**Caseload**

18,673 families and 35,844 children were authorized for this period.  
311 of the above families and 657 of the children had TANF priority.  
0 of the above families and 0 of the children had an AJS TANF-Impact referral.  
81 of the above families and 194 of the children had a non-AJS TANF-Impact (Working Families) referral.  
26 of the above families and 46 of the children had a SNAP (Working Families) referral.  
1,627 of the above families and 1,672 of the children participated in the On My Way Pre-K program.  
114 of the above families and 153 of the children had vouchers with CCDF Contract Centers.  
2,134 of the above families and 3,429 of the children either had Homeless priority or identified as such.\*  
474 of the above families and 995 of the children had one or more disabled children in the household.\*  
0 of the above families and 0 of the children were in a household with family members in the military.\*  
1 of the above families and 1 of the children were part of a household with over \$1,000,000 in assets.\*  
2,052 families and 3,313 children were on wait lists at the end of the period.

**Children**

72.7 % of children were served in licensed care.  
1.2 % were cared for by relatives.  
Infants (under 1 year of age) constitute 3.8 % of all children served.  
Toddlers (ages 1 to 2 years) constitute 19.8 % of all children served.  
Children ages 3 to 5 years constitute 35.8 % of all children served.  
Kindergarten-age children (age 5 years) constitute 0.9 % of all children served.  
School-age children (ages 6+ years) constitute 43.3 % of all children served.  
5.7 % of children had part-time vouchers.  
7.6 % of children had vouchers for shift 2 care.  
Children of Hispanic or Latino Ethnicity accounted for 8.9 % of all children served.  
Race codes: African American: 56.4 %; White: 45.1 %; American Indian / Alaskan: 0.6 %; Asian: 0.6 %;  
Hawaiian / Pacific Islander: 0.2 %; Multiple Races: 7.9 %  
An average of 23.1 weekly hours were authorized for school-age children.  
There were 8 new TANF-Impact referral children (8 families) added this period.  
There were 7 new SNAP-Impact referral children (7 families) added this period.  
There were 575 new On My Way Pre-K children (557 families) added this period.

**Families**

92.3 % of families received subsidies because of employment.  
30.5 % of families had copayments, at an average of 8.8 % of income.  
55.5 % of families had overages, at an average of 3.6 % of income.  
The average family size was 3.6 and the average number of children served per family was 1.9.  
91.4 % of families were headed by a single parent.  
1.6 % of families were marked as TANF recipients and 1.7 % listed TANF as a source of income.  
0.1 % of families were marked as SNAP referral recipients and 38.5 % listed SNAP as a source of income.  
60.5 % of families were below the poverty level. 17.4 % of families were above 127 % of the poverty level.

## **Expenditures**

The average cost of care for a month per child during this period was \$956 (subsidy + copay + overage).  
Parents paid -0.5 % of the cost (4.9 % in copayments and -5.5 % in overages) and the program paid 100.5 %.  
Average monthly expenditures for children under 1 year of age were \$1,104.  
Average monthly expenditures for school-age children (ages 6+ years) were \$790.  
66.7 % of total expenditures were for children under 6 years of age.

## **County Stats**

Marion County accounted for the largest porportion of families served with 29.8 % of the caseloads.  
The highest average cost of care was in Hamilton County at \$1,396 per child.  
The lowest average cost of care was in Martin County at \$402 per child.  
Switzerland County had the greatest proportion of children served in licensed care at 100.0 %.  
Wabash County had the greatest proportion of children served in LLEP care at 41.8 %.  
Pike County ranks first in relative care statewide with 10.0 % of all children cared for by relatives.  
Crawford County and others had the highest % of families with a service need of employment at 100.0 %.  
Perry County had the greatest proportion of TANF recipients, where 16.7 % of families receiving child care subsidies also received TANF income.  
Perry County had the greatest proportion of SNAP recipients, where 83.3 % of families receiving child care subsidies also received SNAP/Food Stamps income.
