FEKETE: I'd like to call to order of the 2 3 East Chicago Waterway Management District Board Meeting, Board members, Director's regular Public Board 4 Today's date is September 18, 2025. And the 5 Meeting. 6 time is 5:04 p.m. Before business, is a roll call. Jalan Robinson? MR. FEKETE: 8 MR. ROBINSON: Here. 9 MR. FEKETE: John Bakota? 10 MR. BAKOTA: Here. 11 MR. FEKETE: Henry Rodriguez? 12 MR. RODRIGUEZ: Here. 13 MR. FEKETE: Ray Lopez? 14 MR. LOPEZ: Here. 15 MR. FEKETE: John Fekete, here. We have a 16 quorum. 17 Next order of business is the Executive 18 Director's Report. Mr. Trevino? 19 MR. TREVINO: Yes. Fernando Trevino with FMT 20 Consulting would like to start off by going over the 21 contents of your Board packet. One second. Let me 22 borrow your Board packet. Oh, there's one. I just 23 texted one. Yeah, I saw that. Ray, can I use your 24 Board packet real quick?

And I also have since shared with you the CliftonLarsonAllen financial statement dated August 31, 2025, which was emailed earlier today and hard copies provided at today's meeting.

To go over a couple items in my report, regarding action items on today's agenda, you have the two routine monthly action items, the Board minutes for August 21st and the monthly Claim Doccket. And you have a third item is the FMT Consulting, Inc., additional hours approval for calendar year 2025.

On another update, I have had a couple meetings with AECOM and Moreno from the City Planning Department to work on an economic and recreational development presentation. And I'm expecting to have the presentation finalized by the next Board meeting, which I'm hoping we'll be able to share with the Board.

Regarding finances next month, they plan to submit the District's 2026 Operating budget for Board approval consideration. Regarding the 2025 User Fees, that work is ongoing. Tetra Tech recently completed their 90% design. So I plan to use those quantities and costs on the 2025 Communicator.

I've also received comments from the Army Corps on the Communicator and I should be getting the

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EPA comments any day soon. And then my plan is to submit the User Fee packet no later than the end of this month.

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Regarding the Great Lakes Legacy Act project, the design for the South Tank Barrier Wall Groundwater Management System is ongoing. ARBP has reported that the design is at 60%.

Regarding the Lake George Canal east section, the Corps is managing that part of the project and work on the dredging design is ongoing. Phase II of the Lake George Canal East dredging is scheduled to be done in 2026.

The Cleveland Cliff SEP dredging is now forecasted to be done in 2027.

Regarding the lake George Canal Middle CAP project, the Army Corps of Engineers is managing that part of the project as well. The CAP project has been completed and ECO Construction activities are periodically ongoing. The latest observations of the constructed CAP indicate that the CAP is not effectively containing sediment oil as intended. In response, the project team is developing an adaptive management plan to evaluate and address the CAPS containment issues.

The Corps recently circulated a draft of this plan for review and I submitted the District's comments on Monday, September 15th.

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Remediation Project. That work is ongoing. And that project is between BP and EPA. Based on the latest site characterization data of that section of the waterway, BP recommended that no further action is necessary.

The Corps and EPA continued to assess BPs no further action recommendation, which will include additional sampling.

Regarding the Grand Cal River Junction

Reaches Remediation Project, Tetra Tech continues to

work under remedial remediation design. As I

mentioned, they just completed the 90% design and that

was submitted for project team review. We continue to

meet weekly to review remedial design issues. Property

access coordination, coordination with the Junction

Marsh, the former City Dump, the Marquette Trail. EPA

recently informed us that they have changed their

policies on signing permit applications, manifests and

access agreements. So I'll be working with EPA, Tetra

Tech and Attorney Gregory on how to best manage that

change.

As far as schedule goes, in 2025 we're forecasting to complete the remedial design and project agreement. The District recently submitted to EPA a proposed updated draft of the project agreement for the Grand Cal River Junction Reaches. And I plan to submit a draft of the Statement of Work sometime next week.

Also in 2025, we're forecasting to start the construction solicitation process with the construction starting in 2026 and is expected to go through 2027. Tetra Tech Project Manager, Carol Neeson, is in attendance today and will provide additional updates later on the agenda.

Reporting, on August 29th I submitted the District's Work in Kind report for the first half of this year, which includes a period of January 1st through the end of June. ARBP recently submitted their 2025 semiannual report as well. And we have not received any written feedback on the District's 2024 Annual Working Time Report, which was submitted March 31st of this year.

Also, I've been working with the City on gathering scope and cost documentation for the City's combined sewer overflow project and the City Dump

project to present that to EPA for cost share consideration.

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Regarding the Omnibus Project Agreement, the Board might recall that we agreed to pause the mediation process with ARBP as we pursue the Omnibus Project Agreement. The Omnibus Project Agreement scope of work includes the Grand Cal River Junction Reaches and certain areas of the Lake George Canal.

Recently, EPA submitted for team review a draft of the Omnibus PA and the Statement of Work. We plan to meet internally next week to review EPA's draft and I should have an updated report on how that effort is progressing at our October Board meeting.

Our preference is to go the Omnibus Project
Agreement route because it includes a lot broader scope
of our waterways. But if that doesn't work out, we'll
have the Grand Cal River Project Agreement ready to go.

Regarding the former Canal Street Bridge, the Corps has scheduled periodic stakeholder meetings to address the sinkhole that was discovered near the former Canal Street Bridge and that work on resolving the issue remains ongoing.

No updates on the Old Cline Avenue Bridge demolition project.

Regarding the Corps work, that report is in your Board packet and Project Manager, Vaughn Coolman, is in attendance today and will be providing an update to the Board. And Attorney Ellen Gregory will give an update on various legal matters. That concludes my report.

MR. FEKETE: Any questions for Mr. Trevino?

MR. LOPEZ: Yes, I've got a question. You mentioned something about the CAP leaking or something?

MR. TREVINO: Yes.

MR. LOPEZ: This is the first I've heard about it. What are you taking about?

MR. TREVINO: So part of the remediation construction of the work that was going on was to CAP the Lake George Canal middle, which is --

MR. LOPEZ: Lake George?

MR. TREVINO: Yeah. Which is mostly in Hammond. But the current observations are that the CAP is not containing the oil as intended. So they put together an adaptive Management Plan which basically tries to pinpoint what's the source of that oil. Is it coming from underneath? Is it coming from the banks? Is it coming from Lake George Canal East, you know,

depending on prevailing winds. So there's a lot of potential sources. And then the other possibility was that the CAP wasn't constructed properly. So they're evaluating that as well.

MR. LOPEZ: That's on the Hammond side?

MR. TREVINO: Yeah. It's 90% in Hammond.

There's a small portion that's on the east track site.

MR. FEKETE: Yeah. The small portion is kind of in between the land bridge and the trail, right?

It's about halfway in between.

MR. TREVINO: Yeah. It's maybe 100, 200 feet west of the railroad bridge.

MR. BAKOTA: But the waterway's still connected. Oh, yeah.

MR. TREVINO: Right.

MR. BAKOTA: That oil film you see by the bridge could actually be coming from the Hammond side, right?

MR. TREVINO: It could be. And some of the oil can be migrating from the east side as well to the west. But that's what this Adaptive Management Plan is intended to do is to try to pinpoint where the source of this oil is coming from.

15	okay?

17	MS. VARGAS: All right. Vanessa Vargas with
18	CLA. In front of you, you have a copy of the financial
19	statements on a cash basis dated August 31, 2025. If
20	you turn to Page 2, we will begin with the statement of
21	cash receipts and cash disbursements for the eight
22	months ended August 31, 2025. You've received interest
23	income in the amount of \$344,409.94 and had a trust
24	transfer in the amount of \$7,437.30, bringing your

total receipts to \$351,847.24.

Your total cash disbursements has been \$507,165.85. This brings you to a decrease in cash in the amount of \$155,318.61.

You began the year with a cash balance on January 1, 2025 in the amount of \$14,760,488.82. Your cash balance as of August 31, 2025 is \$14,605,170.21.

If you turn to Page 3, we will continue with the schedule of cash account activity for the eight months ended August 31, 2025. Your Operating account began the year with the cash balance on January 1st in the amount of \$892,511.65. Your total deposits have totaled \$1,013,419.28. Your cash disbursements have totaled \$507,415.95, which brings your Operating cash balance as of August 31, 2025 to \$1,398,514.98.

Your User Fee account began the year with a cash balance on January 1, 2025 in the amount of \$13,867,977.17. You've earned interest in the amount of \$192,362.10 as well as had cash disbursements of the purchase of CDs of \$11,500,000, bank fees of \$50, and a budget transfer in the amount of \$974,643.53 bringing your User Free account balance as of August 31st to \$1,585,645.74.

You began the year with no CDs, but did

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purchase CDs in the amount of \$11,500,000 which have earned you interest of \$121,009.49. This brings your CD balance as of August 31, 2025 to \$11,621,009.49.

If you turn to Page 4, we will continue with the schedule of 2025 available budget as of September 18th, 2025. Your 2025 budget appropriation totaled \$1,718,525. Adding back in accounts payable dated 12-31-2024 in the amount of \$61,067.48 as well as the budget amendment totaling \$95,000 brings your 2025 total appropriation to \$1,874,592.48.

Cash disbursements for the eight months ended August 2025 totaled \$507,115.85. In front of you, you have a Claims Docket dated September 18, 2025 in the amount of \$51,312.64, which brings your unused budget for 2025 to \$1,316,163.99. Are there any questions?

MR. LOPEZ: Thank you.

MR. FEKETE: Thank you, Vanessa. Job well done.

The next order of our business is an approval consideration for the accounts payable voucher register dated September 21, 2025.

MR. COOLMAN: How's everyone doing today? I feel like it's been a while. For the CDF Construction we'll skip to B. We're still working on some documents and things to get that closed out. And for the Wastewater Treatment Plant, they are mobilizing, assembling that right now as we speak. I was there earlier this week and they are out there working. And so as soon as they have that fully set up, then they'll start treating water. That looks like it's probably going to be mid October or late October.

For the dredging, we have a bid opening for the upcoming dredging contract on September 29th. And so the solicitation period is currently open for that. And the results from sediment sampling and the borings, we use those to help inform us on the plans and specs for that contract. And I think we had mentioned before that we had the team up here from ERDC and the Dredging Operation Technical Support Center and the University of Florida with support from some of our personnel. And we did some sonar readings, free vault penetrometer tests and some more sampling to see if we can start to really identify some of the different layers and how far they go, how deep they go, different things, so

that we can continue to work with the dredging contractors so that they don't run into unexpected spots and then possibly leave high spots there in the canal somewhere.

And we don't have all the results on that, but they should be forthcoming pretty soon. I got an email not too long ago from the guy at the dredging.

Operation Technical Support Center.

The oil boom coordination is working as planned right now. And we are still inspecting and maintaining the parkway. Any questions?

MR. FEKETE: I have a question.

MR. COOLMAN: Sure.

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MR. FEKETE: Just kind of, of interest. Are we, for the most part, basically into maintenance dredging?

MR. COOLMAN: Yes. We have cleared the original backlog of however --

MR. FEKETE: Navigation.

MR. FEKETE: I'll be happy to. Are we basically in what could be considered maintenance dredging?

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MR. COOLMAN: Yes. We had cleared the previous backlog from all those years of no dredging. And we have pretty much cleared any of the buildup during the construction of the dike raises three to four years.

MR. FEKETE: I think that's an important distinction, to be honest with you, because when we first started this project is we have to clean out the canal and waterway. And then after we do all of that, then the CDF is basically good for another 30 years of maintenance dredging. So we're in that phase. So then if I see people that I know that were involved or interested in this particular project, I can make that statement. Thank you.

MR. COOLMAN: You're welcome. No other questions?

MR. FEKETE: All right. Attorney Ellen Gregory's Report.

MS. GREGORY: Yes. Ellen Gregory with Ellen Gregory Law. As Mr. Trevino mentioned, we are

continuing to move forward on the Great Lakes Legacy
Act projects using on a parallel path, the lean
omnibus, which will include the Grand Cal River
Junction Reaches as well as the Lake George Canal,
other Lake George Canal work. And proceeding with the
Grand Cal Junction -- River Junction Reaches. Separate
PA and Statement of Work to make sure that we are
prepared to move forward on that separately if the
omnibus, lean Omnibus PA negotiations don't end up
working out.

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Another matter, I was looking through my Board, my regular Board Report, and was reviewing my section, my Board Report that deals with the Indiana State Public Retirement System. As a reminder, in 2016, we had considered withdrawing from that program, but realized that it was going to cost the District close to \$9,000 to do so. So we elected not to withdraw from the program. And because of that, we needed to assign an authorized agent to be available to respond to any matters that related to in pers, what it's referred to.

And at that time, we appointed CliftonLarsonAllen as the authorized agent. But on the paperwork at the time, Tim Anderson was the person

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1	named as the individual contact. So we're going to
2	need to probably work with CliftonLarsonAllen to
3	appoint somebody else, since Tim Anderson is no longer
4	at CliftonLarsonAllen or helping us. So Mr. Trevino
5	and I will be communicating with CliftonLarsonAllen and
6	doing whatever additional submissions are necessary.
7	And at this time, I'd recommend that the
8	Board pass a motion to give Mr. Trevino and myself a
9	authority to make whatever submissions would be
10	required. It will probably be something very minor.
11	As I said, the authorized agent is the company,
12	CliftonLarsonAllen. The only thing we're going to be
13	changing is the individual contact person at
14	CliftonLarsonAllen.
15	So I'd recommend that a motion be passed
16	regarding that.
