

SACC RFF 2022-002 Award Recommendation Summary

I. Introduction

SACC RFF 2022-002 was issued to solicit applications from public school corporations and nonprofit organizations interested in the available funds to support school-age care through the state-funded School-Age Child Care Project Fund for state fiscal year 2023. In total there is \$812,413 in available funding through this RFF for SFY 2023. This grant supplements program costs in the four areas of program enrichment, equipment, staffing and staff development to facilitate increased quality in school-age child care programs. Of the 19 initial applications received and evaluated, applicants requested approximately \$730K of funding for SFY 2023 and represented 16 of the 92 Indiana counties. OECOSL recommends awarding \$733,139 to 19 applicants that serve 40 locations in 16 counties.

II. Evaluation Overview

All applicants met the mandatory grant and applicant eligibility requirements. A team of FSSA staff reviewed the 19 submitted applications for the following:

- Service Provision Requirements
- School-Age Program Overview
- Sustainability and Program Administration
- Plan for Requested Grant Funding
- Grant Budget Narrative

Applicants could receive additional priority points for meeting the following pre-set criteria:

- Operating as a school-based program at a school site
- Serving over 75% of families at or below 190% of the Federal Poverty Level
- Operating in a rural area
- Operating in an economically distressed area
- Serving children in a socially vulnerable area

The maximum score an applicant could receive was 100 points (90 technical response points and 10 priority points). The evaluation resulted in total scores ranging from 84.13 to 30.75. Please refer to Appendix 1 for a breakout by application of the scoring.

III. Award Recommendation Overview

When making award decisions, OECOSL first examined each applicant's evaluation score. All applicants were recommended for an award.

Based on the above criteria, OECOSL recommends awarding \$733,139 to 19 applicants that serve 40 locations in 16 counties. Please refer to Appendix 2 for a breakout of the award recommendations for the SACC Project Fund for SFY 2023.
