Pursuant to IC 4-22, the Indiana Office of Small Business and Entrepreneurship (“OSBE”) has reviewed the economic impact analysis for small business associated with rule changes contained in LSA Document 16-172 proposed by the Indiana Family and Social Services Administration (FSSA). The proposed rule amends 405 IAC 5-24-2 to include the definition for “usual and customary charge” regarding reimbursement for pharmacy services, effective 30 days after filing with the Publisher.

The economic impact statement prepared by FSSA indicates the proposed rule will not impose an economic impact on small businesses under IC 4-22-2.1-5. OSBE does not object to the economic impact to small business associated with the proposed rule.
