2205.05.00 ESTABLISHING THE REDETERMINATION (ANNUAL RENEWAL) MONTH

The redetermination month is the month during which eligibility for all assistance groups in a case-is reinvestigated reevaluated for a new 12-month period. Federal regulations define the maximum time frames for completion of

redeterminations for each program. Redeterminations (renewals) will be conducted for both MAGI and non-MAGI individuals once a year. If an individual is not determined to be eligible, their coverage will end on the last day of the redetermination month.

If there are multiple AGS-assistance groups in the case, the redetermination month for each individual may be different. The redetermination/renewal month is established at the earliest required interval based on the following requirements:

- For MAGI Medicaid, different individuals within the same AG may have different redetermination periods; AGs Individuals under MAGI-based income must be redetermined once every 12 months, and no more frequently than once every 12 months¹
- For Non-MAGI Medicaid, a redetermination must be completed at least once every 12 months²
- In some cases where all information needed to redetermine eligibility is reconfirmed for the AG, an ex parte redetermination can be done to start a new 12-month eligibility period if the additional members is are not required to take any action and eligibility is passing.

A household consists of a mother and her child, who are both open in Medicaid. Their AG composition is identical (each is the only person included in the other's AG, and the income counted for each AG is the mother's). The mother's redetermination date is in March, and the child's redetermination is due in July. When the mother is successfully redetermined in March, we also know everything needed to redetermine the child ex parte, and the child continues to pass Medicaid eligibility. The child's redetermination due date will be set for a new 12-month period to align with the mother. Both will be sent approval notices for a new 12-month period, and both will be approved and will be due for redetermination again in March of the following year.
