You have a copy of the well, I provided that separately a copy of the Army Corps report, which I received today. So I handed that to you, but that's

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1 | part of your Board packet.

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You have a copy of the ECI Facility 1041

Income Tax Return along with the IT41. And those are for 2024 and the affiliated documents.

You have a copy of a letter from MECHA CEO Tiacoli dated July 1, 2025, which I received a couple months ago regarding our rent increase. So I'll be working with Attorney Ellen Gregory to update our lease agreement with MECHA.

And I also provided a copy of my Performance Evaluation Report that the Board filled out. So I appreciate your feedback. And that was for a Performance Evaluation for 2025.

Go over a couple of items regarding action items on today's agenda. You have the two traditional items of the Board minutes, as I mentioned, the September 18th Board meeting and the monthly claim docket and two additional action items.

You have the Great Lakes Legacy Act, Grand Cal River Project Agreement, Conceptual Approval, and the Fifth Amended Project Agreement, also for conceptual approval.

A couple other items to report on. I'm still working with AECOM and Marino from the City's Planning

Department on finalizing an economic and recreational development presentation regarding finances. I'm still working on the 2026 proposed Operating Budget. I thought maybe it'd be ready by today's meeting, but that work is ongoing and I expect to have that at November's Board meeting.

Also on finances, I met with Board member,
Ray Lopez, and CliftonLarsonAllen's, Vanessa Vargas on
filing of the ECI 2024 tax return. As I mentioned,
copies are in your Board packet and I'm going to ask
the Board to ratify the filing later on in the meeting.

Regarding the 2025 user fees, those packets were sent out at the end of September, which included the communicator that we plan to share with Districts, communicator with various stakeholders including government and agency leadership.

Updates on the Great Lakes Legacy Act projects regarding the Lake George Canal East and Middle project. The design of the sheet pile wall groundwater management system is ongoing. AR/BP has reported that the design is at 60%.

Regarding the Lake George Canal East dredging, the Army Corps of Engineers is managing that part of the project and the design is ongoing. Phase

two of the Lake George Canal East dredging is scheduled to be done in 2026 and the Cleveland Cliff SEP dredging is now forecasted to be done in 2027.

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Regarding the Lake George Canal Middle CAP project, the Army Corps of Engineers is also managing that part of the project. The CAP construction has been completed and ECO construction activities were periodically ongoing. The Project Team is working on an adaptive management plan to address oil sheens observed in the Lake George Canal Middle section.

Regarding the Lake George Canal West remediation project that is ongoing and that project is between BP and EPA. Based on the latest site characterization data, BP recommended no further action was necessary. The Army Corps of Engineers and EPA continued to assess BP's no further action recommendation. And I think they were in the process of doing -- adding some sampling to that area, so doing additional sampling.

Regarding the Grand Cal River Junction

Reaches, the Tetra Tech continues to work under remedial design. The project teams continues to meet weekly to advance the design and planning activities for construction. So some of the things we worked on

is completing the design, Property Access Coordination, Junction Marsh coordination, coordinating with the former city dump site and the Marquette Trail project. Community engagement working on various permit applications, including the TSCA permit and assessing cost share strategies. EPA informed us that they have a change in their policy for signing permit applications. So they're going to ask us to sign the applications. So I'll be working with Tetra Tech, Attorney Gregory and EPA on how to best manage that change going forward.

Tetra Tech Project Manager Carol Neeson has informed me that additional design effort was necessary for the project to assess flood control in the area and that will require a change order and budget amendment. I plan to review Tetra Tech's proposal and have a recommendation at November's Board meeting.

Reaches schedule in 2025, we're expecting to finalize the remedial design and completing the project agreement. Back in August, the District submitted a proposed draft of the project agreement for the Grand Cal River to EPA for their review. And then just recently, which I believe was last week we submitted a

draft of the accompanying Statement of Work for EPA to review as well. As I'll elaborate on the project agreement in a little bit.

And also in 2025, we're forecasting to start construction solicitation process with construction starting in 2026. And it's continued and is expected to continue through 2027.

Carol Neeson of Tetra Tech is in attendance. Is she in attendance? Okay, so she'll be giving an update.

Regarding work in kind reporting, August 29th I submitted districts work in kind report for their first half of this year, which includes a period January 1st through June. AR/BP submitted their 2025 semiannual report as well. We've not received feedback on the District's annual work in kind report that was submitted in March 31st of this year.

Also I continue to work with the City on gathering scope and cost documentation for a couple of the City's projects that may count towards cost share, which is the combined sewer overflow project and work they did on the City Dump project. So I'll be -- once I get all that together, I'll be submitting it to EPA for their review and consideration.

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Regarding the Omnibus Project Agreement, the Board might recall that we agreed to pause the mediation process with AR/BP as we pursue the Omnibus Project Agreement. The Omnibus Project scope of work includes a much broader scope of work in the waterway which includes the Grand Cal River Junction Reaches and as well as certain areas of the Lake George Canal. The project team, including EPA, the District and AR/BP continue to make good progress towards the Omnibus Project Agreement. And with that said, the District and AR/BP has agreed to further extend the mediation deadlines to the following:

December 1, 2025 deadline for AR and BP to propose additional or alternate mediators and January 5th, I'm sorry, January 15, 2026, the deadline for the District AR and BP to complete mediation. As I reported in the past, it's the District's preference to enter into an Omnibus Project Agreement. On today's agenda is to approve the Omnibus or Fifth Mod Project Agreement and statement of work in concept with the game plan for the project team to finalize the project agreement and statement and statement of work in time to present for Board approval consideration and signature at our November 20th Board meeting next

month.

If for whatever reason negotiations break down with AR/BP on the Omnibus Project Agreement, we will be ready with Plan B, which is the Grand Cal River Junction Reaches Project Agreement.

So also on today's agenda is the Board's conceptual approval of the project agreement for the Grand Cal River Junction Reaches project.

Regarding the Canal Street Bridge project, no updates to report, no updates to report on the Old Cline Avenue Bridge project as well. I mentioned the core report that was provided to you at today's Board Meeting. Project Manager, Vaughn Coolman of the Corps will be providing update report to the Board later on in the agenda. And Attorney Ellen Gregory will give an update on various legal matters. And that concludes my report.

MR. FEKETE: Any questions for Mr. Trevino?

I may have missed it. Did you mention the Canal Street
Bridge?

MR. TREVINO: Yes. Yeah. No updates on that right now.

MR. FEKETE: Okay. Thank you. Next order of business is the approval consideration of the Board

\$198,570.18.

You began the year with a cash balance on January 1st in the amount of \$14,760,488.82. Your cash balance as of September 30, 2025 was \$14,561,918.64.

If you turn to Page 3, we will continue with the Schedule of Cash Account Activity for the nine months ended September 30, 2025. Your Operating account began the year with a cash balance on January 1st in the amount of \$892,511.65. You earned interest in the amount of \$34,798.63, as well as had a voided check in the amount of \$300.10, had a trust transfer in the amount of \$7,437.30, in the amount of \$974,643.53. Your total distributions have been \$558,728.59, which brings you to an Operating cash balance on September 30th in the amount of \$1,350,962.62.

Your User Fee account began the year with a cash balance on January 1st in the amount of \$13,867,977.17. You've earned interest in the amount of \$196,662.89. Had cash disbursements for a main CD purchase of \$11,500,000 and bank fees of \$50, as well as a budget transfer in the amount of \$974,643.53, bringing your User Fee account balance as of September 30, 2025 to \$1,589,946.53.

You began the year with just \$11,500,000 worth of CDs and earned interest in the amount of \$121,009.49. Brings your CD balance as of September 30th to \$11,621,009.49.

If you turn to Page 4, we will continue with the schedule of 2025 available budget as of October 16, 2025. Your 2025 budget appropriation totals \$1,718,525. Adding back in accounts payable dated 12/31/2024 in the amount of \$61,067.48 as well as a budget amendment in the amount of \$95,000 brings your 2025 total appropriation to \$1,874,592.48. Cash disbursements for the nine months ended September 2025 totaled \$558,428.49.

In front of you, you have a Claims Docket dated October 16, 2025 in the amount of \$59,065.70, which brings your unused budget for 2025 to \$1,257,098.29. Are there any questions?

MR. LOPEZ: Yeah, Vanessa, Ray Lopez. On Page 3, how long do we have to keep that voided check?

MS. VARGAS: So that voided check is just to show you that the money associated with the voided check actually went back into your account. As soon as the year rolls through and starting new in 2026, that amount will go in. So it was already voided. It's

just showing you that the money that was originally accounted for in the cash disbursements has been put back into that balance.

MR. LOPEZ: Okay. Thank you. And thank you for the help on the tax.

MS. VARGAS: Thank you.

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MR. FEKETE: Thank you, Vanessa.

Next order of business is the BMO Trust and Non-Trust reports. Are you doing the honors?

MR. TREVINO: Yes, I'm doing the honors.

Mr. Santori had a family commitment and couldn't make it.

So there's three reports or three different pages from BMO in your Board packet. The first one is a summary of the Money Market and CD holdings. And it includes the 14-month, 12-month, 36-month, 18-month, another 48 months, 23 and 60-month CD summaries. And then there's on the far right, the third column from the right, it's a summary of the interest rate for each of the particular CDs. Interest earned year-to-date is \$121,009.49. The difference from last meeting there hasn't been any interest accumulated since the last meeting, but I just gave you the total change in interest collected.

The next page is a summary of the dollars that we have in the ECI Facility Trust. And so there's one Certificate of Deposit with the maturity date of June 18, 2026. And that interest rate is 4.351. And then there's the second account we have in the trust is the Prime Money Market. And if you look at the bottom right column and row, it's the difference from last meeting. And that amount is \$38,850.31.

And then the third one is just an ECI Facility Trust historical data. And it shows the distributions and the time and the dates when they were distributed. Any questions or comments?

MR. FEKETE: Okay. Very good. Thank you. Okay. Great Lakes Legacy Act Grand Cal Junction Reaches Project Update.

MR. TREVINO: Carol?

MS. NEESON: Yeah. Hi, everyone. As
Fernando mentioned, Tetra Tech will be submitting a
request for a budget amendment for moving forward on
the project. We did submit the 90% design back in
September. And in so doing we ran the surface water
model and identified several areas that do show
flooding potential. And Fernando had shared with me
the photos of the IHC that showed several areas of

significant flooding. Based on the results of that surface water model, we need to make some design changes and run several iterations of the model again to identify the best way to address the flooding.

We did receive some updated bathymetry for the east branch from USCPA, and we would like to incorporate that data into our models so that we have the most updated information.

So other than that, Fernando mentioned, we are addressing the permits, the permit applications, and making the changes needed to have East Chicago Water Management District sign off instead of USCPA and looking into property access. Any questions?

MR. FEKETE: Okay. Hearing none. Thank you.

MS. NEESON: Thank you.

MR. FEKETE: The next order of business is the approval consideration for the Accounts Payable voucher dated today's date, October 16, 2025. Motion to approve?

MR. ROBINSON: Second.

MR. FEKETE: I have a second. Okay. Roll call vote? Jalan Robinson?

MR. ROBINSON: Yes.

MR. FEKETE: Henry Rodriguez?

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in 2013. And it's been periodically updated over time

in order to provide for more work to be done in the

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area waterways. And the way that the Great Lakes Legacy Act works is that we're able to capture certain work that we've done, certain money that ECWMD has expended and in order to get what are called Great Lakes Legacy act credits, work in kind credits. And we trade those credits in a certain amount of federal work.

And so under this Fifth Amended Project Agreement, we have a significant amount of work that we're proposing to have done. The largest project is the Grand Calumet River Junction Reaches. So we have, under this Fifth amendment Project Agreement, we would do dredging and capping in both the Grand Calumet River and the Indiana Harbor Canal. So there's this extensive area that is being addressed there as well as a marsh restoration project in the Grand Calumet River as well.

In the other part of the project that's being done under this Fifth Amendment Project Agreement is in the Lake George Canal. The prior versions of this agreement so that up through the Fourth Amendment have really focused a lot in the Lake George Canal and have provided for a substantial amount of work to be done there.

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Also with a sort of working relationship with Atlanta Richfield and British Petroleum in that area. So this proposes a further amount of work within Lake George Canal. With regard to an existing cap that's there, evaluating that, figuring out what the next steps are there, and then some additional dredging and disposal and potentially preparing for cap at a different portion of Lake George Canal as well as a sheet pile wall and barrier wall system that have already been installed, sort of oil boom operations management. So there's a substantial amount of work that's captured in the Fifth Amended Project Agreement for Lake George Canal as well.

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In total, effectively what happened is we've committed about \$76 million in accumulated work in kind credits that come from a combination of ECWMD's work and work done by Atlantic Ritchfield, British

Petroleum. And we would effectively trade that in for basically \$113 million, \$114 million worth of federal work in those two areas of the area waterways. And those credits, while they sound like a lot, they don't even approach exactly how many we've already contributed that collect work in kind credits. So that leaves behind about \$30 million in CLA working kind

credits that we can use for -- to get future federal money for other projects for further work in Lake George Canal and other things like the orphan areas and things like that that we talked about.

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So that's the Fifth Amendment Project
Agreement. That's Option A. If we can't make that
work, Option B is summarized on a separate page.
That's the Grand Calumet River Junction Reaches
Remediation Project Agreement. That is just the
Junction Reaches work. So that would not involve
anything in Lake George Canal. So it's less work in
the waterway. But it is something that we could
effectively enter into with EPA on our own and we would
not need AR/BP to be involved with that project.

Again, we would have the same scope of work in Junction Reaches, but it would not capture any of the work in Lake George Canal. And we wouldn't be able to bring as many cost share credits to the table because we aren't -- wouldn't be involving any of the cost share work in kind credits that AR and BP are bringing to the table. So there again we would have about \$66 million in federal spending, but the District would have to come up with some additional cash or some additional work in kind credits to fill all of the work

in kind credits that are needed for that project.

Both are viable options. But, you know, as we talked about Option A, the Fifth Amended Project Agreement is the preferred option with the separate Junction Reaches Project as the backup.

And so, as Fernando has outlined, we're asking for conceptual approval today and we'll come back with the fully, you know, finalized agreements for the Board's review and approval at a future meeting.

MR. FEKETE: Thank you, Todd. Any questions for Todd? Okay, Good explanation. Appreciate that.

MR. TREVINO: So we're asking the Board to approve -- I don't know if you want to approve them both at the same time or individually.

MR. FEKETE: I think we can because they're linked. So what we're going to do is we're going to approve the concept of approving going ahead with the development of the large Omnibus Project and lacking any success in doing that, we can fall back on the smaller project that we will be dealing with on our own.

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     the report, water treatment is scheduled to resume at
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     the CDF on or around the 27th of October. So that's
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     the last week of this month. It is fully assembled and
     stood up. I think they're doing some testing and then
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     we'll start trading water as soon as everything is
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     tight.
               MR. TREVINO: Okay. So it hasn't started?
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               MR. COOLMAN: Hasn't started.
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MR. TREVINO: Okay.

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MR. COOLMAN: But it is fully stood up. And then on the dyke raises, we're still working on closing out some of the contractor claims, maintenance, dredging. Unfortunately, the bid opening on September 29th did not result in any awardable bid proposals. And so we'll be re-soliciting that within the next month or two. We've had some good meetings on how to make it more palatable to the contractors to generate some awardable bids.

There's really not much of an update on the sediment sampling and other research. We should have some results from the ERDC, that's the Engineers Research and Development Center of the Corps and the University of Florida. We should have something from them within the next two months. And really that's it.

Oil boom coordination, that's just still ongoing. And we are also -- the parkway maintenance is also ongoing. Any questions?

MR. BAKOTA: Yes. I don't know if it refers you, but the failure, the CAP at Lake George Branch was a failure of that CAP?

MR. TREVINO: I think calling it a "failure" right now is too early. But they are assessing the,

you know, where the oil sheen is coming from.

MR. BAKOTA: Because there's a heavy -- I go there on my walk. There's a heavy oil sheen, depending on wind direction.

MR. TREVINO: Right. And that's part of the assessment. Is it coming from an area that has, you know, has not been remediated, you know, or is it a combination of coming from under the CAP and other sections? You know, so that's what that adaptive management plan is supposed to assess. And, you know, what we use in --

MR. BAKOTA: Before to find oil leaks within the oil system, they would dye it, dye that area and then, you know, watch for a progression of that coming in the waterway. I don't know if that's possible. They've done it.

MR. TREVINO: Yeah. This makes it a little tough because, you know, what would you be dying?

MR. BAKOTA: Well, you dye, I mean --

MR. TREVINO: Because it's possible the oil is coming from underneath the sediment.

MR. BAKOTA: Yeah, but I mean, like the South Tank Farm, you know, introduced dye on the south end of that wall, you know, and see if you get contamination.

I mean that's what we do. It's probably out of the question.

MR. TREVINO: I don't know.

MR. BAKOTA: It's a large area, you know.

MR. TREVINO: Yeah. It's an interesting concept. The Corps, and put together a pretty good comprehensive plan to try to pinpoint, you know, the source of the oil sheen. You know, it's everything from, you know, is it coming from the bank? Is it coming from underneath? Is it coming from an adjacent waterway?

MR. BAKOTA: So that water, you know, that water fluctuates as far as depth there a lot.

MR. TREVINO: Yeah.

MR. BAKOTA: Depending on wind direction and rain and all. So, you know, you may be getting contamination from banks farther up coming in that area.

MR. TREVINO: Yeah. And they -- part of the remediation was capping the banks as well. So I mean, but that could be part, you know, it could be coming from the banks. But that's all part of that adaptive management plan.

MR. FEKETE: Yeah. But you really want to

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investigate to make sure that it is coming from there before you start capping it.

MR. TREVINO: Right.

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MR. FEKETE: Isn't that part of the work that you have the folks from Florida up here?

MR. RELUE: Not exactly. They were doing like penetrometer tests, free fall penetrometer, to try to figure out, you know, the different layers of sediment where some of the harder material is because the dredgers have difficulty with some of those harder areas. It's not really hardpan, you know, it's not rock, but it's, you know, really tough clay or just more compact.

MR. TREVINO: Yeah. I think the, you know, we're talking about the Lake George Canal Middle Cap. What they were doing was for the dredging scope, right. So it was the design of your dredging --

MR. RELUE: Lake George East and then reaches 1 through 13.

MR. TREVINO: So yeah.

MR. RELUE: Just East.

MR. TREVINO: Right.

MR. BAKOTA: That's Lake George. Out of curiosity, that Lake George is important because it
