Staff provide programming for all of our kids from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm, 7 days a week. In addition to educational services provided by Ev-

ansville-Vanderburgh School Corporation Special Education teachers which follows the normal EVSC calendar, our kids participate in many therapeutic groups and activities all year long.

What would a school day be without Physical Education? Our Recreation Therapists provide a wonderful PE group for all children after the school day is finished to make sure that kids get time to run, play, and have fun while learning good fitness habits.

FITNESS GOALS

Our Recreation Therapy Department is helping children set and achieve fitness goals for 2020. Each month, the kids are given a new fitness challenge with a reward at the end if they meet or exceed their goal.

In August, the kids worked on a mountain climber challenge to work core and shoulder strength as well as endurance. All of the children worked so hard. They had a collective goal of 75,000 mountain climbers, and while they did not

and while they did not make the goal, they put forth a great effort. However, our highest personal count was well over 10,000! Congratulations to the children at EPCC for their hard work!!

Clinical Programming News

The children start the school day Monday through Friday with a yoga session, then an OT program in the school called Minds In Motion, which incorporates sensory exercises. This helps the children's bodies to stretch and get move, and their brains to "wake up" and prepare to learn.

Speaking of Occupational Therapy (OT), the children also participate in other groups such as Self Regulation, Reflex Revolution, and Handwriting group to strengthen and fine tune gross and fine motor skills.

Some therapy groups provided by our LCSW and MSW therapists include Boyz 2 Men, a therapy group for our older boys; Teen Power, a group for our older girls, and EPCC Express, a therapy group that explores appropriate ways to express feelings. A Junior Achievement course entitled "Ourselves" was offered which explored the difference between wants and needs. And, as always, our therapists provided individual, duo, and family therapies as well.

Some additional Recreation Therapy (RT) groups which the children really enjoyed this summer included Fitness Around The World (as part of the educational Summer Enrichment Group), Hip Hop Dance, and Swimming (with water safety trained EPCC staff).

During the last week of Summer Enrichment, which is our educational program during the summer months, our teachers planned a Pokemonthemed event to lift the children's spirits.

The teachers set up a version of Pokemon GO on the EPCC grounds and the children enjoyed the detailed scavenger hunt that the program provided. It certainly kept them busy and helped with the children's focus and attention to detail.

After the geocaching event was completed, each child received a Pokemon t-shirt.



A Gardening Group was enjoyed by many children thanks to EPCC RT staff and a grant from Indiana Master Gardeners Association and assistance from a Purdue Extension consultant. Thanks to this group, EPCC's grounds look even more beautiful!

Our kids have been enjoying Music Therapy virtually one Tuesday a month. This music therapy group is provided by University of Evansville Music Therapy Students and teacher.

All EPCC staff work hard each and every day to provide a safe, clean, fun, and therapeutic place for children during their journey to recovery.

EPCC is continuing to follow all CDC guidelines for staff, children, and visitors. We have made updates to our procedures due to the gradual re-opening of the State. Masks are being required to be worn by both staff and visitors during admissions and Treatment Team meetings (visitors can use their own mask, or EPCC will provide a mask), some committee meetings involving non-EPCC staff are still being held virtually, all guidelines are followed when taking children to outside appointments, and family visits are still being limited to on-grounds visits, one family at a time, with only one or two family members.
