District Board of Directors' Meeting  
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1 MR. FEKETE: I'd like to call to order  
2 the East Chicago Waterway Management District Board of  
3 Directors' Regular Public Board Meeting. Today's date  
4 is May 18, 2023, and the time is 5:06.

5 The first order of business is a roll call.  
6 John Bakota?

7 (No response.)

8 Jaylan Robinson?

9 MR. ROBINSON: Here.

10 MR. FEKETE: Henry Rodriguez?

11 MR. RODRIGUEZ: Here.

12 MR. FEKETE: Kevin Doyle?

13 (No response.)

14 MR. FEKETE: Ray Lopez?

15 MR. LOPEZ: Here.

16 MR. FEKETE: John Fekete? Here. We  
17 have a quorum.

18 Next order of business is the Executive  
19 Director's Report.

20 Mr. Trevino?

21 MR. TREVINO: Yes. Fernando Trevino  
22 with FMT Consulting.

23 I'd like to start off by going over the  
24 contents of your Board packet.

25 You have today's agenda; you have the public

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1 meeting posting for today's meeting; you have the Board  
2 minutes for last month's April 20th Regular Board  
3 Meeting; you have the CliftonLarsonAllen Financial  
4 Report dated April 20, 2023, for the month of April; you  
5 have today's claim docket dated May 18, 2023, along with  
6 copies of the purchase orders and the check register;  
7 you have AECOM's Engagement Letter related to the Canal  
8 Street Bridge Project; you have First Merchants Bank  
9 Statements for the month of April 2023 for accounts  
10 ending in -608 and -616, along with a copy of the checks  
11 that cleared last month, and also a copy of the First  
12 Merchants CD Report with a run date of May 12; you have  
13 the BMO Trust Reports through April of 2023; you have  
14 the People's Bank Quarterly Report for the first quarter  
15 of 2023 for the Dredging and Tipping Fee Escrow  
16 Accounts; you have the Army Corps Report to the Board  
17 dated May 18, 2023; you have Attorney Ellen Gregory's  
18 Report with a revision date of May 16; you have Tetra  
19 Tech's Monthly Progress Report, with a date of May 5;  
20 and you have Jacob's Monthly Project Progress Report for  
21 the month of April, dated May 4; and last, but not  
22 least, a copy of an EPA Press Release dated May 17,  
23 2023, related to an EPA and DOJ announcement of a  
24 settlement with BP Products Whiting Refinery related to  
25 the reduction of hazardous waste air omissions.

1                   And Vanessa Vargas just joined with  
2 CliftonLarsonAllen.

3                   Are you there, Vanessa?

4                   MS. VARGAS: I am.

5                   MR. TREVINO: Okay. And update on a few  
6 matters, regarding the action items on today's agenda,  
7 we have three action items. You have the April Board  
8 Meeting minutes, the monthly claim docket, and the AECOM  
9 Engagement Letter.

10                  You have the CliftonLarsonAllen Financial  
11 Reports that were included in your Board packet, and  
12 Vanessa Vargas is in attendance today to provide the  
13 Board an update on our financials.

14                  Regarding user fees, Allen and I have been  
15 working on a new user fee appeal procedure which we were  
16 hoping to have finalized and provide to you today, but  
17 we reached out to Attorney Wieser who has experience in  
18 such matters, and Jim is going to reach out and evaluate  
19 similar procedures that are used at the County, and  
20 we'll tap into the procedures that they use and try to  
21 use best practices when we develop our fee appeal  
22 procedure. And we should have that exercise done by the  
23 June Board meeting. So with that, the 2023 user fee  
24 invoices and package is now scheduled for the end of  
25 June.

1           Regarding the PCA Amendment,  
2 Cleveland-Cliffs has recently expressed interest in  
3 dredging and disposing of their SEP sediments in the  
4 local CDF.

5           The Board might recall we amended the  
6 original PCA and the original Tipping Fee Agreements.  
7 We basically closed both of those Agreements out. So  
8 for the Corps to dredge and dispose of sediments in the  
9 local CDF, it will require new agreements between the  
10 parties.

11           Cleveland-Cliffs can dispose of SEP  
12 sediments in the CDF with an agreement directly with the  
13 Corps; however, in order for the Corps to dredge the  
14 sediments, it will require a non-federal partner, which  
15 will require an MOU between the District and the Corps  
16 where we're asking the Corps to dredge the sediments.  
17 And then another agreement, separate agreement, between  
18 the District and Cleveland-Cliffs where Cleveland-Cliffs  
19 is agreeing to pay for the dredging cost.

20           We also intend to make sure that the  
21 District will be able to bank the tipping fee and  
22 dredging cost towards the Great Lakes Legacy Act cost  
23 share credit, and we're anticipating having these  
24 Agreements completed by the June or July Board meetings.

25           Regarding the Great Lakes Legacy Act



1 projects, the south tank farm sheet pile wall project,  
2 sheet pile setting and pile driving has begun. The  
3 District continues to work with Atlantic Richfield to  
4 help resolve easement conflicts affiliated with the  
5 construction of the sheet pile wall project. The sheet  
6 pile wall project is forecasted to be completed in early  
7 2024.

8           Regarding the Lake George canal east  
9 project, phase two dredging is scheduled to recommence  
10 after the sheet pile wall project is completed, and as  
11 mentioned, it's scheduled to be done in 2024. The Army  
12 Corps of Engineers is managing the dredging project on  
13 EPA's behalf. The Corps is coordinating additional  
14 canal sediment sampling that is scheduled to be done  
15 sometime in the next few weeks.

16           Regarding the Lake George canal middle cap  
17 project, the Army Corps of Engineers is also managing  
18 this remediation project on EPA's behalf. The Corps'  
19 contractor, which is Brennan, continues with the cap  
20 construction which is forecasted to be done by next  
21 month in June.

22           Regarding Lake George canal west remediation  
23 project, that work is between BP and EPA and that work  
24 is ongoing.

25           Regarding the Grand Cal' River junction

1 reaches project, Tetra Tech continues to work on  
2 remedial design. The project team meets weekly to  
3 discuss project activities such as completing the  
4 design, property access coordination, permit  
5 applications, and coordination with the junction marsh.  
6 And regarding the coordination of the junction marsh, we  
7 recently made progress with Buckeye, and it appears that  
8 they will cooperate with participating in providing  
9 access to their marsh areas, so that's good news. The  
10 project team also continues to work with the City  
11 regarding coordinating with the City dump and trying to  
12 resolve any source concerns affiliated with that.

13           Regarding the Grand Cal' River Phase One  
14 Remediation, finalizing of the project agreement for the  
15 phase one remediation is currently on pause pending the  
16 resolution of resolving all source control concerns.  
17 And once the project team resolves all source control  
18 concerns, then the expectation is that EPA will submit a  
19 source control memo stating all potential known  
20 contamination sources are no longer a concern of  
21 recontaminating our work. The drafting of that source  
22 control memo is an EPA action item. And then once we  
23 complete that source control memo, then we'll be back to  
24 finalizing the project agreement with EPA.

25           Regarding Great Lakes Legacy Act

1 work-in-kind, we have not received any comments to the  
2 District's 2022 annual work-in-kind report, which we  
3 submitted on March 28.

4           Regarding the Canal Street Bridge Project,  
5 we received one bid at our April board meeting, which  
6 was from Thatcher. Since then, we have been working  
7 with AECOM and Thatcher on clarification of the project  
8 design, cost estimate, and Thatcher's proposal. The  
9 expectation is to have a recommendation to the Board at  
10 the June Board meeting.

11           Regarding BP's Settlement Agreement, since  
12 three parties entered into the Settlement Agreement, the  
13 District and Atlantic Richfield have been working on  
14 various action items in regards to finalizing the  
15 conveyance of the properties. We recently extended the  
16 survey deadline that was stated in the settlement  
17 agreement.

18           The Army Corps Report is in your Board  
19 packet. Project Manager Mike Nguyen will be providing  
20 an update to the Board later on in the agenda.

21           And Attorney Ellen Gregory will be providing  
22 an update on various legal matters on the agenda, as  
23 well, and that concludes my report.

24           Any questions or comments?

25                           (No response.)

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1 MR. FEKETE: Thank you, Mr. Trevino.

2 Next up is the approval of the Board Meeting  
3 notes for April 20, 2023. Since all Board members  
4 attending the meeting aren't present, I'll entertain a  
5 motion to approve by voice vote.

6 MR. RODRIGUEZ: I make a motion to  
7 approve.

8 MR. FEKETE: And do I have a second?

9 MR. LOPEZ: Second.

10 MR. FEKETE: Okay. All in favor,  
11 signify by saying aye.

12 (All signify aye.)

13 MR. FEKETE: Any oppositions,  
14 abstentions?

15 (No response.)

16 MR. FEKETE: The motion is approved.

17 Next order of business is the Accountant  
18 Consultant Report.

19 MR. TREVINO: Vanessa?

20 MS. VARGAS: Good afternoon, everyone;  
21 Vanessa with CLA.

22 In front of you, you have the financial  
23 statements on a cash basis dated April 30, 2023. If you  
24 turn to page two, we will begin with the statement of  
25 cash receipts and cash disbursements for the four months

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1 ending April 30, 2023. You have received interest  
2 income of \$33,959.78, you've collected user fees of  
3 \$130,295.64, and had a trust transfer of \$149,191.38,  
4 bringing your total receipts to \$313,446.80. You have  
5 had a total disbursement amount of \$166,245.07, made up  
6 of the various line items above. This brings you to an  
7 increase of cash in the amount of \$147,201.73. You  
8 began the year with a cash balance on January first of  
9 \$4,300,335.44. Your cash balance as of April 30, 2023,  
10 is \$4,447,537.17.

11 If you turn to page three, we will continue  
12 with the schedule of cash account activity for the four  
13 months ending April 30, 2023. Your operating account  
14 began the year with a cash balance of \$1,439,851.14.  
15 You've earned interest of \$122.54. You've had total  
16 disbursements of \$166,245.07, received a trust transfer  
17 of \$149,191.38, as well as a budget transfer of  
18 \$153,329.23. This brings your operating cash balance as  
19 of April 30, 2023 to \$1,576,249.22. Your user fee  
20 account began the year with a cash balance of  
21 \$560,484.30. You've received interest of \$2,537.19,  
22 you've collected user fees of \$130,295.64, and had a  
23 budget transfer of \$153,329.23. This brings your user  
24 fee account balance as of April 30 to \$539,987.90.

25 You began the year with a CD with a balance

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1 of \$2,300,000. The CD has received interest of  
2 \$31,300.05. This brings your CD balance as of April 30  
3 to \$2,331,300.05.

4 If you turn to page four, we will continue  
5 with the schedule of 2023 available budget as of May 18,  
6 2023. Your total 2023 budget appropriation was  
7 \$1,709,850; accounts payable as of 12/31/2022 totaled  
8 \$32,521.75. This brings your 2023 total appropriation  
9 to \$1,742,371.75. You've had cash disbursements through  
10 April 2023 totaling \$166,245.07. In front of you, you  
11 have a claim docket which totals \$35,334.74. This  
12 brings your unused budget for 2023 to \$1,540,791.94.

13 Are there any questions?

14 MR. LOPEZ: Thank you, that was good.

15 MR. FEKETE: Thank you.

16 I will entertain a motion to approve the  
17 accounts payable voucher register dated today's date,  
18 May 18, 2023.

19 MR. LOPEZ: Motion to approve.

20 MR. ROBINSON: Second.

21 MR. FEKETE: Roll call vote.

22 John Bokota?

23 (No response.)

24 MR. FEKETE: Jaylan Robinson?

25 MR. ROBINSON: Yes.

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1 MR. FEKETE: Henry Rodriguez?

2 MR. RODRIGUEZ: Yes.

3 MR. FEKETE: Kevin Doyle?

4 (No response.)

5 MR. FEKETE: Ray Lopez?

6 MR. LOPEZ: Yes.

7 MR. FEKETE: John Fekete? I vote yes.

8 That motion is approved.

9 Next order of business is the BMO Trust  
10 Report.

11 MR. TREVINO: Yes. Mr. Santore isn't  
12 able to join us today due to a family commitment, so  
13 I'll give a brief summary on the BMO Report.

14 So the current balance of the money market  
15 is \$4,021,654.42, and that's reflective of \$498.01  
16 earned since the last Board meeting, and that doesn't  
17 include the two current CD's that -- well, I'm sorry,  
18 the current one CD that the District has in the amount  
19 of approximately \$3.5 million.

20 And that's a quick summary of the Trust  
21 Account.

22 MR. FEKETE: Any questions for  
23 Mr. Trevino?

24 (No response.)

25 MR. FEKETE: The next item is the Canal

1 Street Bridge Dolphin Project update.

2 MR. TREVINO: Yes. I provided a brief  
3 update earlier. Tim or Jim, who wants to give a quick  
4 update?

5 MR. DULL: I can start, and Jim, maybe  
6 you can chime in if you'd like.

7 This is Tim Dull with AECOM. As Fernando  
8 mentioned in his opening remarks, we went out to bid for  
9 the Canal Street Dolphin Project. We received one bid  
10 and that came from Thatcher. The bid was a little  
11 higher than we liked so we had a conversation with them  
12 earlier this week and shared some information and they  
13 were able to reduce their bid by reducing some of their  
14 contingency. So their estimate now is fairly close to  
15 our engineer's estimate, within 5 percent.

16 Jim, do you have anything to add?

17 MR. ADAMS: I really don't have anything  
18 to add. That was a good summary.

19 MR. TREVINO: Yeah, the other thing is  
20 that today we sent them an addendum, an addendum number  
21 two, that AECOM was able to kind of look for  
22 cost-savings opportunities and I think -- AECOM believes  
23 they came up with one. So we forwarded that to Thatcher  
24 for their consideration and the possibility of revising  
25 the proposal. So we're waiting to hear from them, and



1 then as I mentioned, we're looking to have a  
2 recommendation to the Board at the June board meeting.

3 MR. FEKETE: Any questions for the AECOM  
4 reps or Fernando?

5 (No response.)

6 MR. FEKETE: Thank you very much.

7 The next order of business is the US Army  
8 Corps of Engineers Board Report.

9 Mr. Nguyen?

10 MR. NGUYEN: Yes, this is Mike Nguyen  
11 with the Army Corps of Engineers. Can everybody hear  
12 me?

13 MR. TREVINO: Yes.

14 MR. NGUYEN: Okay. So to make this  
15 quick, I guess for the facility operation, we treated  
16 approximately 2 million gallons of water back in 2022  
17 and we're still finalizing the design for a new water  
18 treatment contract, and treatment will resume once we  
19 award that contract.

20 Construction of the phase II dike raise is  
21 ongoing. The placement of clay we started back in April  
22 and we're still waiting for some documents from the  
23 contractor so that they can finalize their request for  
24 equitable adjustment for the time and money.

25 And for the PCA amendment, actually a little

1 progress here. I've drafted a letter and it's actually  
2 being routed to the Colonel to close out the project  
3 cost share. And so we're going to be requesting funds  
4 from the Tipping Fee account to balance that cost share  
5 and refund you any amount over the required cost share.  
6 That letter should be signed hopefully by the end of  
7 this month. If not, sometime early June.

8 And then for the Parkway, we're still  
9 inspecting and cleaning the debris as needed once a  
10 month.

11 And that's all I have.

12 MR. LOPEZ: Thank you, Mike.

13 MR. FEKETE: Any questions for  
14 Mr. Nguyen?

15 (No response.)

16 MR. FEKETE: Okay. Next up is the  
17 Attorney Ellen Gregory Report.

18 MS. GREGORY: Ellen Gregory with Ellen  
19 Gregory Law.

20 As Mr. Trevino mentioned, we were working on  
21 updating a few of these appeal procedures. Jim Wieser  
22 is assisting with that and we hope to have the amended  
23 procedures by next month's Board meeting.

24 We've also been working, again, with the  
25 assistance of Jim Wieser, on negotiating pipeline

1 relocation easements which relate to pipelines that have  
2 to be relocated to accommodate the sheet pile wall  
3 project. The primary easements will be with Nipsco.

4 And on the Canal Street Project, I've been  
5 coordinating with Mr. Trevino and AECOM on the bidding,  
6 legal issues related to the bidding of the project.

7 And finally, the property transfer  
8 documents, we're working on updating the exhibits that  
9 relate to easements on the property that is going to be  
10 transferred to ARBP. So the exhibit that relates to  
11 easements on the property that's going to be transferred  
12 include the easements that I mentioned previously on the  
13 pipeline relocation with Nipsco and Buckeye.

14 And that's all I have.

15 MR. FEKETE: Any questions for  
16 Ms. Gregory?

17 (No response.)

18 MR. FEKETE: Thank you very much.

19 MR. TREVINO: Mr. President?

20 MR. FEKETE: Yes?

21 MR. TREVINO: Did we -- I don't think we  
22 approved the -- or we went through the AECOM Engagement  
23 Letter, did we?

24 MR. ROBINSON: No.

25 MR. FEKETE: Okay. I will entertain a

1 motion to approve the AECOM Engagement Letter.

2 MR. ROBINSON: I make a motion.

3 MR. FEKETE: Do I have a second?

4 MR. RODRIGUEZ: Second.

5 MR. FEKETE: Okay. Roll call vote.

6 John Bokota?

7 (No response.)

8 MR. FEKETE: Jaylan Robinson?

9 MR. ROBINSON: Yes.

10 MR. FEKETE: Henry Rodriguez?

11 MR. RODRIGUEZ: Yes.

12 MR. FEKETE: Kevin Doyle?

13 (No response.)

14 MR. FEKETE: Ray Lopez?

15 MR. LOPEZ: Yes.

16 MR. FEKETE: John Fekete? I vote yes.

17 That motion is approved.

18 Thank you, Mr. Trevino.

19 Any other new business to come before the  
20 Board?

21 MR. TREVINO: Yes, I had one other one.

22 You know, the Board -- Mr. Kevin Doyle was a Board  
23 member for quite a few years. And while he was on the  
24 Board, he really did a great job for us in serving the  
25 East Chicago Waterway Management District. A couple

1 times he's -- he's never officially submitted a letter  
2 of resignation, but he's certainly strongly implied it  
3 verbally and in emails to be removed from distribution  
4 lists. So I think for all intents and purposes, he has  
5 resigned, and I'm wondering for Attorney Ellen Gregory's  
6 input here, you know, what the Board might want to  
7 consider having an official motion to kind of approve or  
8 confirm his resignation and then send him a letter of  
9 thank you for the time that he served on the Board.

10 What's your thoughts, Ellen?

11 MS. GREGORY: Yeah, I think absent  
12 anything in writing from him, since you have already  
13 relayed to the Board that he's expressed interest in no  
14 longer serving, then I think that a motion just to  
15 recognize that he has effectively resigned.

16 MR. LOPEZ: Do you have some  
17 documentation that he's sending you?

18 MR. TREVINO: He's -- there's been a  
19 couple times when I -- when he -- we've had general -- I  
20 had a general distribution list set up when I would send  
21 something to the General Board, and on more than one  
22 occasion, he's asked to be removed from the distribution  
23 list.

24 MR. LOPEZ: You have an email on that?

25 MR. TREVINO: Yes.

1 MR. LOPEZ: You present that and that  
2 proves up the email.

3 MS. GREGORY: Well, I can send you my  
4 email, too. He sent me an email saying, "Take me off  
5 the list."

6 MR. RODRIGUEZ: Will that be enough?

7 MS. GREGORY: Well, it would be better  
8 if we had something in writing, but it sounds like  
9 he's --

10 MR. TREVINO: Yeah, I mean, you can't,  
11 you know, make someone write something, but --

12 MR. FEKETE: So basically what we're  
13 doing is affirming the need for another person and  
14 acknowledging another vacancy.

15 MS. GREGORY: Yeah, I mean, I think we  
16 just affirm that he's effectively resigned, even though  
17 he hasn't submitted anything in writing. And I don't  
18 think we have to affirmatively say there's a vacancy  
19 because, well, effectively --

20 MR. TREVINO: Well, and I mean he's said  
21 it verbally, he's included it in various emails, and on  
22 top of all of that, he hasn't attended a meeting in it  
23 would be about six months maybe.

24 MR. RODRIGUEZ: So we'll make a motion  
25 to accept his resignation from the Board?

1 MR. FEKETE: Accept that he hasn't  
2 offered it.

3 MR. TREVINO: Right, yeah, I don't know.  
4 Ellen, what would be the motion?

5 MS. GREGORY: I think the alternative  
6 would be to agree in this meeting to send a formal  
7 request to him.

8 MR. FEKETE: I think that would be the  
9 way to do it.

10 MS. GREGORY: Do it in writing.

11 MR. FEKETE: Do it in writing what his  
12 intentions are, and as we move forward, we have, you  
13 know, many things and we appreciate all the work that  
14 he's done in the past, but we need to continue moving  
15 forward with a full Board.

16 MS. GREGORY: Yeah, what do you think  
17 about that?

18 MR. FEKETE: I like that, moving forward  
19 with a full Board.

20 MR. TREVINO: I mean, we can certainly  
21 send it to him.

22 MR. ROBINSON: Do we need a motion?

23 MS. GREGORY: Yeah, let's do a motion.

24 MR. FEKETE: Yeah, just basically  
25 seeking out his --

1 MR. TREVINO: Official resignation?

2 MR. FEKETE: Yeah, and giving him the  
3 opportunity. I hate to blindsight somebody.

4 MR. RODRIGUEZ: He should expect  
5 something like this eventually.

6 MR. FEKETE: Yeah, so let's do that.

7 MR. TREVINO: So is there a motion to  
8 send him that request, or do we need to make that  
9 motion?

10 MS. GREGORY: I would have a motion to  
11 direct Fernando to send him a request to put in writing  
12 that he's resigned.

13 MR. LOPEZ: Okay. I make the motion  
14 that you send him a letter to request it in writing.

15 MR. FEKETE: I'll second that.

16 MR. TREVINO: We have to vote on it.

17 MR. FEKETE: Voice vote; all in favor,  
18 signify by saying aye.

19 (All signify aye.)

20 MR. FEKETE: Any oppositions,  
21 abstentions?

22 (No response.)

23 MR. FEKETE: Motion approved.

24 Any other new business to come before the  
25 Board?
