Medicaid Director's Message

In this month's Medicaid Legislative Connect newsletter we are featuring two important investments in the Indiana Medicaid program.

First, we highlight our efforts to improve the home health infrastructure. Home health services are services provided on a part-time basis to Medicaid members in their place of residence. We recognize the need to have a strong home health workforce to ensure that Hoosiers can live and age at home and in the community.

Second, we highlight our rate matrix. This too is an investment in the Medicaid infrastructure – it will impact the home health providers noted above and extend beyond to the full provider network. The rate matrix is an effort to ensure a predictable and appropriate approach to reviewing provider reimbursement rates for Medicaid services. We believe this rate matrix tool will be beneficial to the legislature as they navigate the biennial budget process.

To make sustainable improvements in Indiana's home health infrastructure, the Family and Social Services Administration is conducting a comprehensive assessment of the state's existing home health services in collaboration with a diverse group of stakeholders, including the Indiana Department of Health, home health providers, Medicaid consumers and their families and advocates. This initiative includes reviewing and updating home health service definitions, examining reimbursement methods and operational processes and analyzing policies and regulations. The result of this work will be **Indiana's Home Health Roadmap for Success** that is grounded in three principles: **alignment, workforce and person-centered approach**.

This collaborative workgroup has already made numerous recommendations for improving Indiana's home health landscape and continues to meet regularly.

Over the next few months, FSSA will host a series of virtual and in-person focus groups to learn more about the experiences of Medicaid members and their families and receive their suggestions for improvements to home health. Additionally, FSSA will convene a series of stakeholder workgroups focused on the key issues facing home health providers.

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Rate Matrix Update

The Indiana Family and Social Services Administration is focused on ensuring a predictable and appropriate approach to reviewing rates for Medicaid services. To support this focus, we have developed a rate matrix to establish a regular cadence for those services that do not otherwise have a review detailed in state or federal code.

Under the rate matrix approach, each rate will be reviewed at least every four years using an evidence-based rate methodology that includes input from providers and other stakeholders. The rate matrix approach also includes a yearly index in the years between rate reviews. The rate review periods will align with the biennial budget cycle so that the results of the review can be considered and approved by the Indiana General Assembly as part of the budget process.

The current rate matrix can be viewed <u>here</u>. Following the conclusion of the legislative session, the matrix will be updated based on the approved biennial budget. If you have questions and/or note a service that is not
