kind of
16	be clean and make sure we approve both, so I'm asking
17	the Board to approve the transfer memo that basically
18	you already approved.
19	MR. FEKETE: Right, yeah. So just as I
20	remembered it, we approved in the last Board meeting, we
21	just didn't have a document to approve, which is what
22	we're doing today.
23	So I'll entertain a motion to approve?
24	MR. LOPEZ: Motion to approve.
25	MR. FEKETE: And a second?
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1	MR. BAKOTA: Second.
2	MR. FEKETE: Okay.
3	Jaylan Robinson?
4	MR. ROBINSON: Yes.
5	MR. FEKETE: John Bakota?
6	MR. BAKOTA: Yes.
7	MR. FEKETE: Henry Rodriguez?
8	MR. RODRIGUEZ: Yes.
9	MR. FEKETE: Kevin Doyle?
10	(No response.)
11	Ray Lopez?
12	MR. LOPEZ: Yes.
13	MR. FEKETE: John Fekete? I vote yes;
14	that motion is approved.
15	The next order of business is the Settlement
16	Agreement deadline extension. I think that we talked
17	about this last month and that it was going to be
18	forthcoming. Do you just want to refresh our memory for
19	the record, Fernando?
20	MR. TREVINO: Yes. So in the Settlement
21	Agreement that the Board, the City, and approximate
22	Atlantic Richfield in March had a deadline, I believe,
23	of July 7, that we were going to get all of the
24	necessary due diligence for the transfer. And as July
25	came, it was apparent that we weren't going to be able
	16

1	to finish all the action items in time, so all three
2	parties agreed to extend the deadline to September 7, I
3	believe. And so rather than schedule a special Board
4	meeting just for the approval of this document that
5	really wasn't it was more of an administrative
6	change, there were no really pros or cons to anyone in
7	the agreement, I pulled the Board to make sure everybody
8	was okay with the extension and then we would ratify it
9	at today's Board meeting. So that gave our Board
10	President, John Fekete, the okay to sign it, and so
11	today we're just asking the Board to ratify it for the
12	record.
13	MR. FEKETE: Okay. I'll entertain a
14	voice vote, entertain a motion to approve?
15	MR. BAKOTA: Motion to approve.
16	MR. FEKETE: And a second?
17	MR. RODRIGUEZ: Second.
18	MR. FEKETE: All in favor, signify by
19	saying aye.
20	(All signify aye.)
21	Any abstentions, any nays? Hearing none,
22	the motion is approved.
23	And the final order of business under
24	approval consideration, we have a letter addressed to me
25	from a Board member Kevin Doyle, expressing his desire

1 to resign from activity with the Board. I'd like to, at 2 least for the record, thank Kevin for all of the valuable work and input that he put in during his tenure 3 with this organization. 4 MR. BAKOTA: 5 I'd like to have my name included with the other Board members, and send him a 6 7 letter thanking him for his service with the Board. 8 MR. FEKETE: You took the words right 9 out of my mouth. Thank you. 10 MR. TREVINO: Good idea. I'll follow up 11 on that. 12 MR. FEKETE: Very good. 13 Okay, BMO trust report; Bob Santore? 14 MR. SANTORE: Yes, good evening, 15 everybody. 16 Page one is the money market and CD holding; 17 the page shows the combined balance of the money market 18 account and your certificate of deposit with BMO. 19 Current value on June 30 was \$4,051,591.89. an increase of \$531.08 from interest earned from the 20 21 last period. Page two is the historical data showing 22 the values of the trust account from 1997 with current 23 distributions in 2023 of \$149,191.38. And yeah, I guess 24 that's it. If there's any questions, I'd be happy to 25 answer those.

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1	MR. FEKETE: Okay, any questions for Mr.
2	Santore?
3	Thank you, Bob, appreciate your report.
4	MR. SANTORE: Sure, you're welcome.
5	MR. TREVINO: Mr. President, I don't
6	think we voted and approved Kevin's resignation letter.
7	I think we talked about sending him a thank you.
8	MR. FEKETE: I think that just
9	acknowledging his resignation is enough. We don't have
10	to vote him off. He resigned.
11	MR. TREVINO: All right.
12	MR. FEKETE: Looking over the BMO
13	report, I always marvel at the fact that we started in
14	1997 with \$15,564,000; we have \$149,191, but in the
15	meantime, we have distributed \$21,654,000, which means
16	that somewhere along the line, we took full advantage of
17	the high interest rates the federal government was
18	offering on the bills that we took, on the documents
19	that we invested in.
20	MR. TREVINO: Yeah, good observation.
21	MR. FEKETE: So I think it's really kind
22	of a compliment to the work that's been done by this
23	Board in the past, as well as the present, to manage our
24	finances in a frugal way.
25	MR. TREVINO: Yeah, being good stewards

1 of the money. 2 MR. FEKETE: So congratulations to all. 3 Okay. Great Lakes Legacy Act, Grand Cal River junction reaches remedial project update, I 4 believe that's Mr. Wescott. 5 MR. WESCOTT: Good evening, everyone. 6 7 As Fernando mentioned, we're still making a little bit 8 of progress. It's really just contingent on the 9 landfill City dump resolution. There seems to be some 10 progress with that between the City and Buckeye partners. So hopefully in the next couple months, that 11 breaks free and we can kind of finalize the design and 12 13 get the project approved and done by then. I think 14 Fernando has an end-of-the-year target for that. 15 MR. TREVINO: Yeah, Jim, do you want to 16 mention the possibility of additional scope of work that 17 EPA may ask us to take on? 18 MR. WESCOTT: Yeah, I can talk about 19 that. I mean, there's a couple things. The Corps of 20 Engineers is the EPA's technical consultant. 21 had some comments -- you know, we started this process 22 with a design that we completed in 2015. Then, at the 23 time, EPA and the District were partners on it. And in 24 the interim, you know, when they kind of brought it back 25 up, the Corps of Engineers became involved in EPA's 20

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technical consultant, they had some questions, mainly on the geotechnical which, you know, back in 2014, EPA didn't request it or we didn't do it, but the Corps, as the technical consultant for EPA, is sort of pushing EPA to get some geotechnical samples and do some analysis of the river and the banks, and so there is -- I know that EPA is working with the Corps to kind of finalize what they really are looking for. But once they send that request to Fernando, Tetra Tech will write a scope of work and kind of prepare something for EPA to implement. There's a few other technical comments from the Corps that were kind of new also, so there's a little bit of additional scope that's probably -- well, there's a little bit of additional scope that will be required between now and the end of the year, and then I'm not really sure what it is yet because I haven't seen the EPA's request in its finality. But if they send it to Fernando next week as they kind of mentioned, I should be able to have kind of a cost for both of them scheduled to finish everything else that EPA wants by the next Board meeting for your review. Are there any questions? MR. FEKETE: Any questions for Mr. Wescott? Thank you, Jim. Okay. Canal Street Bridge Dolphin project. 21

1 MR. TREVINO: Yeah, so I kind of -- I 2 don't know, did Jim Adams join? 3 MS. GREGORY: He did not. 4 MR. TREVINO: So I kind of gave a 5 snapshot of the latest progress, so since the Board approved the contract with Thatcher, we had a project 6 7 kick-off meeting, we've had a couple conference calls 8 between AECOM and AECOM and Thatcher and myself to 9 discuss material specs that Thatcher is submitting. 10 AECOM is reviewing those specifications. Some of the challenges with some of the materials is procurement 11 12 So they're looking at alternate-type of piles time. 13 that they might be able to use and to see if AECOM is 14 okay with them and they'll be able to do it this year 15 versus doing it next year. That's kind of the challenge right now is trying to find material or, you know, specs 16 that are acceptable to AECOM if they're not going to be 17 the exact ones, something that's acceptable. 18 19 MR. FEKETE: Well, if it's a change in 20 material, do you need acquiescence from the Coast Guard 21 or Army Corps? 22 MR. TREVINO: I don't think so, no, but 23 I'll double-check that. 24 MR. FEKETE: I think it would be a good 25 idea. If you're changing materials, then somebody might 22

1 have a question, so discover ourselves. 2 MR. TREVINO: Yeah, that's a good point 3 to make. 4 MR. FEKETE: Okay, very good. U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' Board report; 5 6 Mr. Nguyen? 7 Yes, this is Mike Nguyen; MR. NGUYEN: 8 can everyone hear me? 9 MR. FEKETE: Yes. 10 MR. NGUYEN: So this will be a quick brief. 11 12 So for the CDF Construction facility 13 operations, we're still -- once they award the contract, 14 the new contractor will resume treatment. For the Phase 15 II Dike Raise, the construction is ongoing. For the PCA 16 closeout, we sent a letter to request to withdraw 17 \$12.473 million dollars from the tipping fee escrow account from People's Bank. We're still waiting for 18 19 that response to come in. And the ECWMD's letter dated 20 the 26th of June, I think what we're trying to do is 21 wait for People's Bank to respond to our sort of 22 clarification on how to close out the escrow account 23 before we will formally respond to your letter. 24 then the Parkway, we're still inspecting and cleaning 25 monthly, as needed.

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1	And that's all I have; any questions?
2	MR. FEKETE: Any questions for
3	Mr. Nguyen?
4	Thank you, Michael.
5	Attorney Ellen Gregory report?
6	MS. GREGORY: Yes, Ellen Gregory with
7	Ellen Gregory Law. Fernando had mentioned the term
8	sheet extension; Jim Wieser, a real estate attorney
9	working with us, has input on the term sheet extension
10	which was approved. And Jim Wieser and other real
11	estate attorneys and professionals will be working in
12	the next couple of months to finalize all of the
13	documents so that the closing can occur by September 7,
14	which is the new deadline as Fernando had mentioned.
15	Pipeline relocation work has been ongoing in
16	connection with the installation of the sheet pile wall.
17	And Jim Wieser and I have also been involved in the
18	easement modifications that were mentioned earlier in
19	the meeting. Both Mike Nguyen and Mr. Trevino have
20	discussed the closeout for the PCA. We expect to have a
21	meeting next week with the Army Corps of Engineers to
22	move forward coordinating with People's Bank about
23	closing out the escrow account. And then I've also been
24	working with Mr. Trevino on finalizing the 2023 user fee
25	aggeggments and ag he mentioned those went out last

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1	week. And I have nothing else.
2	MR. FEKETE: Any questions?
3	Thank you.
4	Any other business to come before the Board?
5	(No response.)
6	Any public comments?
7	Hearing none, I'll entertain a motion to
8	adjourn this meeting.
9	MR. BAKOTA: Motion to adjourn.
10	MR. FEKETE: Do I have a second?
11	MR. ROBINSON: Second.
12	MR. FEKETE: All in favor, signify by
13	saying aye.
14	(All signify aye.)
