Superintendent/CMO update

I want to give you an update of where we are with several projects.

First, as of September 15, we have been admitting for six months. Our census continues to trend up and our average length of stay is trending down, as desired. One of the numbers I'm most proud of is that the number of discharges per month is going up. That means that our new treatment paradigms are making a difference.

CMS has come and gone, and we corrected the vast majority of deficiencies found in May. There are a few additional items that we'll have to address, but hopefully we can put this hurdle behind us soon.

Cerner update: We have been testing a new treatment planning process that was made necessary by Joint Commission findings in April. Our goal is to have this in place by the end of October.

We have made several other accomplishments. The repairs to the basement are complete and medical records, along with housekeeping, will be returning to their usual spaces. The parking policy phase 2 has been completed and we are working to harmonize it with CHE. Noise abatement surface treatments are being installed to help with the echoes in the recreation spaces and those with harder surfaces. Our heating system is contaminated because the lines were not flushed properly before commissioning, but we intend to have that fixed before cold weather.

And saving the biggest news for last.... On Friday, September 27, Vice President Mike Pence and Dr. Jerome Adams, U.S. Surgeon General, visited the NDI. As Indiana's Governor, Pence was instrumental in proposing and advocating for the authorization and appropriation of

funds to create NDI. He assumed his duties as Vice President before NDI's construction and opening, so this was his first opportunity to visit the hospital. Pence said he would report on NDI's success upon returning to Washington, D.C.

ART has begun

Annually Required Training ends October 30

ART has begun and will continue until 4 p.m. on October 30. All employees (state, agency, shared, and contract) must view a presentation via PeopleSoft and successfully complete a quiz (score of 80% or above). Employees scoring less than 80% will be required to review the presentation and to retake the quiz. Also,

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Use critical computer procedures

A note from Scott Munoz, Senior LAN Administrator

I have started receiving Security Risk Assessments from IOT regarding the security of the computers we have here at NDI. The first assessment showed room for improvement. I want to take a moment to remind everyone of common practices that will help immensely in reducing our risk score.

Restart your computer every day before you leave. Don't just sign out or lock the workstation. Restarting

the computer terminates all background processes and puts it into a state that allows updates to roll out.

Don't plug phones or other devices into computers. Use wall chargers to charge devices.

Laptop users need to pick at least one evening per week to leave their laptop plugged in and restarted at the hospital. Please take care to secure it somewhere so that it does not disappear.

Don't use flash drives with state computers. Most users are prevented from doing so, but the few exceptions should take extra precautions.

Do not install any software without going through IT first. Only authorized software is allowed on state computers

Flu vaccines and annual TB tests

Attention NDI State staff: Flu vaccines have arrived!

Dates: October 7-11 and October 21, 23, and 25

Times: 6:30 a.m.-8:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m.

Place: Advanced Treatment Center

All State staff receiving the flu vaccine during the first week will receive a ticket for a drawing on October 11 at 1:30 p.m. Four lucky staff tickets (two from shift A and two from shift B) will be drawn to win parking spots in front of NDI for an entire month. Contract staff should receive flu shots through their agency/school/off-site clinic/ MD office. The deadline for all staff to sign the 2019 flu consent/

declination form OR submit proof of flu vaccination is November 20. All documentation should be submitted to Carolyn Smeltzer by that date.

Breaking TB news from the CDC for healthcare workers:

As of 2019, annual TB tests are no longer required! Instead, a new TB questionnaire is required from all NDI staff by October 31.

State staff are to complete the TB form when receiving their flu vaccine/submitting their vaccine documentation.

Contract staff are to obtain their forms from their agency supervisors.

All completed forms should be submitted to Carolyn Smeltzer by October 31. Failure to comply may result in disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal.
