HIP Work Requirements

- Some, not all, HIP members will have new requirements about work, school or other activities.
- Meeting the requirements is necessary to keep your HIP coverage.



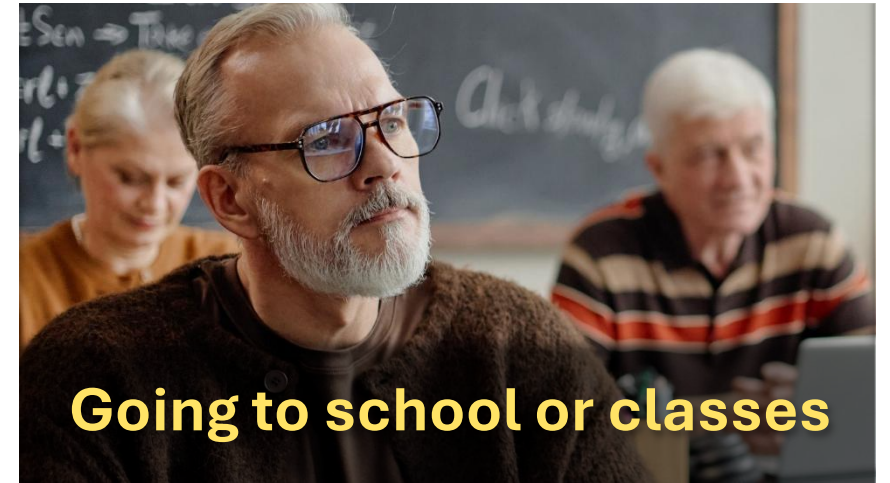
Who must follow HIP Work Requirements?

- Most adults ages 19–64 on HIP must follow HIP Work Requirements.
- Some people do not have to fulfill the requirements (we explain those later).



What are HIP Work Requirements?

To keep HIP coverage, some members must do 80 hours each month of:



You can mix different activities to get your 80 hours.

Other ways to meet HIP Work Requirements

You meet HIP Work Requirements if:

- You make \$580 or more in a month, OR
- You are in school half-time or more.

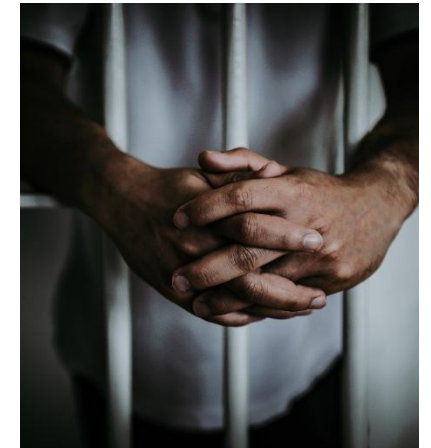


Who does NOT have to follow HIP Work Requirements?

You do not have to follow HIP Work Requirements if:

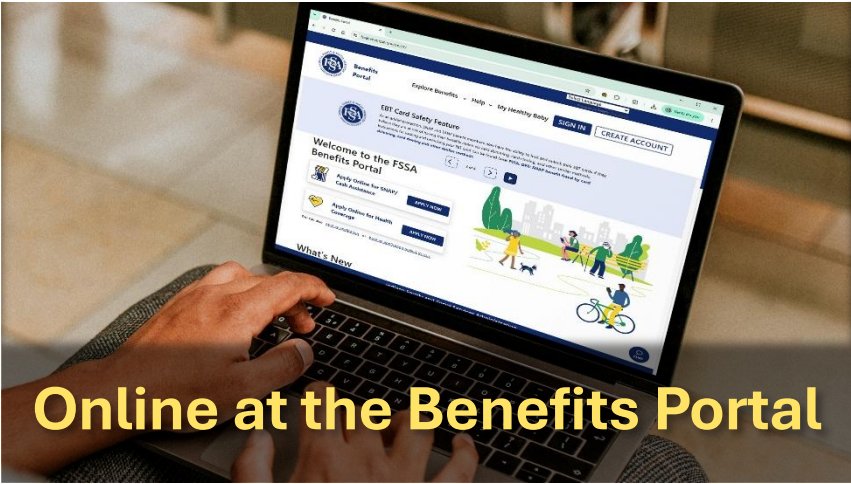
- You are under 19 or over 65
- You are pregnant or recently had a baby
- You take care of a child under 13
- You take care of someone with a disability
- You have a serious health condition
- You get Medicare
- You are in jail or just got out
- You are a veteran with a disability
- You are in a substance abuse treatment program

If you think you should be exempt, you *must* tell FSSA.



How to report HIP Work Requirements hours

By mail



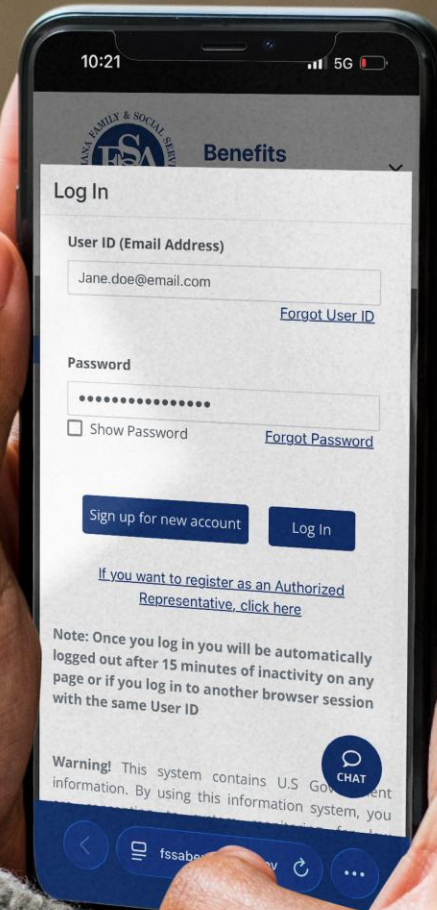
By phone (800-403-0864)



At your local FSSA office

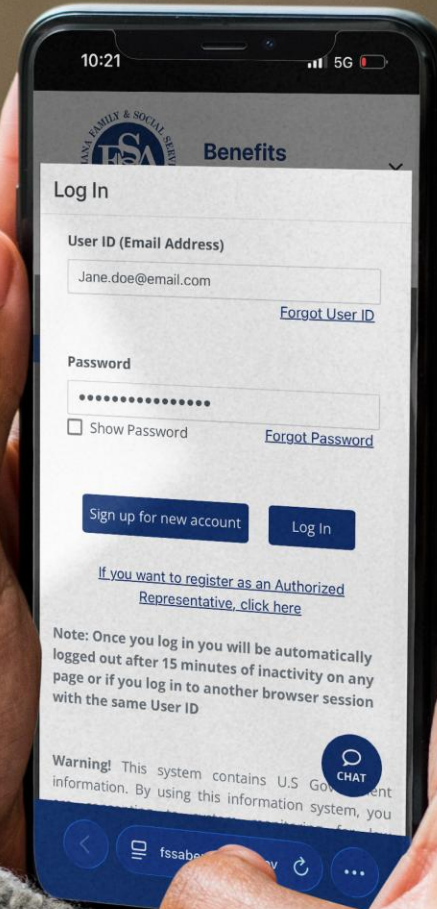
When do I report HIP Work Requirements hours?

- Report your hours every month.
- FSSA checks your hours every three months.
- If you don't follow HIP Work Requirements and don't have an exemption, your HIP coverage may end.



What happens if I don't meet Work Requirements?

- Your HIP coverage may stop.
- You must reapply.
- You must show you met HIP Work Requirements for the last three months before reapplying.

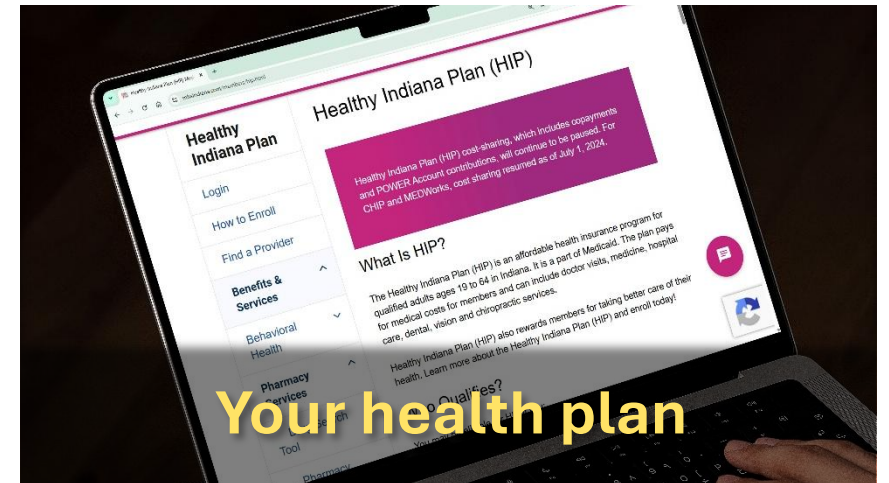

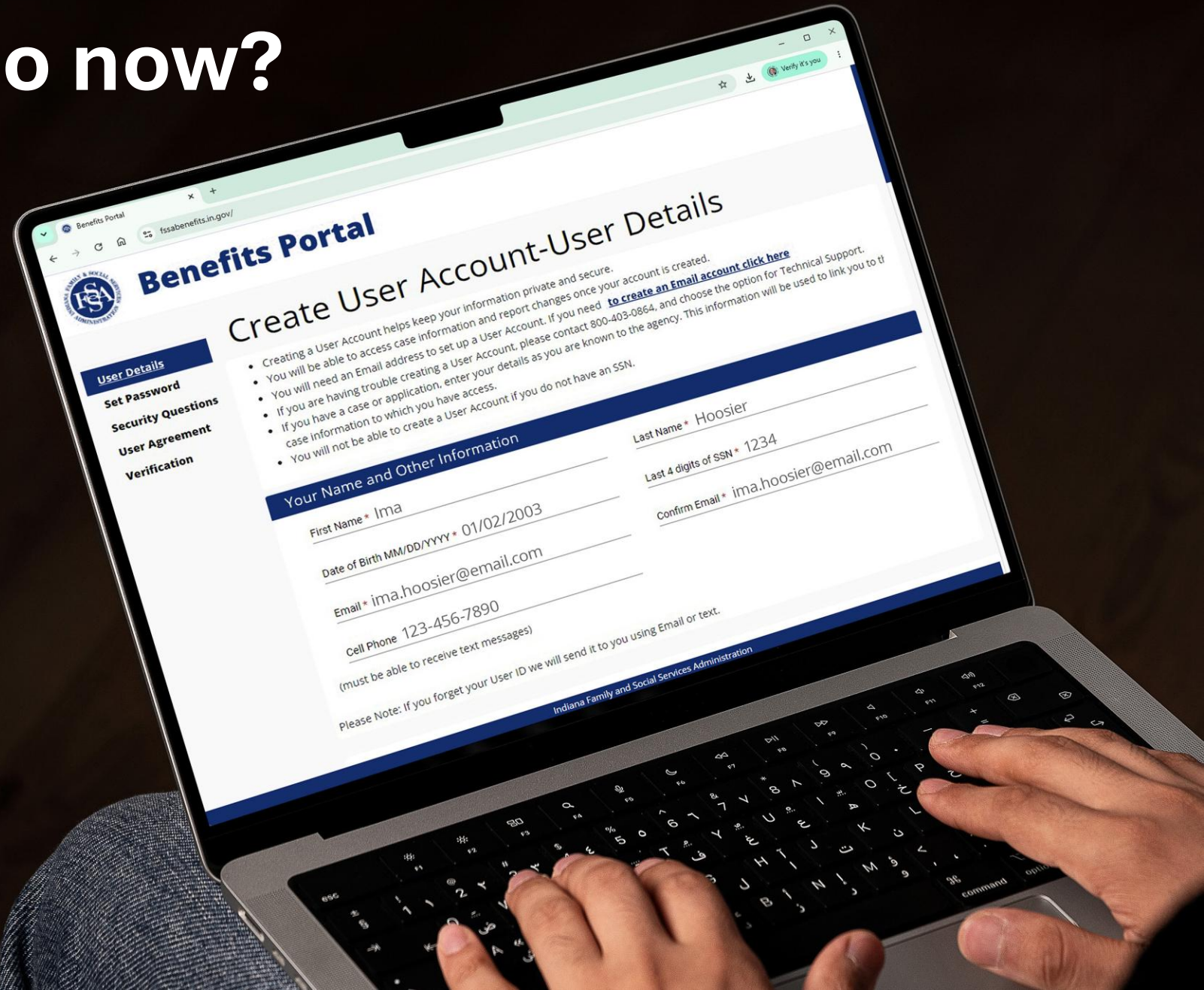
